### Allies Abandon Yonpo Airport; Reds Massing

from Hungnam. Terrified Korean civilians were reported streaming north and south from the looted city.

The Red Korean buildup on the east bank brought determined fighting against the sections of the Allied line. A bold dispatch said the Reds may be trying to capture high ground looking down on Hungnam's busy port.

Artillery fire smashed one such attack and killed an estimated 200 Korean Reds in 20 minutes. Allied warships shelling the sea of Japan's icy waters off Hungnam port pounded 27 concentrations of Chinese and Korean Communists.

The Red Naval group dispersed one column attacking Reds with heavy casualties. Navy and Marine fires roared off decks of Carrier Task Force 77 and an escort carrier fleet in stinging blows against the Reds.

Fly Island 60 Miles

The seaborne airman winged inland as far as 60 miles, bombing, rocketing and machine-gunning Communist troop concentrations. They claimed they killed or wounded 800 Reds.

U. S. Third and Seventh Division troops on the ground held off a series of Communist attacks mounted in darkness Monday night and early Tuesday morning.

A 10th Corps spokesman said the Reds attacked in almost fanatical fury. In contrast, the war-torn front north of Seoul was quiet. No direct contact between

"It is the same sort of thing that happened to Seward, President Lincoln was asked by a group of Republicans to dismiss Secretary of State Seward. He refused. So I refuse to dismiss Acheson."

Reds Would Benefit

"Communism — not our own country — would be served by losing him."

A reporter asked the President whether his statement was what he had in mind recently when he said he was going to look into the charges against critics of government officials. In this? He replied:

"On a personal plane, the President said he hoped to go home Friday to Independence, Mo., for Christmas."

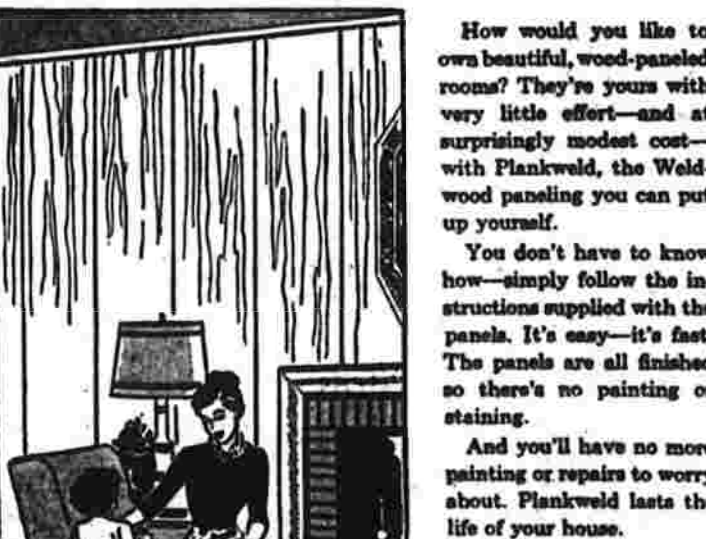
