New Britain, April 17 .- Special)-President Herbert D. Welte of the Teachers College of Connecticut, New Britain, revealed Winners Listed that 83 per cent of the graduates of the Teachers College turing the past six years have seen placed in teaching positions

Practically every graduate of the College's elementary education program during the six-year period was placed in a teaching position, according to the figures of the Piacement Office, he said, while 80 per cent of the graduates of the secondary and special teaching programs were placed in high schools in the state.

The College has graduated 823 qualified teachers from 1945 to 1950. Of the 17 per cent not placed, President Welte stated that 8 per cent were enrolled in achools.

In commenting on the placement record President Welte said.
"I doubt if there is a college in New England with a better placement record. It indicates only too well how the Teachers College is meeting the needs of Connecticut."
