the rate of death from cancer in Hartford County is much lower than in most parts of both the New England States and the tate of Connecticut.
The Government data contained in the new report, covering 1948, shows that there were 887 deaths from cancer and other malignant tumors among residents of Hartford County in the year.

This represented a rate of 162 deaths per 100,000 people and was lower than the New England States rate for the year, which was 174 per 100,000. Connecticut had a record of 171 cancer deaths


