Black Markets, Meat Famines Hit by Curbs

New Controls License Slaughterers, Give Them Quotas; Jurisdiction Row Settled

Washington, Feb. 7.—The government prepared today to issue a slaughter control order aimed at preventing black markets and big-city meat famines under price control.

The Office of Price Stabilization (OPS) is presently approving a schedule of meat allotments to slaughterers and giving them the authority to limit the number of animals to be slaughtered. The OPS is intended to discourage the sort of black market trading which has flourished since the outbreak of World War II and contributed to the abandonment of OPS.

At the same time, officials were apparently ready to announce anti-black market price violator penalties. Government sources told reporters these decisions are near.

The Justice Department will handle all price violator cases, including criminal cases, injunctions and the approval of price violator orders. OPS will handle the civil cases. Price Director Michael V. DuSalle, just back from a trip to Tokyo, said he hadn't heard of Russia's intention to build up a united sea force, like the United States, but that it was one of the major causes of world tension.

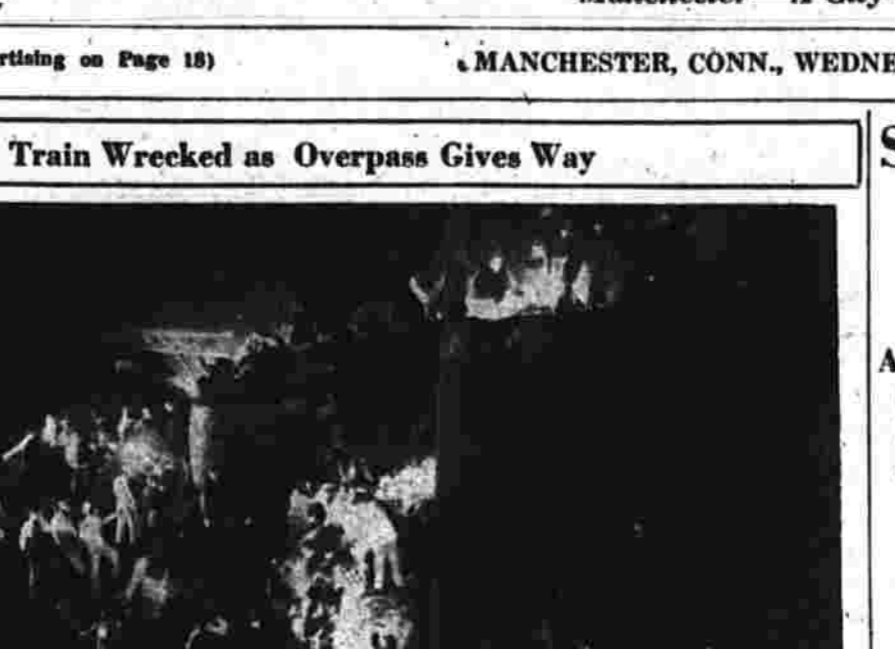

Woodbridge, N. J., Feb. 7.—(AP)—Authorities said today that a crack commuter train was traveling twice its authorized speed when it roared off the rails here last night, killing 82 persons.

Woodbridge, N. J., Feb. 7.—(AP)—A commuter crowd today in Pennsylvania Railroad train careened wildly atop a temporary overpass. Late at night, jumped the track and plummeted 20 feet down an embankment. Eighty-two persons were killed and about 500 injured. Workers clawed tirelessly through the wreckage until dawn today and authorities said possibly six to 10 bodies still may be found in the crumpled mass of twisted steel.

It was the third big wreck in the metropolitan New York area in less than a year. The three accidents took a total of nearly 200 lives.

The rush-hour crackup was the worst carnage in the nation since 1943 when a like number of persons perished in a Pennsylvania Railroad train wreck outside Philadelphia.

If the worst is done, it will be the most disastrous since 1918 when 115 died in Nashville, Tenn.

Atlantic Pact Unified Navy

U. S. Admiral to Command Force Which Will Have Equal Status With Ike's Vast Army

Washington, Feb. 7.—The Atlantic Treaty Nations have virtually completed plans for setting up a unified sea force, like the combined land and air forces of the continent, with an American admiral as top commander.

Admiral William M. Fechteler, Commander in Chief of the Atlantic Fleet, probably will be named to head the Supreme Allied Command Organization for the North Atlantic Ocean Region, it was learned today.

Although the North Atlantic Region Command is part of the overall North Atlantic Command, it is not intended to be subordinate to Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower's Western European forces, but to have something like a separate status.

The last Western communications had asked if the Soviet Union would discuss, at a meeting of the Four Foreign Ministers, basic causes of world tension rather than Russian problems alone.

"Discussion of 'other questions' said the Soviet reply, was 'possible' by the Council of Foreign Ministers in the composition and manner provided for by the Potsdam Agreement."

The note said the Soviet government does not oppose conveying a preliminary meeting of representatives of the U. S., Britain, France and the U.S.S.R. in Paris to work out a conference agenda.

But at this meeting, "consideration of substance questions included on the agenda should not be discussed, Moscow's note said."

Manchesters Tax Rate To Be Boosted One Mill

Dewey Broadcasts Foreign Policy Talk on Feb. 12

New York, Feb. 7.—Gov. Thomas E. Dewey will deliver an important address on foreign policy on Feb. 12, when he is in Manchester, at the annual Lincoln Day dinner of the National Republican Club at the Waldorf-Astoria hotel.

Manchester is going to have a tax rate of one mill this year. Addressing the Board of Directors last night, General Manager George H. Waddell said his figure shows the town must adjust a 27 mill rate on the current grand list to provide needed revenue. The present rate is 26 mills.

The Waddell said the condition is not as burdensome as he had predicted at the start of this fiscal year when he thought a 28 mill levy would be required to meet expenses.

The substantial gain in the grand list, said Waddell, makes it possible to drop from the current 28 mill prediction to the 27 mill level.

Increase in Salaries

The present 26 mill line might have been held, it appeared, except for the pressing need to increase municipal employee salaries down the line.

As the Directors met last night a public hearing was held on salary increase and adjustment proposals totaling \$85,002. Members of the Board of Education and its employees were represented by Charles S. House, chairman of the Board of Education. The Library Board was represented by Chairman William Berkeley and the Board of Police Commissioners by Charles F. Kelley, Mayor.

Details of the adjustments were explained and the need for them stressed.

There was no public opposition expressed on any of the increase proposals.

Average increases in library and education departments will run from \$100 to \$200 while general town employees will have their cost of living adjusted, with a total increase of \$18,500.

X-Ray Results Received Here

Evidence Found of Chest Diseases in 279 Out of 9,962 Persons

Of the 9,962 persons in Manchester who were X-rayed last fall under the program conducted here by the State Tuberculosis Commission, 279 persons are found to have evidence of chest diseases, it was announced today. Officials hastened to state that less than half of these have signs suggesting tuberculosis.

Discouraging more than half of the "positive" X-rays, the local incidence of the TB infection may prove to be somewhat higher than the 10 per thousand for the state's population as estimated by the State Tuberculosis Commission in its 1948-49 administrative report. It is stated.

Only by thorough medical examination on the basis of the X-ray can the amount and types of disease be definitely established, it is stated.

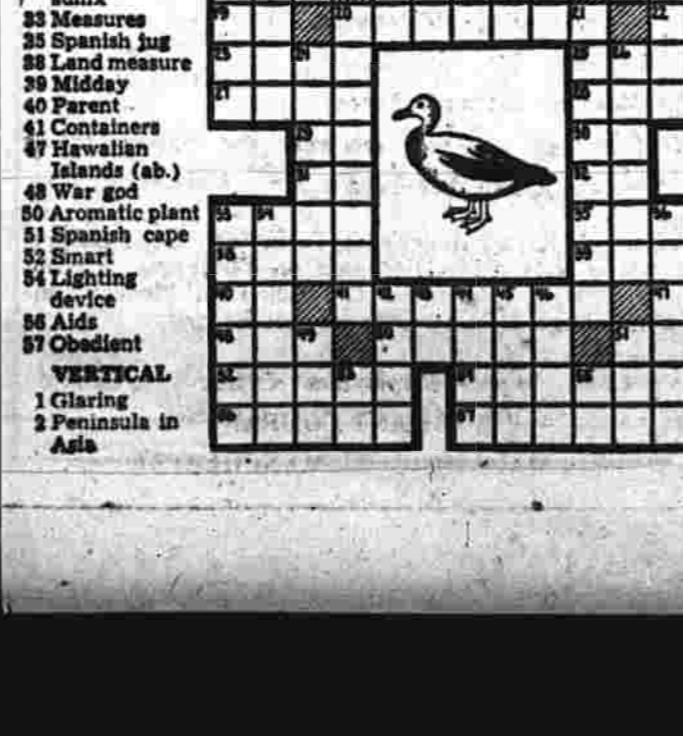

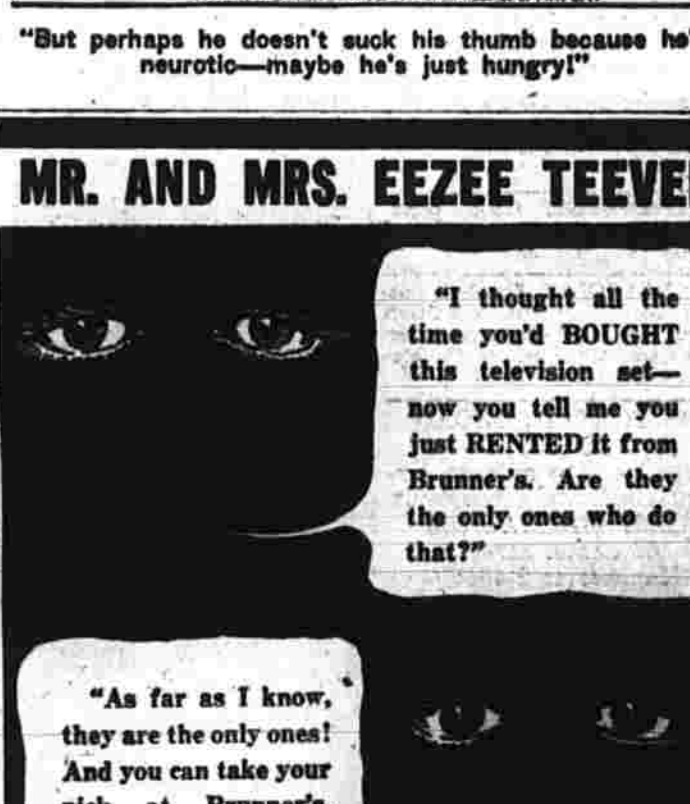

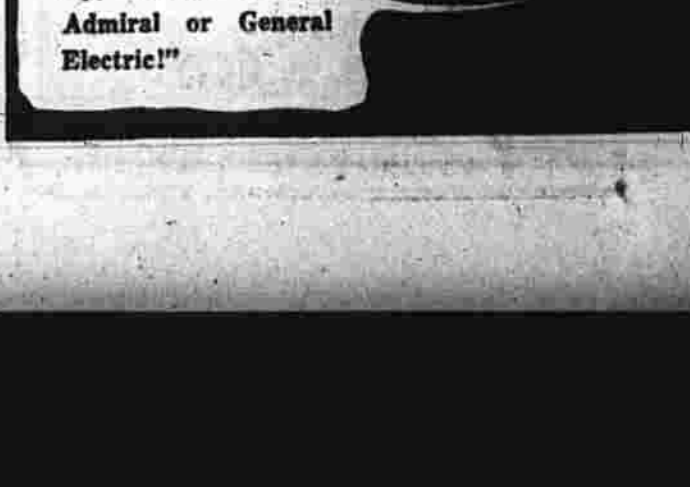
