But Do You Really UNDERSTAND the Bible?

Many people maintain that the Bible is so simple and clear that anyone can understand it. Yet today the Christian world is divided into conflicting opinions as to what the Bible means. Simple and equally learned Bible scholars take different meanings from the same words, and there are many Christians who disagree on basic Bible questions.

The books of the Bible were given by God through writers who addressed themselves to people who already possessed faith in God and to whom the divinely revealed message was, to some extent, already known. They were certainly not intended to teach all of God's revealed truth to those who were learning it for the first time.

Rush to Build Before Jan. 1

Local Developers Start Construction Before Ban Becomes Effective

Manchester's home builders and developers are rushing to start construction on the small type home with four finished rooms down and two unfinished upstairs before the ban on this type of building goes into effect here January 1. After that date requirements will be set up which, on a square footage basis, will require all six of the rooms to be completed.

While some builders doubt that the requirements will stand up in court, all appear to prefer the present regulations in order to play safe. In the last few days over 100 permits have been sought before the new rulings go on.

Some weeks ago at a meeting of the Board of Directors, through counsel Alexander Jarvis notified the Board he might contest the building limitations in court. More recently he has had no statement to make on this subject.

Reason for the Ruling
The reason for the placing of limitation on small partially finished homes is the one of public income. It has been held that income on the small home of the type to be restricted, does not in any way pay for the public services the property demands.

Server and educational costs, it has been held, are not proportionately met by partially finished property and the building of so many hundreds of such units is said to have imperiled the tax income and financial soundness of the town which has not had a corresponding growth in industrial property that might absorb the lack of income in house taxes.

With the placing of wartime material and credit restrictions, building activity in the future appears to be slowed, with the wind-up now taking place for what has been a construction boom year.

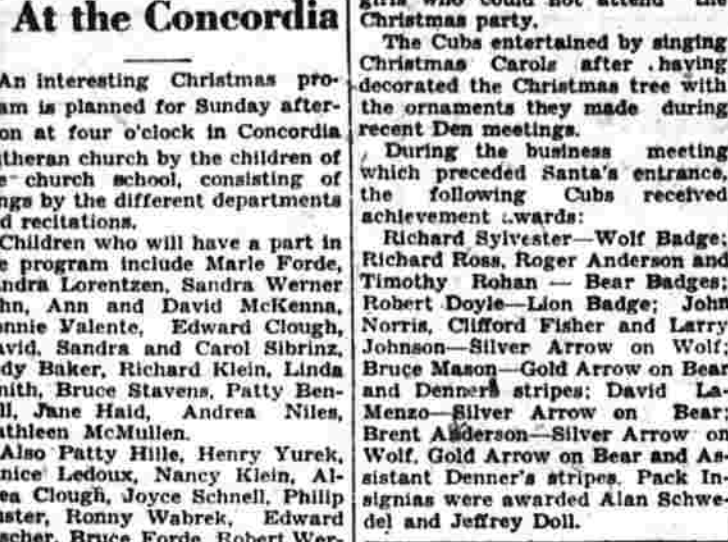
