Reds Down Five U. S. B-29s In Jet Scramble Near Yalu

Washington, April 13—(AP)—The Air Force announced today that five U. S. B-29 Superfortresses were shot down in a jet scramble near the Yalu river yesterday. The announcement was made after an air force briefing officer disclosed the loss of two of the big bombers in an air battle with Red jets near the Yalu river yesterday. Three additional B-29s have been lost to enemy air action in prior engagements, it was announced. One of the three earlier losses, the Air Force said, was from ground fire. No details were given, but presumably they were recent losses.

Warns Reds Prepare Heavy Air Strikes On Allied Troops

Tokyo, Saturday, April 14 (AP)—The Chinese withdrawal in North Korea coincided with a warning that they might be preparing the way for heavy air strikes at the advancing Allied ground forces. The withdrawal of Communist air might soon start ground attacks. In nine and one-half months of war, such Red raids have been limited to minor nuisance bombings by one or two planes. Allied airmen are forbidden to strike at the Manchurian base of the Red Air Force, General Stratemeyer noted in an interview. "Our only recourse is to blunt the attack once it is launched," he said. Stratemeyer's warning came in the wake of the jet battle. In that fight 80 Russian-type MIG-15s attacked 115 U. S. jets and 32 American B-29 superfortresses. The Allied warplanes destroyed eight of the speedy Red planes, probably destroyed seven, and damaged 18 others. Accounts of American loss differ. The National Geographic Society says two were damaged and had to land in Korea. The Air Force in Washington announced Friday that two U. S. B-29s were shot down by Red jets in a big battle near the Yalu River. It said several other U. S. B-29s were damaged but were repaired. The Air Force spokesman said none of the U. S. jets was the sight was destroyed. Stratemeyer said there was "unmistakable evidence" that the Red was planning to step up their air operations over Korea. He said that one or more new air strips were being scraped out of the mountains near the Yalu River boundary and the allied troops were being moved to the Yalu River. On the ground, Allied troops, supported by heavy artillery, are gaining a key ridge south of the Kwachon Reservoir on the central front. Remnants of a North Korean division still were entrenched on the western front.

Service Unit To Get Facts

Washington, April 13—(AP)—Gen. Douglas MacArthur today was invited to testify before the Senate Armed Services Committee as part of a broad-scale review into the policies that led to his firing. The committee—made up of seven Democrats and six Republicans—voted unanimously to invite MacArthur to appear before it and to conduct a general review of United States military and Far Eastern policies. Chairman Russell (D., Ga.), told reporters he did not think the committee's inquiry could be called "an investigation." Rather, he said it will be an attempt "to get all the facts about the military situation in the Far East." The committee action assured MacArthur of a Congressional hearing for his views. "If we can't wait, he said, we will be quick to act." Republican congressional leaders continued nevertheless to press for an invitation for MacArthur to address a joint Senate-House session. Representative Martin of Massachusetts, the House GOP floor leader, told a news conference that unless MacArthur is invited to address Congress next Wednesday or Thursday the general will make a public speech in New York City. House Beats Troops Curb

Washington, April 13—(AP)—The House beat down today an attempt to bar the assignment of American troops to any war theater unless the commander has full right to bomb enemy sources of supply. The proposal—defeated by a vote of 113 to 62—was offered by Rep. Charles R. McNair (R-Mich.) as a rider to the draft bill. McNair said it would prevent a repetition to the MacArthur situation. Gen. Douglas MacArthur, just relieved of his Far East command, has provoked hot controversy over his contention that he should have authority to send Red Chinese bases in Manchuria. The House hoped to reach a final vote during the day on a bill to lower the draft age, extend the length of military service and provide for a National Security Training Corps. A substitute bill was defeated yesterday by a vote of 233 to 160. The substitute, offered by Rep. Barden (D-N.C.), would have extended the present draft law. It contained no provision for Universal Military Training. The administration-sponsored bill would lower the draft age to 18 and a half, extend length of service to 20 months and lay groundwork for Congressional action later on UAT. It appeared almost certain of approval, perhaps today unless arguments over proposed amendments had delayed it. Rep. Towe (R-N.J.) said he intended to make another try to take on a bill against sending anyone inducted under the bill to Europe unless Congress first approves. Marshall for Plan To Double Marines

Washington, April 13—(AP)—Secretary of Defense Marshall said today he "strongly recommends" a proposal to double the authorized strength of the Marine Corps. Zoonoses May Get You—If You Don't Watch Out!

St. Louis, April 13—(AP)—Will new zoonoses rise up to make humans sick? You may have had a zoonosis already. A zoonosis is an animal disease transmissible to man.

There are over 80 such diseases, Dr. James H. Steele, chief of Veterinary Public Health, Communicable Disease Center, Atlanta, Ga., told the American College of Physicians today.

Maybe there will be new zoonoses, still unforeseen, in the future, he said. There is a theory that disease germs of lower animals struggle to get ahead, and may change as they can affect higher animals, including man.

In laboratory experiments, disease germs have been made to invade new kinds of hosts or victims. But they haven't always stayed up to attack higher forms of life, Dr. Steele said.

Some animal diseases are occasionally found in humans, such as Newcastle disease of fowl, and swine influenza. Maybe, he said, there are examples of germ life trying to adapt to higher forms of life.

The 80-odd diseases that humans can get from animals include rabies, brucellosis or undulant fever, anthrax, tuberculosis of dairy.

Better Chance For Peace? The inevitable question is: have the chances of a successful conclusion of the Korean operation...

The glib, hopeful answer might be yes. This obviously is the main reason for the optimism...

The overwhelming reaction to the part of the free world seems to be one of relief and approval...

There is no doubt that the removal of MacArthur's removal, the free world has escaped a situation in which one general was operating daily to make impossible the termination to the Korean conflict...

That does not mean, however, that any easy optimism about the future is really justified. The issues which hold life or death for the world are still both acute and if the MacArthur touch has been removed, the dynamics of war itself still have plenty of hold on us and on the enemy.

Therefore, as a result of General MacArthur's policies and Washington's temptations we are in a tangled position which apparently must remain something short of the clear and perfect stand for peace. We are, for instance, north of the 38th parallel, and although General Ridgway, who now commands United Nations forces, said a few weeks ago that he would regard United Nations progress up to that line as a great victory and accomplishment of UN objectives in Korea, there is a tantalizing military question as to whether, now finding himself across that parallel, he does, militarily, to use the tactics of withdrawal back to that line and attempt stabilization of a UN position there.

The clearest key to what may be improved prospects for peace may, perhaps, be found in President Truman's speech the other night. In that speech, he did not fulfill some of the responsibility upon him after the MacArthur dismissal. He did clarify our objectives in Korea. He did state policies which close to having the agreement and approval of all the free members of the United Nations.

President Truman said "the forces of the United Nations will try to limit the conflict if possible." "We do not want to see the conflict in Korea extended. We are trying to prevent a world war to start one."

President Truman discussed a basis for peace, as follows: "Real peace can be achieved through a settlement based on the following factors: 1. The fighting must stop. 2. Concrete steps must be taken to insure that the fighting will not break out again. 3. There must be an end of the aggression. 4. A settlement founded upon these elements would open the way for the unification of Korea and the withdrawal of all foreign forces."

"In the meantime, I want to be clear about our military objective. We are fighting to resist an outrageous aggression in Korea. We are trying to keep the Korean conflict from spreading to other areas. But at the same time we must conduct our military activities so as to insure the security of our forces. This is essential if they are to continue the fight until the enemy abandons its ruthless attempt to destroy the Republic of Korea."

"That is our military objective to repel attack and to restore peace. In the hard fighting in Korea, we are proving that collective action among nations is not only a high principle but a workable means of resisting aggression. Defeat of aggression in Korea may be the turning point in the world's search for a practical way of achieving peace and security."

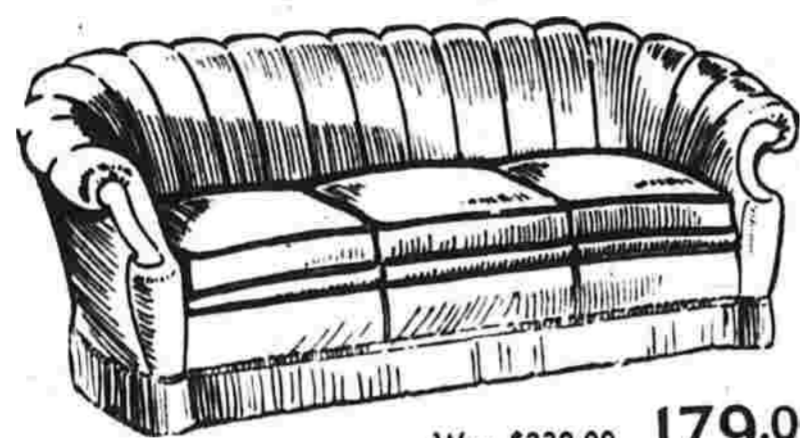

Combat Vets As Teachers

Four from Korea Now At Camp Pickett Instructing 43rd Troops

Camp Pickett, Va.—Four combat veterans of the Korean campaign are visiting troops of the 43d Winged Victory Division here to emphasize the importance of battle training.

Soldiers of the division are imbued with the seriousness of their training. If anything, their determination was heightened after listening to the four enlisted men, all wounded veterans of divisions still fighting Red forces on the Korean peninsula.

Their activities are being coordinated by Lieutenant Colonel Joseph R. DeOrrick of Bloomfield, Conn., division operations and training officer.

In the short time they have been attached to the division, the four instructors have been impressed with the training the division is receiving.

"The 43d Division is getting better training than we had a chance to get before we moved into Korea. The training displays sound tactics. Sergeant First Class Raymond H. Turner of Dallas, Tex., said. The sergeant was wounded by airplane while fighting with the 24th Division in Targov.

Sergeant Max L. West of Neigh, Neb., said. The men are learning a lot day by day. They are shaping up in the time regiment. The soldiers work hard and spend a lot of time in the field."

At Camp Pickett, Sergeant West also served with the 24th Division. A veteran of the Seoul, Kim River and Han River campaigns, he received his wounds at Chindit. A veteran of the 2d Div., he served with the 2d Div. 30 days on the front in the perimeter before barrage from a Communist mortar shrapnel struck and broke a bolt out of his leg in both legs, back, left arm and shoulder.

Corporal Marvin J. Harris of Washington, N. C., also back from the 24th Division. He fought in the now famous delaying action from Suwon to the Nakdong River. He was wounded at the Nakdong River, evacuated to Japan, and then down back to the states. Major Richard H. Ferster of Somerville, Mass., assistant operations and training officer, said the main duties of the Korean veterans are to check the instruction given by Major Ferster. They make the rounds of the various testing areas, visit special courses and deliver lectures on lessons learned in actual Korean combat, he said.

Troops of the former New England National Guard Division, commanded by Major General Kenneth F. Chaffin, are well along in a rugged training schedule set up by Army Field Forces.

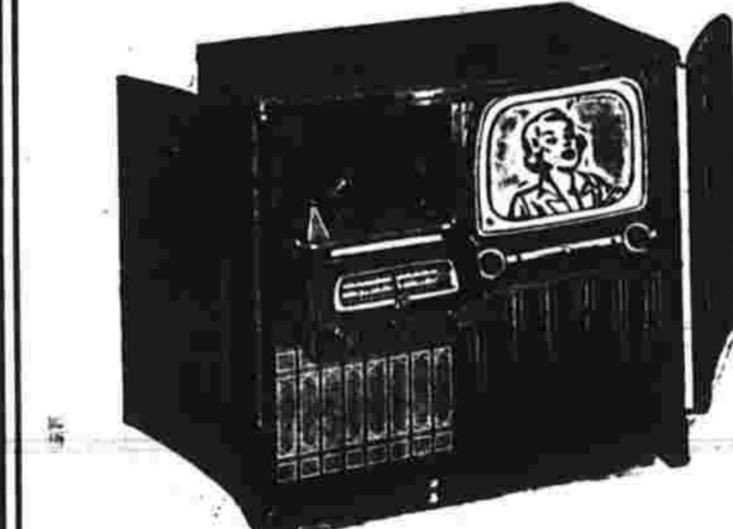
