With Republican leaders in the near future. The governor said he was anxious that a cooperative climate will be created in his forthcoming discussion with the Democrats, he replied.

When a reporter remarked that Lodge had frequently taken the position that legislative matters were a responsibility of the legislature, he replied: "I think that a governor has the right, and sometimes an obligation, to take the lead in those matters, but often it's better done by consultation. It all depends on what you're trying to do. I'm trying to get through a program that will be helpful to the people. In a letter to Lodge yesterday accepting his invitation to discuss legislative matters with him, Senator Benjamin Lippner (D, Bridgeport), majority leader of the Democratic-controlled Senate, said that his party was especially interested in getting a program on three issues. A proposal to build another highway across the county from the New York state boundary to the Housatonic River, paralleling the Merritt Parkway, has been a subject of controversy for years, favored by some county towns and opposed by others.

State Democratic Chairman John M. Bailey also said in a formal statement last night that he hoped that Lodge would promptly make available to the legislature a report on the state's housing needs prepared by Ralph Macy, State Public Works Commissioner.

Lodge held newsmen today that he had no secret about Macy's findings and that they would be made available to the legislature at once.

Our views were either ignored, or the exact opposite of our proposals was put into effect. "We decided, therefore, to take a dramatic step. We voted unanimously for the withdrawal of labor representatives from and defense agencies in which they were serving. We felt that this was the only way we could effectively impress upon the American people the shocking failures and the gross inequities of defense policies. "The labor meetings here yesterday and today are aimed at enlightening the support of community groups, through the local and state leaders attending, behind the United Labor Policy committee's fight. CIO President Philip Murray said the management groups which opposed giving a newly-formed labor stabilization board power to settle all kinds of disputes wanted to force workers "into a narrow, blind alley."

Assembly to Hold Session in Paris

Lake Success, March 21.—The United States General Assembly voted last night to hold its 1951 session in Paris beginning Nov. 4. The vote was 94-17, with 12 countries abstaining and seven absent.

The Assembly also approved spending \$2,300,000 on extra costs of the European meeting. This is \$600,000 more than the sum originally approved. The United States, the Philippines, Iraq and Pakistan objected to the increase.

The session is being delayed six weeks from its usual opening date in September to allow erection of new buildings for the assembly.

He is author of "Catholicism in New England," "Catholicism in the United States," "Anti-Seminitism to 1900," and "Catholicism and the New England Mind." He has written numerous articles on religious and educational subjects, and has been a consultant with Father John E. Sexton, of the "History of St. John's Seminary," published in 1948.

He is a member of the Catholic Historical Society, the American Historical Association, the Colonial Society of Massachusetts, and the Bibliographical Society of America. Father Riley is a member of Plymouth, Mass., Council No. 1199, Knights of Columbus, and Cardinal O'Donnell Assembly, Fourth Degree.
