State Health Department Advises Particular Care in Selection

Parents are advised by the Connecticut State Department of Health to be very selective in their choice of toys for Junior this Christmas. In the current issue of the weekly health bulletin, the department of health points out that the health and safety of children should be considered in making toy selections.

The key to the wise choice of toys lies in each child's capacities and interests, notes the bulletin. "Toys that give a child a chance to exercise his developing mind and body will contribute most to his achievements in self-education. Parents and relatives should make sure the toys selected will not poison, cut or choke the child. They should be fireproof and, insofar as possible, incapable of injuring the child or others. Toys suitable for one age group sometimes become dangerous in hands of children too young to use them properly."

Every political candidate, every party, every group, every amount of service to the issue known as "education." No one was ever known to be against it. Somewhere in the course of his campaign, every candidate takes pains to assure the teachers that he is for higher salaries, to assure the parents that he is for better buildings. In Connecticut, the usual campaign pledge also includes a promise that the resources of the state's own tax income will be increasingly devoted to easing the burdens of the local communities in paying higher salaries and erecting better buildings.

His imagination had no limits in other directions. He wanted more and more education, and better and better education, and when he ended up by proposing free college education for everybody in Connecticut, he wanted it that way. There was no handsome campaign promise, but something he planned to work for.

But perhaps his most notable contribution to education in Connecticut, and incidentally in the country, was his inauguration of the survey headed by Norman Cousins, one of the most sharply analytical writing minds of our time. That survey, in time, is likely to be recognized as a classic comparable, in its field, to the Report on Reorganization of the state government.

No chief executive in the state's history has focused so much general energy and devotion on the cause of education. We have no intention of debating the perfect wisdom of all his ideas, or recommendations. Perhaps, on some occasions, he was an enthused in general that he was unwise in particular. But we do pay tribute to his boundless interest in the problem, his serious absorption in it, the amount of push he sought to give to it.

Fire Chief Merz Issues Warning on Decorations

Safely as well as beauty should be a consideration in your choice of Christmas decorations. Fire Chief John Merz advises.

Combustible decorations contribute to one of the worst fire disasters of modern times, when as in Newfoundland in 1942, the celebration lights set many homes on fire and caused the loss of many lives.

Non-flammable decorations of glass and metal are now generally available, the National Board says. Families can also obtain "snow" for use around the Christmas tree which will not flare up when touched by a flame.

The organization emphasized the importance of selecting Christmas tree lights which bear evidence of the Underwriters Laboratories, Inc. Candies should never be used on the tree or around the decorations, and the tree with cotton or paper is also extremely dangerous, the National Board observed.

Rent Control Meeting Is On

Even Though Federal Ban Is Continued; See Local Problems

Manchester's scheduled hearing on local option continuance of rent control may develop into a session of the main action at which will be an adjournment. Should federal rent controls be quickly extended as now appears likely on the basis of Washington news, the public rental matter now stands.

Greater Population Seen
Although difficulty in obtaining rents has been established here for a long time, there has lately been little disposition to attack the problem as it was felt that under ordinary circumstances, in time the shortage would be ironed out by gradual construction. The coming hearing, even if it requires no action, may bring the potential problem increase to notice.

Polio Stricken Wife of Local Teacher, Gives Birth to Daughter

Mrs. Gilbert B. Hunt of Dohertyville, polio-stricken wife of a local High school English instructor, gave birth to a normal, healthy eight and one-half pound daughter at McCook Memorial hospital in Hartford Tuesday night. Mrs. Hunt has been a patient at McCook since the middle of August.

A hospital spokesman stated that such births are not extraordinary and that there are two other mothers-to-be under treatment for poliomyelitis at the hospital.

Mr. Hunt reported this morning that mother and child are doing well. He said hospital authorities told him they have never lost the child of a polio victim at the hospital and that some have even been born in an iron lung.

Have Two Other Children
The Hunt's new daughter has been named Paula. The couple have two other children, Diana, 2 1/2, and Lee, 18 months. Since Mrs. Hunt was taken ill, the children have been cared for by Mr. Hunt's mother and sister, Mrs. George W. C. Hunt of 285 Charter Oak street, and Mrs. Constance Nebeber, wife of Dr. Raymond Nebeber.

It is hoped that Mrs. Hunt will return to her family for Christmas. Her husband reported that she felt well yesterday and was able to sit up and read. Her winning battle against polio has progressed to the point where she can walk short distances without the aid of crutches.

Mr. Hunt expressed his gratitude for the large number of people who have given us considerable help during the past four difficult months. You never know how nice people can be until you get in trouble.

Mrs. Hunt is the former Miss Jeanne Cude, daughter of the former secretary and treasurer of the Case paper mill, the late Harold E. Cude, and Mrs. Agnes Cude. Mr. Hunt is a graduate of Manchester High school and Yale University. He was a captain in the infantry during World War '41 and was awarded the Silver Star Medal for action in France.
