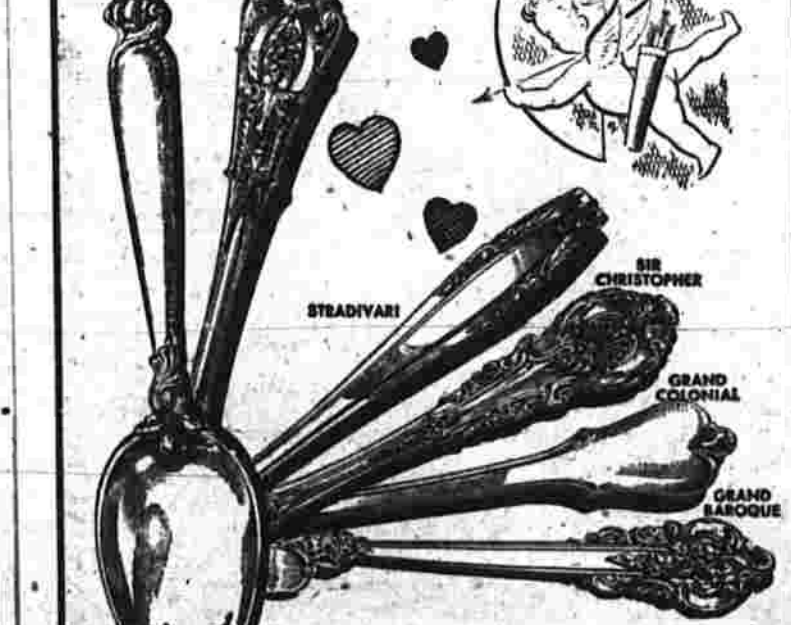

Connecticut Yankee
 By A. H. O.

The hottest controversy in Connecticut for the next few weeks is going to be that over the proposed steel mill at the Waterford area. It is a controversy which exists on several levels, ranging from the highest philosophical level to the lowest political level. We propose to begin near the top -- and work our way down.

At the top level, the proponents of the steel mill are thinking, in the opinion of some, in terms of a small stretch of Sound shore line, see this good being served by a giant new industry which will turn, in its own functioning, against the welfare of the region as a whole. They are proposing it, and fighting for it, long before politicians of any party became interested in it.

To this school of thought, the steel mill will make New England and New York, and therefore, a benefit to everybody and everything in the real life blood of New England, and they are afraid that that blood has been tending to run thin in recent decades. They welcome a big transfusion which, they think, would set the patient off on an unimpaired new career of health.

The steel mill has long been a dream of those New England industrialists who give their thought to the welfare of the region as a whole. They were proposing it, and fighting for it, long before politicians of any party became interested in it.

The most violent sentiment involved in that of people in the proposed area itself, who view the steel mill as a goliath certain to disturb or destroy a pattern of living which is familiar and dear to them.

Beyond that there is a certain sentimental-philosophical view which can be found among some Connecticut people who do not live in the area actually involved. These are people who are somewhat vaguely concerned with keeping Connecticut a "balanced" state, a tidy mixture of industry with agriculture, residential charm and recreational excellence, and who, holding this vague but pleasant concept, think that it represents the Connecticut they love, and the Connecticut they want to keep, and the Connecticut they ought to protect against any gigantic piece of over-emphasis on any one phase of Connecticut life -- in this instance the heavy industrial phase.

This school of thought has a great urge to make New England or Connecticut bigger and bouter. It likes things pretty much as they are. It tends to consider even a small stretch of Sound shore line, see this good being served by a giant new industry which will turn, in its own functioning, against the welfare of the region as a whole. They are proposing it, and fighting for it, long before politicians of any party became interested in it.

The Truth About Flu Shots

It was most unfortunate that at the moment Manchester health authorities were planning to offer "flu shots" to the children in our schools, the State Health Department should have been distributing an influenza bulletin in which it stated that vaccination was not recommended.

It took a few days for the State Health Department itself to realize that what must have happened was that some 5,000 copies of an old and out-dated bulletin, based on medical knowledge and conditions way back in the year 1929, had somehow been put into public circulation again.

At any rate, the State Health Department now recommends vaccination as to death officers, Dr. Robert Keeney, and all the other members of the Manchester medical profession who are giving their time to the vaccination program being offered in the schools starting tomorrow. Indisputable evidence of the State Health Department's real policy is that it itself has just completed a program of immunizing 4,500 state employees.

So, to Manchester parents who have been worried about the apparent difference of opinion between state health authorities and local health authorities, we would say this:

All the medical authorities, state and local, agree that the "flu shots" are a good thing, that they do help in preventing and controlling the disease. Both recommend that your child take the "shot." This is clear beyond all doubt.
