**"Obey Your Traffic Laws" Is Chief Schendel's Advice**

The privilege of driving is something that most motorists do not appreciate until it is taken away from them by accident or by court action. Chief Schendel made that statement today in commenting on Manchester's February program of safety education, "Know and Obey Traffic Laws."

"Suspending the driving licenses of violators as a means of curtailing the death and injury is a drastic preventive measure," Chief Schendel said.

"Unfortunately, it is necessary to suspend drivers whose licenses are suspended temporarily, fail to realize that the lesson they are receiving may prevent them from losing their right to drive permanently because of a fatal accident. The severity of penalties is not always a definite indication of the severity of violations involved in fatal accidents. Speed, which ranks at the top of the list, was a violation noted on the records of about 7,000 drivers involved in fatal accidents in 1928. Another harsh offense, driving under the influence of alcohol, was a factor involving approximately 2,800 drivers in fatal accidents, Chief Schendel pointed out.

**Defense Tests Are Held Here**

Aircraft Spotters Man Observation Post on Odd Fellows' Building

Civilian Defense aircraft spotters manned the observation post on the roof of the Odd Fellows building for 16 hours this week-end as part of a state-wide test of its air defense organization. Police Lieutenant Raymond F. Griffin, director of defense air observation and communication, was in charge.

The spot was occupied in two-hour shifts from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m. on Saturday and Sunday.

Information on all reports of aircraft was relayed via special telephone to the state filter center in New Haven. Twenty-six planes were reported on Saturday alone. The spotters were under orders to report only jets, or two and four motor craft. Single-engine planes flying in formation were also noted.

The observers have received much aid and instruction from Thomas K. Eades, 39 Drive G, a pilot veteran of World War I. Eades was busy over the week-end approximately 1,000 drivers in fatal accidents, Chief Schendel pointed out.

Men Like Lincoln World Need Today

Rev. Fred R. Edgar Cites Universal Demand for Leadership by Those Who Are 'God's Men'

A special tribute was paid to Abraham Lincoln at the South Methodist church yesterday by the minister, Rev. Fred R. Edgar, who took for his theme, "We Need Lincoln Today." He began his sermon by reading the first Psalm as the scripture lesson to describe what might be called "God's men."

"In developing his theme, 'We Need Lincoln Today,' Mr. Edgar said we need Lincoln today because we need the determination to make the most of the possibilities of the lives God has given us. Addressing his remarks to the youth in the congregation, he said Lincoln was a shining example of how to follow in rising to the greatest heights possible in this life."

"In a day when wild unearring parents are doing everything in their power to give their children every break possible in this life we are very likely to produce the greatest bunch of feeble that the world has ever known. Many boys and girls today feel sorry for themselves because they were not born with silver spoons in their mouths."

"That every American youth can see in the life of Lincoln that it is possible for one to born in a one-room country log cabin, have less than one year of formal education, fall miserably so many times and yet be given the highest honor this nation can bestow."

"Lincoln was too busy helping himself up to feel sorry for himself. What he did do was to challenge to every boy and girl today to make the most of the life God has given them," stated the minister.

"In the second place he pointed out that we need Lincoln today because we need his high regard for his fellow men. 'Lincoln was a part of the Common Man of America. He was that by birth, circumstance and choice as well. He deliberately chose to read his life in this life with the common man. The woes and sorrows of the common man were his burdens. Sensitive as he was to the suffering or any living thing, Lincoln hated slavery with all his being. And because of his regard for man he suffered for it, but he never wavered. He refused to hate his enemies and for the people of the South remained his friends throughout the long hard years of the war."

"Because of his high regard for his fellow man Lincoln was able to see their faults and weaknesses. He was one of the first great Americans to realize that the cause of the great Civil War was the fault of the South."

"Great Revolution 'It was out of his great trust in God that there came forth that high resolve 'That this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom, and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth.'"

"Music for the service was under the direction of Herbert A. Francis, minister of music. The anthem was 'O Lord God,' by Tchaikovsky, and the traditional 'Battle Hymn of the Republic' by W. H. Murray which has been a part of the observance of Lincoln's birthday for a number of years at the local church. The presentation of the number made by Mr. Francis."

So Far Town Received \$2,400 Above Estimates by the Officials

So far the town has received in this fiscal year revenue amounting to about \$2,400 that it didn't expect to get. A statement of the standing of appropriations issued by the office of Town Controller Louise Johnson as of February 3 shows that several of the estimates of revenue have been exceeded by small amounts. The estimates did not foresee a penalty tax income, which amounts to \$627.72, aid money for the physically handicapped is up above estimates \$663.52, vocational training transportation is up \$12.40, adult education has a sum over estimate of \$150.04, building inspector fees are up \$620.45, municipal buildings income is up \$505.20.

There is very little real surplus benefit contained in the welfare and educational items will be expended on the subject items. The extra income from building inspector fees and from penalty taxes is not to the town. Whether there will be an actual total excess in revenues at the end of the fiscal year depends on whether estimated income holds up. If a few guesses don't prove right, the present little surplus won't balance them off.
