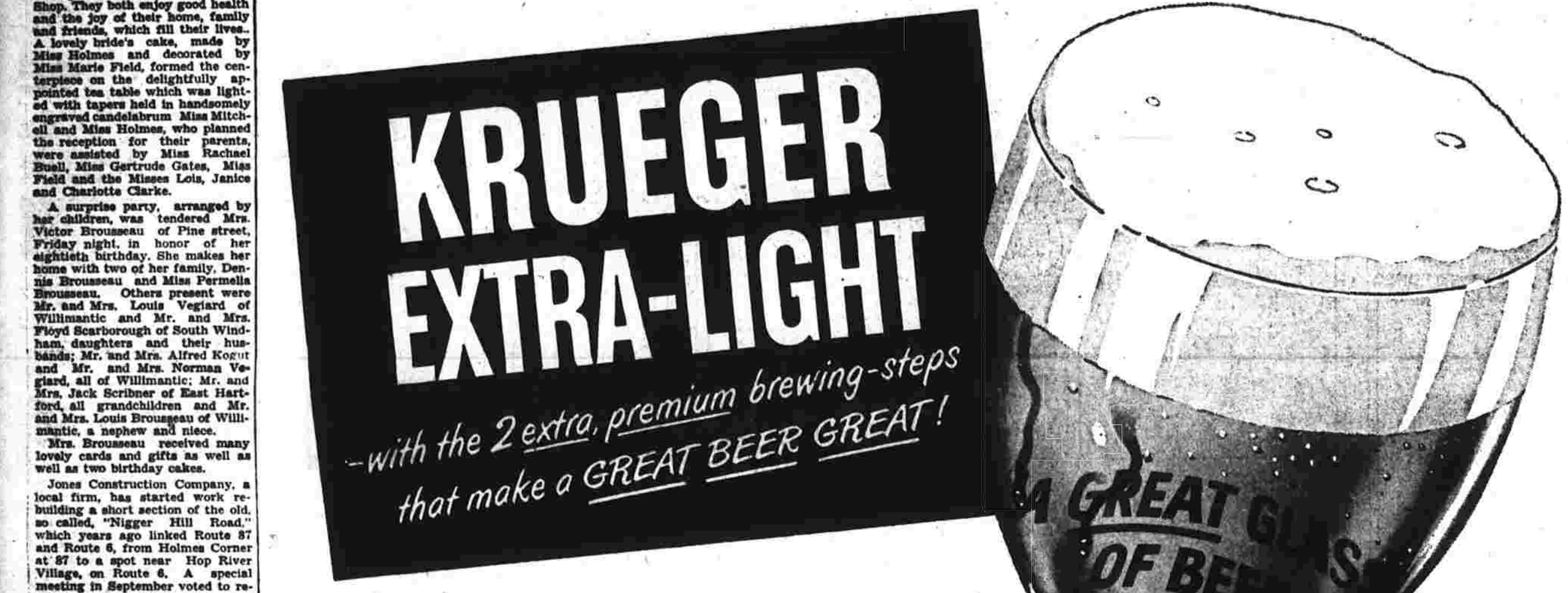

**Says Solid South Is Thing of Past**

New Haven, March 22.—(AP)—The South has been described by one of its leading newspaper editors as displaying strong tendencies toward a two-party political system. Virginia Dabney, editor of the Richmond Times-Dispatch, lecturing at Yale yesterday, attributed the disintegration of the "Solid South" to the fact that the New Deal is no longer predominantly Republican but has turned to the Democratic party and to southern opposition to President Truman's Civil Rights program. Dabney predicted that political independence in the South is something needed for a long time. Pointing to the 1948 election in which the Democrats failed to get a majority in seven Southern States, he predicted that General Dwight Eisenhower would carry the Southern States if he should be a candidate against President Truman.

**Move to Rewrite Vote Laws Gains**

Hartford, March 22.—(AP)—A proposal that a commission be created to rewrite Connecticut's election laws was advanced at a legislative hearing yesterday. William S. Gordon, Jr., former deputy secretary of the state, said among other things such a commission could determine whether legislation is needed to prevent delays in the inauguration of the governor-elect and other state officers. Governor John Lodge (R) and his Democratic predecessor, Chester Bowles, both had to cool their heels for hours because of legislative delays in the certification of the election returns. Gordon's proposal was made at a hearing on two Constitutional amendments which have been suggested. One would assign to the election laws committee the task of canvassing the vote, a duty now performed by the treasurer, the treasurer, comptroller and secretary of the state. The other would fix 2 P. M. on the opening day of the legislative session for the inauguration of the governor-elect and other state officers whose elections are uncompleted.

Washington, March 22—(AP)—William M. Jeffers, War II boss of the Federal rubber program, says President Truman is pouring the taxpayers' money "down a hundred rat holes" and has lost the people's confidence.

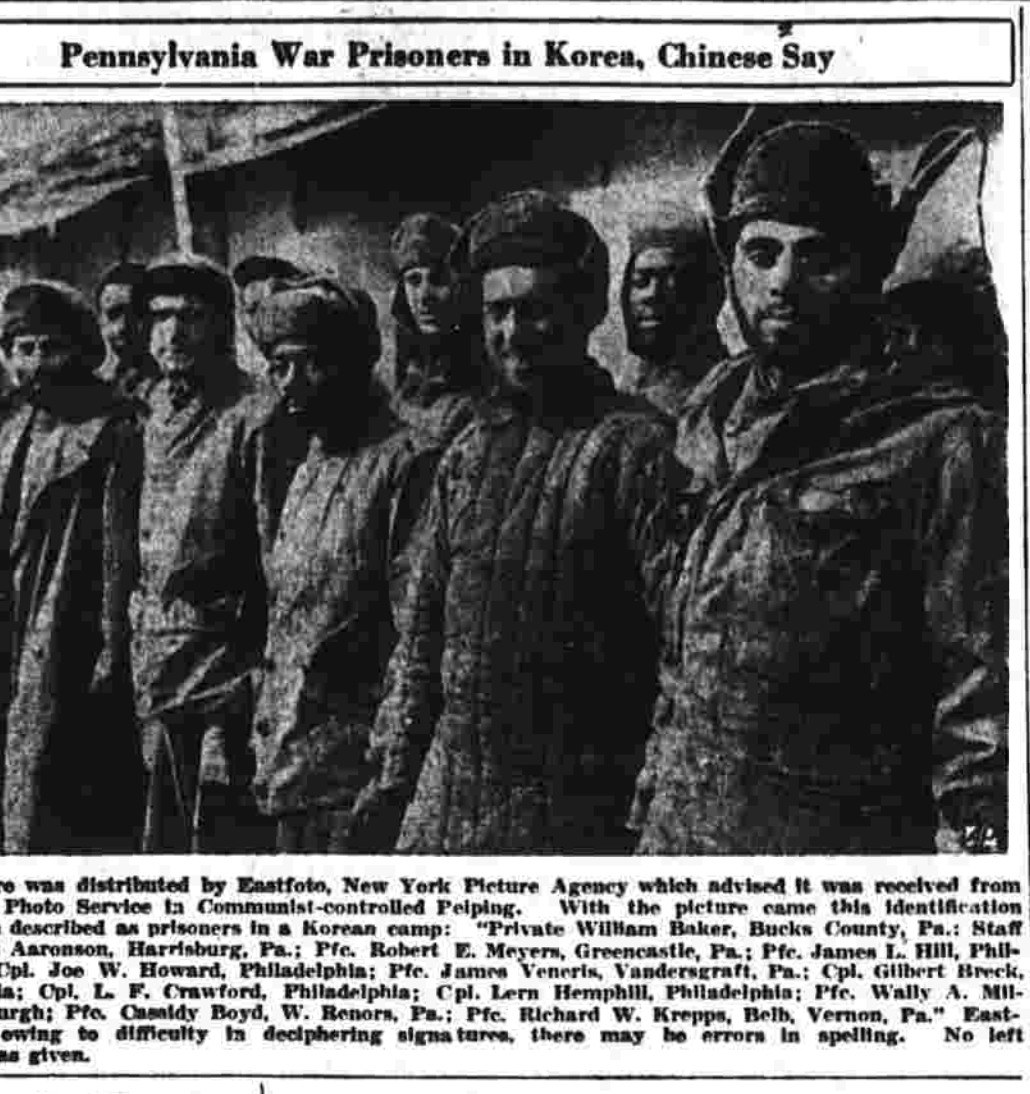

London, March 22—(AP)—A giant U. S. Air Force transport plane with 53 persons aboard vanished in fog and rain over the Atlantic ocean today while en route to the United States to England.
