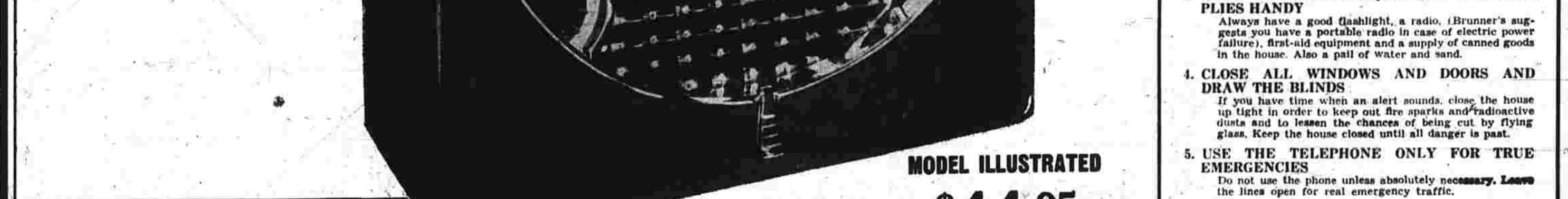
It has been brought to our attention that Civil Defense officials in the city of New York have instructed the public in that area in the event of an air raid to "LEAVE YOUR RADIO ON TO RECEIVE AUTHORIZED INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS". It is explained that even in the event of a power failure, radio stations will continue to broadcast using their own auxiliary power units, and that people having a portable radio in their home will be able to receive these broadcasts even though their home is without electricity. This, it says, seems to be entirely reasonable and we suggest that people in the Manchester area might do well to include a portable radio in the list of essential things they should have in their homes for emergency use.

**Chrysler Gets P & W License**  
**Auto Firm to Make Jet Engines for the Military Service**

East Hartford, Conn., Jan. 8.—Pratt & Whitney Aircraft division of United Aircraft Corporation is negotiating a license to permit the Chrysler Corporation of Detroit, Michigan, to build the J-48 Turbo-Wasp jet engine for the military service. Chrysler will build the J-48 in a new plant to be constructed near Detroit.

The J-48 is already in production at the East Hartford, Conn. section plant of Pratt & Whitney Aircraft. It is the latest model (1949-50) of the Navy's Grumman Panther series and the Lockheed P-96C, an all-weather interceptor for the Air Force. Earlier models of the Panther (F9F-2) powered by the J-42 Turbo-Wasp are in action over Korea and were the first type of Navy plane to shoot down a Russian-built MIG-15 jet fighter.

The Chrysler license will be the second to be granted by Pratt & Whitney Aircraft since the Korean war. Last September Pratt & Whitney Aircraft P&WA announced that the Ford Motor Company of Detroit was licensed to build the R-4350 Wasp Major, most powerful piston engine in the world, in a government-owned plant in Chicago. Ford personnel are now studying the use of water injection and an afterburner.

**Begins Second Year in Office**  
**Mrs. G. W. Jones Head of Manchester's Girl Scout Organization**

Mrs. G. W. Jones begins her second year as head of the Manchester Girl Scout organization. An untiring and eager worker, her leadership as commissioner of Manchester Girl Scouts has been an incentive to many individuals in improving and building the local Girl Scout movement to a point where membership is available to all girls who wish to join.

As a leader of young women, Mrs. Jones has a well qualified background. She is a graduate of Plymouth Teachers' college, Plymouth, New Hampshire, and is currently a substitute teacher in local schools. She has been a member of Manchester for over 20 years, formerly teaching school in Manchester, New Hampshire, where she was leader, camp counselor and advisor of the 10th Girl Scout troop (now known as Troop 10) sponsored by the YWCA. Her teaching experience began at the age of 17 and she is well versed in the needs and qualifications of an established camp for young people.

In May, 1943, Mrs. Jones registered as leader of a local Brownie troop and continued in this capacity until 1947. Due to illness, she was inactive in scouting until the fall of 1948 when she became a member of the training committee. After taking a 32-hour course sponsored by the New England Girl Scout headquarters, she received a certificate qualifying her as a Volunteer Trainer. She was elected to the Manchester Girl Scout Council in 1949 and became deputy commissioner in that year. In 1950, she was elected commissioner and was recently re-elected for the 1951 office. She faithfully attends all training camps and conferences of both local and national origin.

An commissioner, her duties are many and varied and can be compared with that of a president of a corporation. She delegates all Council work, choosing committee chairmen for the work best suited to their abilities and interests. She coordinates the work of the Council members with the Girl Scout leaders and with the activities of the community as a whole, so the Council objectives are realized.

**Many Advances Made**  
 The Manchester Girl Scout Council extremely pleased at Mrs. Jones' acceptance of office for 1951. Under her leadership, many advances were made in Girl Scouting. A business office has been opened, an executive director hired, camp enrollment and facilities surpassed all previous records, more new troops and leaders have been made available to Manchester's children than during any year in the history of local Girl Scouting, and new and continuous training courses are given to all troop leaders.

Commissioner Jones has done an excellent job, in addition to being a homemaker, probably because she likes and respects each individual with whom she works and because she feels that nothing is too good for young people.

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**On Getting Out of Korea**

Such widely separated statements as Senator Robert A. Taft and Yugoslav's Marshal Tito agree on one thing—that the United Nations should get out of Korea. Both view the situation there as militarily hopeless, and see no gain in trying to preserve it. Both would prefer to concentrate elsewhere the armed strength that might be devoted to the effort to remain there.

It should be pointed out that both those who think we should try to remain in Korea and those who think we should get out as soon as possible are really at the mercy of military events over which they have no control. It may or may not be possible for United Nations forces to hold anything in Korea; no one knows.

What is in valid dispute, then, is principally a question of attitude. The question is not whether we can stay in Korea, for only military facts can answer that. The question is whether we should try to stay in Korea, fighting to the end, or concede, as of now, that we intend to get out.

We have generally held, on this question, that the United Nations forces should try to remain. Our interest is that the United Nations should preserve, as fully and convincingly as possible, its own loyalty to its own first experiment in the enforcement of world law. We do not share the glib opinion that the United Nations has failed in Korea. The important thing has been that the United Nations acted, that it proved willing to fight for its principle and its law. That it has happened to meet with armed opposition capable of inflicting military defeat upon the United Nations does not alter or destroy the principle involved—unless the United Nations itself abandons that principle. There can be no "fiasco" in Korea unless the United Nations permits its resolution to be abandoned. The United Nations cannot fail, whatever the military outcome, unless it loses its own unity of purpose. No fight made on principle is ever really lost—unless those making that fight abandon the principle themselves.

It needs to be remembered, now, that if military expediency should be important, the United Nations would certainly never have gone into Korea in the first place. It was always possible and likely that militarily, the cause was hopeless. Quite obviously, now, there should be no vain sacrifice of life. Just as obviously, there should be no abandonment of the attitude with which the United Nations originally entered the situation.
