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Board Grants Publicity Aid

Directors Allot Sum of \$1,000 to Local Development Commission

Aided by a \$1,000 grant made last night by the Board of Directors for a publicity program, the Manchester Development Commission now will start the public part of its work for which it has been preparing in recent weeks since its organization October 2. The Commission has been largely concerned with learning its duties and the possibilities of developing the natural advantages of the town for the town's economic and general benefit.

Since being established, the Development Commission has held five meetings. There have also been special sessions with the Town Planning Commission and the Manchester Board of Health. The local commissioners met with Sidney Edwards, managing director of the Connecticut Development Commission, and for five hours discussed with him the various angles of municipal development programs.

A survey and visitation has been made by the local Commission members of available industrial buildings and sites in town. In addition, Chairman Charles S. Burr has attended a meeting of the New England Council in Boston where regional development problems were discussed. Mr. Burr, with Commissioner Hathaway, have visited Danbury to confer with the president of the Industrial Development Foundation. Commissioners Rhoads and McFarland have visited Bloomfield to become acquainted with its recent development. Local groups have been addressed on the plans and on the objectives sought.

At the present time work is under way to secure from all real estate agents information to make a complete listing of industrial property, showing areas, utilities, transport and other facilities.

After additional studies of possibilities have been completed, the Development Commission plans to publish a brochure or booklet which will detail all of the advantages of Manchester. The Commission expects also to publish its findings for the better information of local residents regarding their own advantages, many of which may not be appreciated.

ECA Rescues 'Hearing Anonymous' Is For Deafened People

Hungry Greek Cows Had Been Chewing Down Attica's Walls

By Richard Kleiner
New York—(NEA)—It was a little lame doctor in Chicago who convinced Marie Hays Heiner to face the facts.

"Look," he said, "I'm lame and you're hard of hearing. You can't get any better and you may get worse. Nobody ever died of deafness. So you've got to learn to live with it."

That was seven years after she had waked up one morning, unable to hear. In those seven years, she'd tried to get by, consulting countless doctors, but to herself and prayed for a cure. But it took that doctor's frank talk to make her buy a hearing aid and rejoin the world of sound.

And now she wants to help other deafened persons rehabilitate themselves through a dream of hers, Hearing Anonymous. She says there are millions of hard of hearing who, through vanity, or pride or fear, refuse to admit their handicap. Like alcoholics, they want the help and counsel of people who have been through the same thing.

"You know," she says, "there is quite a bit of similarity between being deaf and being an alcoholic. Both handicaps make you shun society. Both make you withdraw into yourself. Incidentally, there are an awful lot of deafened people who become alcoholics."

You'd never know Mrs. Heiner was deaf. The Cleveland, O., woman hears everything you say and speaks in a normal conversational tone. She's a vivacious, sparkling woman. She's a successful author, having written the story of her rehabilitation in a book called "Hearing Is Believing."

Hundreds of people wrote to her after the book was published. They were mostly hard of hearing persons who sought advice.

"They wrote me personal things they would never tell an agency or a doctor," Mrs. Heiner says. "It's because they knew I'd been through it all myself and could understand. You know, being deaf is a frightening thing—perhaps you don't die of it, but you die a little bit."

Because of those letters, she decided that she could help people get on the right track by talking to them. And there are many other hard of hearing persons who have conquered their handicap and could also counsel the less fortunate.

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Seven Men Move Mountain To Make Bull Shoals Dam

Bull Shoals, Ark. — (NEA) — Seven men in the Ozark Mountains of Arkansas will finish a gargantuan two-year job next month—moving a four-million-ton mountain across two valleys.

Seven miles away, the mountain is being put together again to build the \$78,000,000 hydroelectric flood control Bull Shoals Dam on the White River.

The mountain-moving project was performed on a seven-mile-long belt conveyor, longest in the world at the present time, which carries 600 tons of crushed rock an hour and moves it along at 325 feet a minute.

"The mountain is coming to life," observed a grizzled construction worker, who has helped build other big dams.

The seven men are the maintainers on each of the shifts to keep the belt running, traveling along the conveyor line to lubricate the rollers, or rollers, which the belt runs.

The big man behind them, however, is M. H. "Harvey" Stinson, project manager for the dam. A pioneer in the moving of mountains, he displaced two others to construct the Grand Coulee and Flax Dam. Rather than build a temporary railroad, or an aerial tramway, or built a highway, he went to Thomas Hobbs, Jr., conveyor manufacturer, and had the "best road" put together in the Ozarks.

The rock blasted from the top and side of Lee's Mountain rides the belt across rugged terrain to a processing yard on the dam site.

U. S. Leathernecks Use Their Heads
