Big Transport On Korea Duty Is Sabotaged. Vessel Damaged in 5 Different Places at Seattle Dock; Press Quest for Saboteurs.

Seattle, Dec. 8.—A big naval transport just back from carrying troops and supplies to Korea, was sabotaged at a Seattle dock this week.

Military and civilian investigators pressed an intensive search today for the saboteurs. The incident was made public last night by Navy Capt. M. O. Eaton, Deputy Commander of the Military Sea Transportation Service (MSTS) in the North Pacific.

He said the vessel was damaged extensively in five different places by someone "not on our ball team."

He did not specify what parts of the ship had been sabotaged nor estimate how long it would take to make repairs.

Under tight guard the transport was under light security guard. The civilian crew had been screened insofar as it was possible.

Both Eaton and other Navy officers said it was virtually impossible for an unauthorized person to get aboard.

Military sources said that as far as they knew it was the first such act of sabotage since the outbreak of war in Korea.

Eaton first said the damaged transport was the Navy's Gen. A. W. Greely, AC-1 type of 12,000 tons. The Greely docked here early this week from the Orient.

Number of Saboteurs. However, early today Eaton's office said there was some uncertainty over the identification.

Paris, Dec. 8.—(AP)—Diplomats of the Big Three Western powers agreed in principle today to meet Russia in four-power talks in an effort to reduce world tension.

The British and American Ambassadors concluded a conference with French Foreign Office officials by agreeing on the general content of three separate notes the three governments will send to the Soviet Union.

The notes will answer the Russian suggestion of Nov. 3 that four-power talks be held on Germany.

**Decrease Noted In Paper Salvage**  
 At a time when the waste paper situation is more critical than it has been since the last war, no collection figures for waste paper indicate a drastic drop. The following weights were collected the first week of November: Northwest, 13,500 pounds or 83%; Northeast, 16,600 pounds or 92%; South, 15,200 pounds or 90%; and southwest, 13,620 pounds or 86%. Many previous months have produced better than 100% and paper collection officials are at a loss to explain the drop. Too great an emphasis cannot be laid upon the necessity of saving waste paper because the mills need it urgently for the war effort. It is hoped that everyone will take note of this fact and make an increased effort to save more waste paper for salvage.
