This nation, at this present moment, is at a point when it cannot afford to neglect either of two things.

It cannot afford to neglect the opportunities for peace, even when they must involve compromise and admission of what error exists on our own part.

It cannot afford to neglect its preparations for possible survival in conflict if it comes.

We cannot afford either of these neglects. We must, if we want to survive, do both things together.

But there is a fatal question as to whether it is possible to do both things together. There is a fatal question as to whether we can, at one and the same time, concentrate on making peace and preparing for war.

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And if, in getting up steam for military preparedness, we are unable to make peace, then it is inevitable.

We should understand one other thing. We are not in a position where efforts toward military preparedness will prevent war. If, as Governor Dewey so bravely assumed last night, the Communist world is intent on full acceleration of our own mobilization will merely advance the Communist parking date. If, as Governor Dewey assumed last night, the Communist world is bent on destroying us, it would not commit the folly of waiting until we are better able to defend ourselves. Why should it, if world war is its intent?

Local Dealers Are Putting Up New Signs at Stations Today

The 75-day gasoline price war in Connecticut officially ended this morning, it was reported by Bill Markham, president of the Connecticut Gasoline Dealers Association. Markham said that already local dealers were taking down their large red-lettered "cir-cu-lar" signs of price cutting which were on display for the past two and one-half months.

The new price for regular gas will be 25.6, a six-tenths of a cent increase over the cost per gallon before the price war started. High test gas will now sell for 27.5, also a six-tenths cent increase over the pre-war price.

Prices Dropped to 19.8 Cents

During the period of the price war, regular gas dropped to 19.8 cents per gallon and high test fell to 21.6. The war was under on October 2.

Dealers have been asked, Markham said, to post the 25.6 and 27.6 prices, but they (dealers) are free to post any price they want. Markham said that many dealers would post the new prices today and that by early next week all dealers in Connecticut would line up again with a standard profit-making price.

Gas prices in nearby towns have also gone up. The gas price cutting was started last June in Greater Hartford and spread to the surrounding communities.
