It indicates no formula at all. Acheson added that he was fully convinced the European would carry their full share of the load. He said he was saying they would double their forces.

Study France's Attitude
"I am very hopeful that what you have in mind and what I certainly have in mind, can be accomplished. But that depends on the actions of many nations — our own and of treaty nations and on the part of Spain herself."

"No Formula"
He noted Acheson had said the European nations would double their defense forces, an increase of 100 per cent. Russell said a contribution of four more American divisions would triple their strength. There are the equivalent of two U. S. Divisions there now.

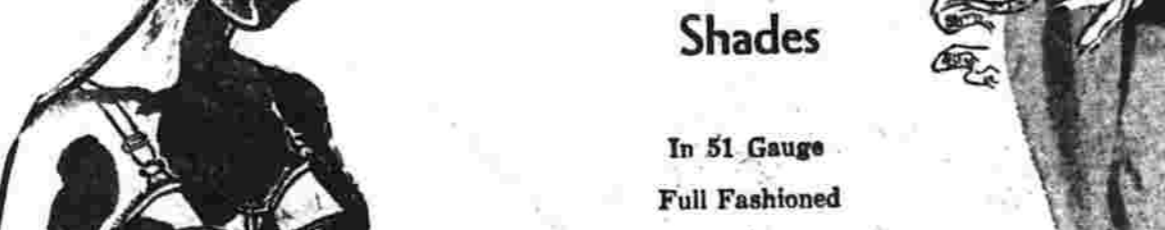
