Biggest Order For Hamilton Many Changes In Agencies

American Airlines to Equip All Planes With New Propellers

Hartford, Jan. 18.—American Airlines has ordered 40 Standard propellers for its entire fleet of 79 Convair-type and 40 Douglas DC-4's. The contract is believed to be the largest of its kind in airline history and calls for an expenditure of about \$4,000,000.

The American two and four-engine planes, Hamilton Standard is supplying a solid aluminum blade of new design. When the American fleet is entirely equipped with the new blades, 98 per cent of the airplanes of the country in scheduled domestic service will have Hamilton Standard propellers. The American fleet recently has been equipped with Curtiss-Wright electric propellers.
