Injustice Vs. Injustice
 Occasionally, we think of the peo-
 ple of this country ought to be ex-
 amined routine popular concepts as
 if they were fresh statements.
 One of these concepts—fine and
 deceptively popular and deservedly
 part of our best American prin-
 ciple was articulated again by
 President Truman the other
 night, "I don't," he said, "want
 peace at any price. I want peace
 with freedom and justice."

We have no quarrel with that
 statement. It is what we want.
 It is what all decent people want.
 But we do have quarrel with
 what has come to be, we fear, an
 accepted corollary of that prin-
 ciple. We are afraid that what peo-
 ple read on the other side of that
 coin is this: that war somehow
 solves all such moral quandary;
 that war is potentially the choice
 of honor which produces the free-
 dom and justice that might be
 missing under the wrong kind of
 peace.

We quite agree that any peace
 which sacrifices freedom and jus-
 tice is quite unstable, that
 would be a peace laden with
 shame and degradation.
 At the same time, we would also
 emphasize the fact that war also
 contains these same evils. There
 is no greater shame upon civiliza-
 tion than that of a resort to war.
 There is no greater degradation
 of humanity than war.

There is no greater destroyer of
 freedom than war. It claims the
 freedom of all its participants
 during its course, and hedges the
 freedom of them all long after it
 has ended.
 As for justice, whose absence
 from peace would be so unaccept-
 able, how shall we assess the jus-
 tice present in war? According to
 the Vatican, the last war killed
 22,000,000 human beings, and in-
 flicted wounds on 34,400,000 more.
 Of these, some 10,000,000 were
 Russians, some 9,500,000 Ger-
 mans, 900,000 from the British
 Commonwealth of Nations, 948-
 874 (223,135 killed) from the
 United States.

Approximately 10,000,000 of the
 22,000,000 killed were civilians
 who were not even in uniform.
 But of the whole 22,000,000 killed,
 whether in uniform or not, we
 would say that not more than a
 few hundred ever possessed any
 actual direct guilt for the war.
 Except for an insignificant num-
 ber, they were all innocents, in
 that they never wanted war or
 plotted war or made any conscious
 decision to have war.
 So what kind of justice shall we
 attribute to an institution which
 claims 22,000,000 innocent lives?
 "Peace at any price" is always
 likely to be a great tragedy of evi-
 dent, in its extreme forms, does not prevent wars, but
 merely makes them more inevi-
 table.
 At the same time, however, we
 have no human right to close our
 eyes and minds to the fact that
 we are confronted, in statements
 like President Truman's, not with
 one clear right and one clear
 wrong, but with two great
 wrongs. Realistically, there is not
 so much to choose between the
 "wrong" kind of peace and the
 "right" kind of war. Both are a
 betrayal of humanity.
 We must struggle for what we
 think is the right kind of peace.
 But we must not tinge and quali-
 fy our struggle for the right kind
 of peace with any assumption
 that war will be a proper solution
 of our failure, or a cure for the
 evils we are seeking to avoid in
 an imperfect peace.
 Lastly, there is always some
