Lodge Paints Grim Picture of Future In His Inaugural

Calls on State to Face "Program of Austerity"; Says Bowles' Regime Left Legacy Of "Financial Emergency"; Sees Peril

State Capitol, Hartford, Jan. 3.—(AP)—John Lodge, inaugurated today as governor, outlined in grim, sober words a program of austerity he said was forced upon Connecticut by a lack of money and the necessity of preparing for a possible enemy attack.

There was little of the gaiety that usually marks an inauguration day. Senators and Representatives, many of whom brought members of their families to witness the ceremonies at which Lodge, a Republican, succeeded Democrat Chester Bowles, talked quietly in the corridors.

His selection headed off a threatened contest between Arthur E. Tanager of Woodbury, supported by G. O. P. State Chairman Charles F. Baldwin and other organization leaders, and Rep. Nelson Carmel of Danbury, backed by William L. Hadden, the outgoing State Attorney General.

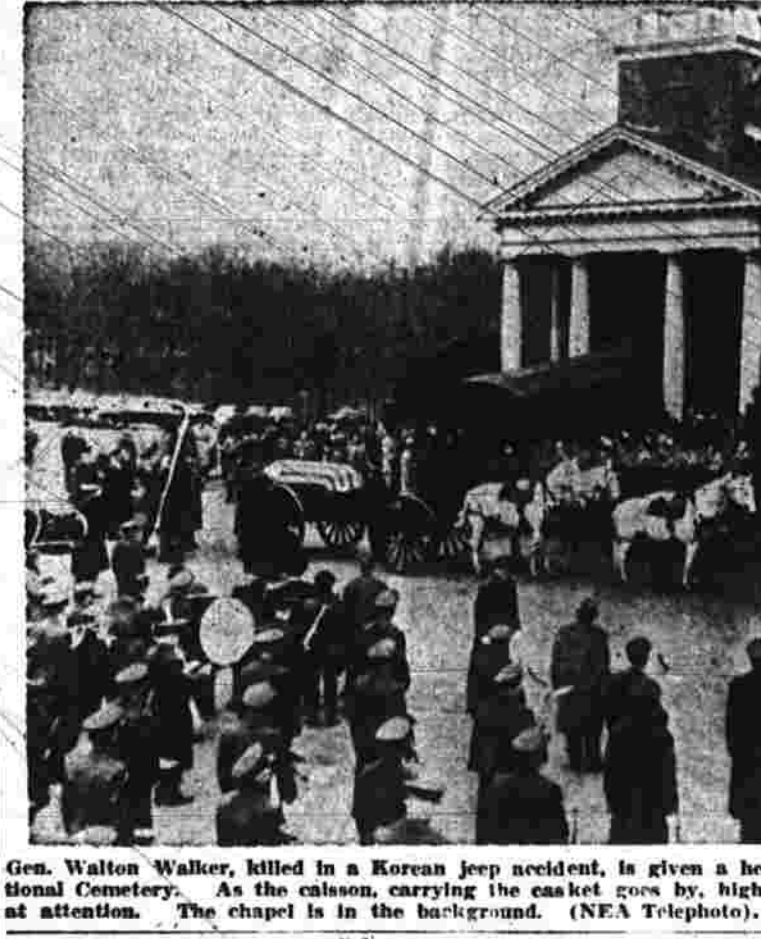

Rhee Cabinet Flees Seoul as Red Masses Storm City's Defenses

Pre-Dawn Onslaught Punctures Hole in Veteran U. S. First Division Line; Enemy Hordes Pour Through Gap; Terror-Stricken Refugees Stream South; Allies Helpless

Seoul, Jan. 3.—(AP)—The battle for Seoul began today as Chinese assault troops stormed the makeshift United Nations defense line north of the anxious and nearly deserted South Korean capital. Their heaviest attacks slammed into a veteran U. S. division in position some 10 miles northeast of Seoul. A secondary assault cracked into positions eight miles north of northwest Seoul.

The troops at this point gave some ground initially, but tenaciously broke up the Chinese attack. Then this unit counter-attacked, regaining its original positions and capturing some additional ground.

Front line intelligence officers believed today's attacks, although in force, were only preliminary to a final all-out assault on Seoul's defenses. They predicted this assault will come tonight.

The situation is sufficiently confused to be serious. The Chinese are already on the frozen, hard-to-defend flat lands.

Civilians were ordered out of Seoul by the Ministry of the Interior today. President Syngman Rhee and his government left this morning.

The silent, seemingly empty buildings of Seoul suddenly disappeared as thousands of last-minute refugees fled.

The pathetic mass migration of the long refugees column out of the city and across the frozen Han River was a heart touching backdrop to long convoys of military vehicles.

There was little opposition to the advance of the Chinese.

Yugos Hit U. S. And Chinese Attack Peiping Rejection of Truce and U. S. March to Border

London, Jan. 3.—(AP)—Yugoslavia's Communist Party today condemned Red China's rejection of the United Nations appeal for a cease-fire in Korea.

It was equally critical of the North Korean invasion of the southern region, which it said was backed by Soviet arms, and Gen. Douglas MacArthur's march across the 38th Parallel towards the Manchurian border.

In a review of the Korean situation, Borba, official voice of the Yugoslav Communist Party, said: "With the crossing of Chinese troops over the 38th Parallel in Korea, new complications are taking shape in the international situation. Peking's (Peiping's) refusal to respond to the U. N.'s appeal for a peaceful settlement of the dispute and to stop at the 38th Parallel, fully expeditious."

Howling Storm Hits the Coast

Seattle, Jan. 3.—(AP)—A howling, trip-hammer storm slashed one man from a ocean ship, dived others to their knees and disrupted power service in parts of the Pacific Northwest yesterday.

Rain lashed the lowlands and more drifted snow in the mountains on the wings of a wind that raged at 55 to 65 miles an hour. Gusts reached 80 miles an hour were reported on Vancouver.

Carmel, N. Y., Jan. 3.—(AP)—Herbert Gehr, television director and Hollywood photographer, accused of slaying his wife, wept when he was asked to identify her in court today.

The 28-year-old defendant buried his face in his hands when he was asked to identify his wife, Mrs. Gladys McCullum, of Mahopac, one of the panel, replied: "I am a mother. I live for my son and daughter. Feeling as I do, I am sure I would be biased."

Remington Loses Move To Bar Miss Bentley As Federal Witness

New York, Jan. 3.—(AP)—William W. Remington, former Commerce Department economist, yesterday lost his bid to prevent testimony by his original accuser, Miss Bentley, at his Federal perjury trial.

Judge Gregory F. Noonan set the stage for a showdown between the couple—expected tomorrow—when he denied the defense move by Remington's counsel, George F. Gurnea.

Gehr's wife, Andrea, 30, was killed by a .22 caliber rifle shot between the eyes last July 10 when she went to her husband's mansion cottage near Brewster, N. Y.

Miss Bentley first accused him in July 1948. She claimed he passed information to her for relay to Soviet agents.

He then sued Miss Bentley and a television program over which she had repeated her charges for libel.

Later, he accepted a reported \$10,000 settlement from the television program.

Truman Signs Three Billion Tax Measure

Sets Up New Production Authority as New Congress Demands Mobilization Speed-Up

Washington, Jan. 3.—(AP)—President Truman signed today the new \$3,000,000,000 tax bill, stepping a 7 per cent super-tax on corporations to the highest dollar figure in history, but Mr. Truman said the task ahead of us will require more and much heavier taxes.

He said, in due course, submit to the Congress recommendations for substantial tax increases.

Even before Congress completed action on this bill, Mr. Truman had "made known" he would still further revenue-raising measures from the new Congress.

Treasury experts are studying various possibilities. They have given out no details, but individual, as well as income taxes were cited as a last resort.

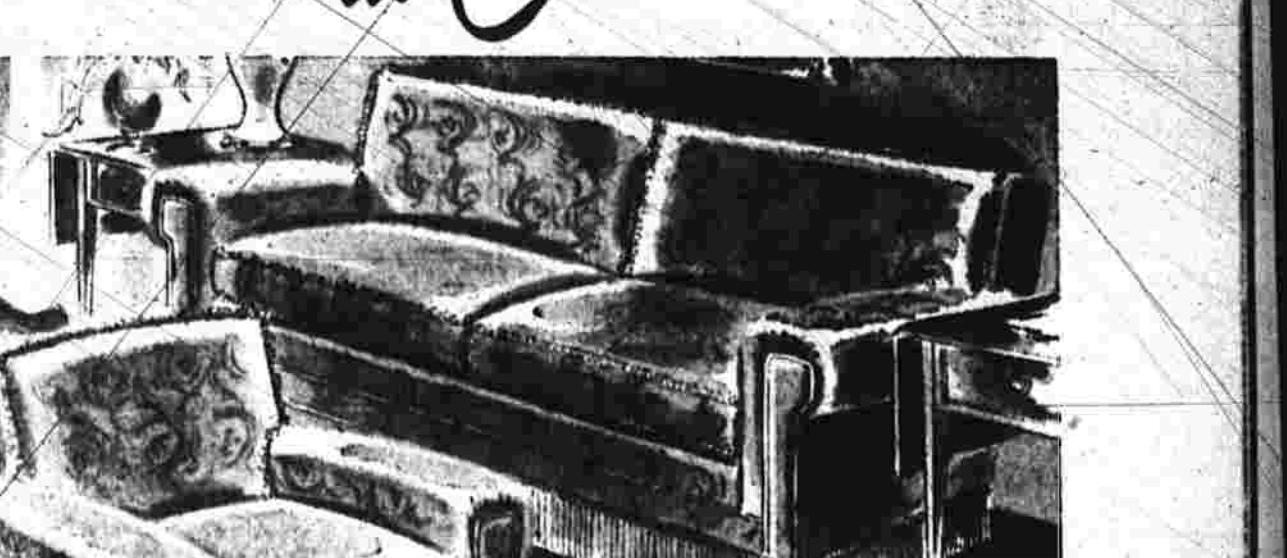

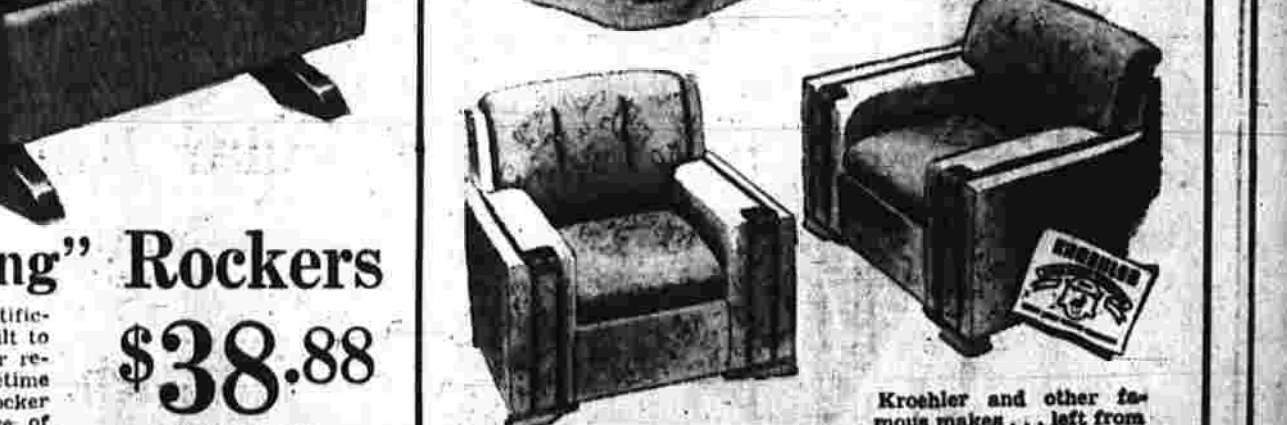

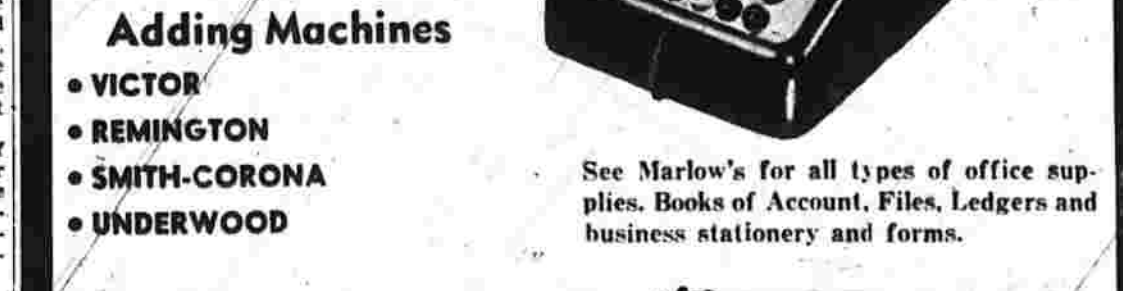

Representative John D. LaBelle of Manchester last night was named by a caucus of the Democratic members of the state House of Representatives to be minority leader of the House. The selection of LaBelle was unanimous, proposal for his nomination being made by Representative Phillip Laing of Windsor who, up to caucus time, was regarded as the only other aspirant for the minority leadership. Laing's nomination of LaBelle was seconded by Representative Daniel Mahoney of Waterbury and the caucus, voting a closure of nominations, then unanimously approved the Manchester legislator.

In refusing to seek the minority leadership last night, Laing said he was withdrawing because of the pressure of his own business. He may not, for that reason, be available for the post of assistant minority leader. It has been reported that since there were but two contenders for the leadership one would automatically become assistant after the decision was made on the main vacancy.

Last night the caucus took no action on the assistant leadership post if Laing is not available another caucus will make the choice with Representative John Demers of Putnam being rumored as a likely contender.

Democratic State Chairman John M. Bailey presided at the caucus held last night at the Hotel Grand in Hartford where some 80 of the assembly's 88 Democratic House members attended. In accepting the unanimous vote, LaBelle thanked the representatives for their confidence and promised a vigorous leadership. He is starting his second term as representative. During the past session LaBelle was the ad-

Bowers Views G. O. P. Choice

Our Representative in Assembly Pleaced With Party's Selection

Representative Sherwood G. Bowers, Manchester Republican, this morning said that he is "very much pleased" at the selection of Representative Mansfield, D. Sprague of New Canaan as Speaker of the House. Republicans held their party organization caucus last night.

Sprague was a compromise candidate for the speakership, developing support after a battle seemed to be opening for the post between Representatives Arthur E. R. Tanner of Woodbury, said to have been the state leadership choice, and Representative Nelson Carpenter of Canterbury, who had charged that the choice of speaker was being dictated.

Representative Bowers said today that he did not think Carpenter had anywhere near the

strength necessary for selection, but was glad to see the party make a compromise choice in Sprague, "under the conditions that prevailed." Noting that individual caucus members didn't have much choice but to "go along" even on the final compromise, Bowers said he was glad the selection of Sprague was made, and Bowers said he supported the nomination. Representative Sprague, Bowers notes, is a quiet, capable legislator who will fill the position to which he has been called. Prior to the caucus, Manchester's Republican House member had stated he would not support Carpenter.

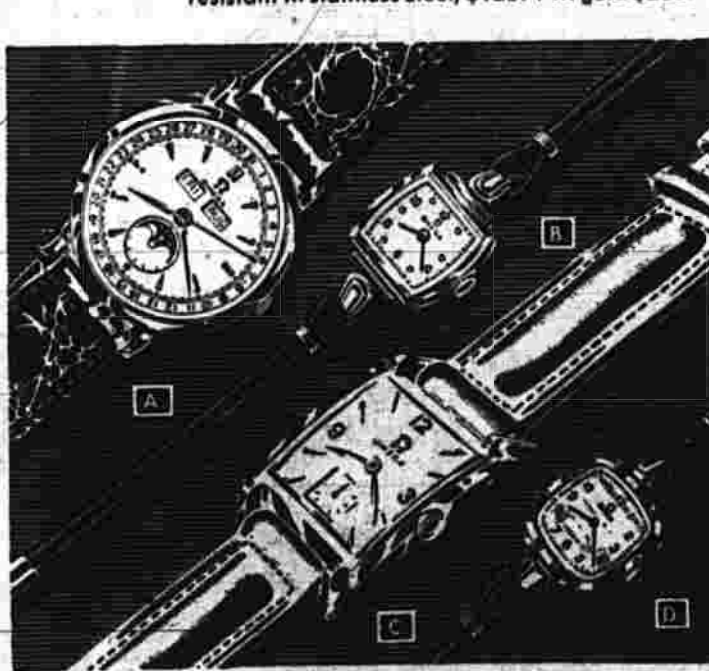
