No Funds Here For Flu Shots

Neither Town Nor State Have Appropriation to Pay for Inoculations

Dr. Robert Keeney, local health officer, reported today that he has received many inquiries from parents of Manchester school children seeking information on getting influenza inoculation at school for this winter.

The State Board of Health, Dr. Keeney says, does not provide funds or for "flu" shots. The responsibility of making arrangements for school children to be inoculated would be up to the school authorities in Manchester, Dr. Keeney said.

At Manchester provides the funds, school children will receive "flu" shots and local physicians will cooperate in administering them, Dr. Keeney added.

Manchester school children are getting "flu" shots through arrangements made with an adult group and school officials. A minimum fee is charged.

Wapping

At a special town meeting Tuesday evening at Kilis-orth Memorial High school, the voters of the town unanimously approved the expenditure of \$600,000 for a school building program. Of this \$600,000 will go for 7 new 14-room school buildings on the new school site on Ayres Road, Wapping. The other \$500,000 will be used to remodel and alterations at Union school. The above cost will bring an increase in the tax rate of 4.3 mills. A member of the Board of Finance estimates that to pay for a larger teaching staff and other expenses at the new school it would be necessary to have an additional increase of 2.82 mills, which would bring an anticipated 7.2 mill increase in the tax rate to finance the whole program.

CBS Fires Girl Refusing Loyalty Test

She Denies Membership In Red Organizations But Declines to Sign Because of Principle

New York, Jan. 25 (AP)—The Columbia Broadcasting System has dismissed a girl office employee who refused to sign a loyalty statement explaining whether she had belonged to an organization designated as subversive by the government.

The name of the employee, discharged yesterday, was not made public by the network.

James H. Ream, executive vice president of CBS, said that so far the network's 2,500 regular employees who refused to sign the statement.

Ream said the policy of dismissing non-signers of the statement had been adopted to give effect to the company's loyalty program which was announced last month.

"She Won't Elaborate"
"It's the only way to make it work," he said. "Otherwise, the whole thing is only an empty gesture."

The girl, who declined use of her name said she had worked at CBS for a year and a half. She said she told Ream she never had been a member of any organization designated by the attorney general as either Communist or Fascist. She said her objection to signing the statement was based on a principle, but she declined to elaborate.

The girl said she did not belong to any labor union and that she did not wish to contest the CBS action.

"I'm sorry that anything has come out," she said.

Asks Court To Reverse Tax Verdict

U. S. Files Two Motions In Kellens Case With Judge Hinks; Decision Is Reserved

New Haven, Jan. 25 (AP)—The government has asked the federal court to upset a jury verdict which held that Vivian Kellens had not willfully violated the withholding tax law.

In two motions filed yesterday, U. S. Attorney Adrian W. Mahan asked Judge Carroll C. Hinks to set aside the verdict in which the jury decided for Miss Kellens in her civil suit against Internal Revenue Collector John J. Fitzpatrick. The verdict entitled her to recover \$6,133 in penalties levied against her.

One motion asked that the court enter a judgment for the defendant. Should that be denied, the other asked for a new trial.

The government contends that the penalties were legally imposed under a statute which provides for them against employers who willfully fail to withhold income taxes from their workers. Miss Kellens admits she deliberately and intentionally refused to withhold taxes from her working force of about 40 in her Sherrillton factory, but claims her actions were not willful because she was to test the constitutionality of the law.

The jury, in its verdict returned Wednesday, agreed with her. Judge Hinks, who held the law constitutional in the early stages
