Tables Action On Apartment Zoning Appeals Board Will Seek Advice on Garden-Type Project

Plans projected by Builder David H. Butler for the erection of a large garden type apartment development on Lydell street were indefinitely tabled last night as the Zoning Board of Appeals took up a petition under which 14 buildings, in three groups, might be erected. The project would contain 35 four-room and 20 three-room apartments on an area of three and one-quarter acres. Estimated cost, the Appeals Board was told, would be about a half million dollars.

It has been figured that under existing conditions the tax return to the town on the apartment development would be approximately the same as if 50 small, separate dwellings were constructed. Although the project is that with re-assessment a current market level as has been proposed, the separate dwellings would show considerably more value than the apartments. While this tax and assessment factor does not enter into the zoning picture, it is part of the concern of town officials, who have indicated they desire residential property to become "self-supporting" as possible, that is, pay a good part in taxes of the cost of education and public services. It has been said that without such direct payment, the town, not now drawing additional income from industrial property development, may yet into imbalance to such an extent that major difficulties could occur.

The current apartment proposal would place the development near Rolling Park, also built by Mr. Butler.

Discussion of the matter was taken up by Appeals Board members and Francis H. Handley of the Town Planning Commission.

After consideration, it was decided to consult with Professor Flavel Shortt, municipal planning expert, on the effect the development might have on the area in the future, and also in regard to other technical possibilities.

bound to vote the money Mr. Truman asked. His budget message, required by law, is a recommendation to Congress on how much run the government in the next fiscal year.

and determination of any kind," and devoted to belief "in extensive government ownership and control of industry."

However, he added that he had no real concept of what his last Communist involvement was.

When Chandler asked if he was a Communist while at Dartmouth, Remington replied:

"No, I was not."

Before entering college at 16, Remington said, he was a Republican because his parents were. He related that an early "religious education" from his mother caused him to develop a "concept of complete dedication to a personal God."

As a result, he said, he became "more than usually concerned with helping the underdog" and "moved left quite rapidly" after entering college.

He said that while at Ridgewood, N. J., High School he read the historic "Communist Manifesto," which made an "impression" on him. But he said he disapproved of the Manifesto's ideas of revolution.

During his college sophomore year, Remington said, he joined a Marxist study group, where discussion centered around a book by John Strachey, now a member of the Communist Party.

Remington said that in connection with this group, no one had ever attempted to recruit him into the Communist Party.

He testified that during the same year he was active on harbor workers and loyalist Spain.

Disputing testimony by a government witness, Richard Oles, who said Remington recruited him into the Young Communist League at Dartmouth, the defendant said he never knew there was a Young Communist League at Dartmouth, and that Remington had, he feels, a post-graduate education in five years and a \$2,000 fine.

Gasoline War Begins Again

Price Drops to 23.9 Cents a Gallon; President of Group Advises

Gasoline price cutting warfare started again in Manchester yesterday and all dealers are expected to cut their prices within the next 24 hours. Regular gas dropped from 25.9 to 23.9, a cut of two cents per gallon. Bill Markham, president of the Manchester Gasoline Dealers' Association, urged gas station operators to get out large "cents" signs with the new price for gasoline. These signs were displayed as soon as possible to protect gallonage. Vehicle owners are urged to stick with their regular stations and not to shop around for the cheapest cent per gallon. Prices will soon be adjusted accordingly, Markham added.

Mr. Markham said local station owners should have 30 days sign made as possible and should be ready to display new signs if the price goes lower than 23.9. Prior to the outbreak of the present cent price war, gasoline was priced at 25.9 per gallon.

Last fall for an 80 day period there was a gas price war in Manchester and regular gas dropped to 19.9 per gallon. There is a possibility that the price will again drop to this low figure.

Looses Pearson Libel Suit

throughout the six days of the trial was not in the courtroom when the jury brought in the verdict after four and a half days of deliberation. His attorney, Roger Robb, said the case will be appealed.

Denied Getting Money
Loose testified at the trial that James T. Mulloy, who worked in Pearson's Long Beach campaign headquarters in 1946, informed him of the \$1,200 incident in a sworn affidavit.

Mulloy testified in a deposition that Joe Irvine, an admitted Long Beach bookmaker, gave him \$12,000 bills in an unsealed envelope with instructions to give it to Pearson; that he saw Pearson several days later, gave the money to him and saw how he put it in his pocket.

Howser denied receiving the money, and testified that he did not know Mulloy or Irvine. Irvine also denied giving any money to Howser.

Breaks Into Tears
Howser broke into tears on the witness stand while describing the offering he said the Pearson broadcast caused him. He said he did not want his 12-year-old son "to think of his dad as a crook."

Judge Alexander Holtzoff, in his instructions to the jury, called for a special verdict because of the differing libel laws of the 10 states in which the broadcast was carried. He gave the jury a list of five questions, but told the jurors they need not answer the last four if

they found that Pearson had proved a "preponderance of the evidence" that the statement about "Everyone has a right to tell the truth" was true. "And no one has a legal right to complain about the truth being told about him."

Pearson Was Winner
He told the jury that if the evidence appeared to be in conflict on each side of the question involving the truth of the statement, a ruling in favor of Howser would be required.

The jury, however, answered all five questions in favor of Pearson. It held, in full:

1. That Pearson had proved his statement about Howser to be true.

2. That Pearson had proved he made the statement without malice or additions, ground for verdict in favor of Pearson in California, Arizona and Utah.

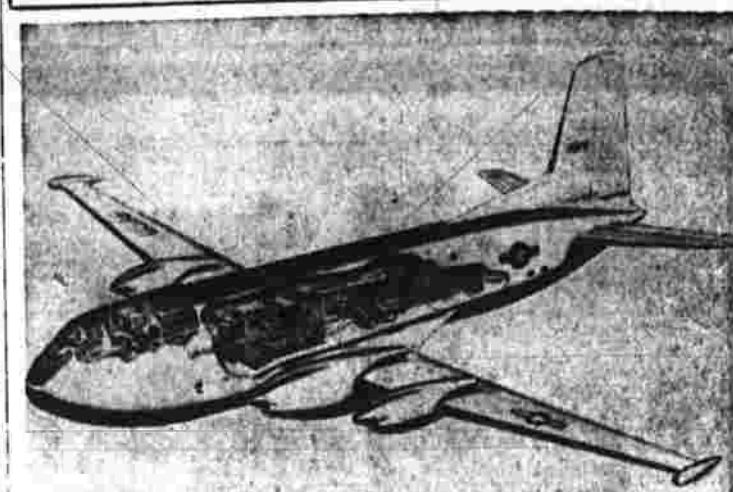

of that question last October when he ruled on a government motion for a summary judgment dismissing Miss Kellem's suit. The judge did not grant the motion, but he did rule that the law was constitutional.

It was obvious Miss Kellem acted intentionally and deliberately in refusing to pay withholding taxes, Judge Hines said, but the case must be tried to determine whether she acted "willfully." He defined a willful act as one done with a motive or purpose.

Miss Kellem has named as defendants the government itself and John J. Fitzpatrick, Internal Revenue Collector of the Connecticut District. His case against Fitzpatrick will be heard by a jury at her request. Judge Hines will decide the case against the government.

Miss Kellem filed her suit, she said, as a last resort after the President and Treasury Secretary Snyder turned a deaf ear to her requests for indictment. Second, our fellow free nations question our position in Formosa. They recall that American diplomacy long ago pledged the return of Formosa to China. They do not think we have a right to revoke that pledge, by force of American arms, merely because the government of China happens to have changed.

Third, our fellow free nations think that America made the military decisions in Korea, which make Chinese Communist intervention almost inevitable. They are quick to the opinion that United Nations forces should halt west of the 38th parallel. They do not think we have a right to revoke that pledge, by force of American arms, merely because the government of China happens to have changed.

That, we think, is a fair statement of the great United States argument at Lake Success. This argument, standing by itself, seems unanswerable. Not even the fact that Communist China is big, with bigger Russia standing by as a definite ally with China, is a valid reason for neglecting this American argument.

For all these reasons, these nations cannot see the Chinese issue as the simple black and white thing American diplomacy insists it must be. These nations had a great hope when, by approving the last peace proposal to China, American diplomacy seemed willing to soften its position in tacit recognition of the fact that the Chinese position was, in fact, temporarily, in a high state of unity. That unity might still be existing, today, if we had let the Chinese position analyze the Chinese note and reach their own conclusions on it, and take the lead in designating what they thought should be the next step.
