Await Report On Fire Dist.

Rumor in Town That Survey Will Say Our System is Outdated

Although no official report has been received as a result of the recent fire underwriters' survey of the city's fire fighting system, it is being persistently rumored that the report is going to show that the present district system of fire fighting is out of date, and that all of the fire fighting facilities in the whole town should be unified.

The survey is expected to make no detailed recommendations, but the report probably will be of the type that will point at the course of action rather than push toward it. However, findings made, it is believed, will lead toward a complete overhaul.

This may not be outright condemnation of the district system of fire fighting, but it will be a severe test, but would supply an overall command and administration. In other words, both districts might turn over part of their functions to a third party which would be the fire department.

The report, after being received here, perhaps not until summer, will be evaluated by the local study committee headed by Charles E. McCormick, and its recommendations will be returned to the Board of Fire Commissioners for publication and action.

whether it will stick to the 10 per cent formula.

day that the \$7,000,000,000 in two per cent bonds due Sept. 15, 1953, and callable on Sept. 15, 1951, will not be called for redemption on that date. That means the government cannot now, as in recent years, borrow money at the lowest rates, enough to pay off its old bonds, and at the same time issue new bonds at a lower interest rate. Because the debt could only be refunded at higher interest, the government is letting it ride.

The federal government owes about \$22,400,000,000 or around three-fifths of all the money owed in this country.

Borrow for Defense

It will have to refund some \$31,000,000 of old debt this year, even after it has put off the \$8,000,000 bond problem. It must also borrow several billion more for defense needs.

It will have to do this in a period when interest rates not only have risen considerably but may possibly rise even more as government borrowing takes on scale.

Secretary of the Treasury also announced the Treasury will offer a new savings note at interest rates will show those it has been paying on similar securities.

The new notes, to be offered for continuous subscription on May 15, will pay 1 1/4 per cent interest if held for six months or 1 1/8 per cent if held for their full three-year term.

The prevailing savings notes have paid only .68 per cent interest for less than six months and 1.40 per cent for a full three years.

Lappen Insurance Plan Defeated by Directors

Despite Predictions, Discussions Orderly and Restrained; Matter Is Finally Tabled

Public sentiment and weight of numbers bore down Director John L. Lappen's attempt to alter the town insurance-split plan. Last night, with only his own vote as his support, but with two directors abstaining, Lappen's bid to oust committee-form handling of the town's insurance business resulted in a strong reaffirmation of the intent of the Board of Directors to get the committee's recommendations as work as quickly as possible.

As he suffered defeat of his resolution however, Lappen himself an insurance agent, succeeded in casting question on the "attention to business," as he put it, of the committee which has been in charge of the insurance problem in its care for a year. His questions also disclosed some mix-up in view as to the duties and functions of the committee. In the end, appeared to be a fairly frank "grab" for the entire handling of the town's insurance business, and as such was unopposed.

Discussion Is Orderly

The best promised for the special meeting last night was kept under control, and though the air was tense, discussions were orderly and restrained.

Summed up, the argument concerns two different plans for the handling of the insurance on town buildings and the town's liability insurance. Over a year ago, Director T. J. Crockett asked that a study be made of the way the town was placing its insurance, with a view to improving service to the town and making a more fair distribution of the business among local agencies.

Several meetings later, the Board of Directors asked General Manager George H. Waddell to make some comments. After looking over the proposition, Waddell brought in recommendations which were substantially those urged last night by Director Lappen. Waddell proposed that one local agency in effect act as "manager," that his agency get the bulk of the commission and that the remainder be split on a point system basis among other active agencies here.

This recommendation the Directors accepted, but later rescinded action on Waddell's original plan, a committee of five members was set up to bring in a workable plan for adoption by the town.

The Plans

The "single agency" and "committee" propositions from the first had one major difference. The "single agency" plan, as developed, proposed that 30 per cent of all commissions to the agency acting as manager, with 60 per cent split among other agencies qualified on the basis of the point system.

The "committee" proposal was a split on a 25-75 per cent basis with all agencies who were qualified sharing in the split of the 75 per cent, then each member of the five-man committee handling the job to get his equal share of the other 25 per cent. In addition, the committee membership would be rotating one with a new member coming on each year. Thus, it was held, all agencies eventually would share in the complete plan.

In opposing the committee plan, Lappen many times asserted he had a sincere belief in the efficiency of it. His opponents said this doubt arose from his hope his would be the managing agency that would be chosen to handle the business under the Lappen plan.

Lappen heatedly denied this on several occasions, but the thought persisted until last night when Robert H. Smith, president of the Manchester Insurance Agents' association pointedly asked Lappen if Lappen would withdraw his agency from consideration under his plan.

Lappen replied he would not be willing to do so. Under further questioning by Smith, he said he would have no ill feeling if any other agency should be chosen.

Choice Stated

It was further brought out that General Manager George H. Waddell has made the statement that if the Lappen plan prevailed, he would choose the Lappen agency as insurance manager.

Asked by Smith if he would object to having the Manchester Insurance Agents' association choose the operating agency if the Lappen plan was taken up, Lappen said he would object under the present conditions.

He said, however, he would be willing to leave the decision under his plan, up to the Board of Directors.

Smith said he was glad to hear this concession, because, he stated, it has been generally supposed that the Lappen plan was a "reasonable" move.

Last night's special session was called after Director Lappen, in a surprise move a week ago Tuesday night, moved that his original plan be again established and that the study committee now be discharged. Action taken was tabled to last night.

As the meeting last night got under way, Lappen himself went on the offensive against the present insurance committee. Attacking its actions to date, Lappen added if it was not a fact that the committee should have taken over

agents were so determined to have business handled now by a committee when they advised the Board of Education to adopt the agency plan.

Agent Edgar Clark replied that the "manager" in this case, would be a committee.

Lappen then read a copy of a letter in which the agents had qualified an insurance agent as manager for school insurance.

Director Lappen had been qualified to act for the committee.

Members of the Board of Directors, through exchanges such as those appeared a bit uncertain as to the genuineness of the conflicting claims and opinions.

Director Melvin Hathaway questioned several assertions in the Lappen statement on insurance given last Tuesday and printed in The Herald, but answers did not seem to clear away the cobwebs.

As the meeting opened last night, some of the Lappen assertions were answered in advance by President Robert H. Smith of the insurance association and Chairman John L. Jenney of the committee.

Smith said that the study group had approached the problem "difficult as it was for Mr. Lappen to conceive," without thought of personal commissions. He noted that the committee plan has the "complete approval" of local agents, that it is not limited to members of the association, and he cited other towns and cities where similar plans are in force.

Jenney explained the reason for the time lag of a year in the completion of the plan, having in mind the difficulty in securing completion of approval of town property. Such delays, he said, were "beyond the control of the committee" which had been in existence in a reasonable time. They were not received until March, he added.

Lappen observed in reply that when it took a year to get results "something certainly is amiss."

After the sales of opinion and questioning had extended over a period of about an hour, Director Crockett, who said that although he is an agent, he never has received nor wants commission on town business, proposed that the Directors have confidence in the committee report.

Crockett lauded the members for their work, and he was somewhat critical of Lappen's course of questioning.

The vote came after the Lappen resolution, made last meeting, was

taken from the table. Lappen had a motion to vote by ballot and when the proposal was voted, Lappen alone supported it. Director Walter Mahoney said he would not vote because he did not feel informed enough on the proposition. He had seconded the Lappen resolution last week. Director Alden Bailey did not vote.

Director Crockett then moved that the committee plan be implemented at the earliest possible date and the General Manager asked a meeting for final discussion this morning.

The proposal was adopted. Director Hathaway, asserting that the debate last night had raised a basic question, asked that the town council be called to give a decision on the question of public officials engaging in private business with the town.

Mayor Harold Turkington and others stated they thought this was beyond the scope of last night's meeting, and the Hathaway suggestion was tabled.

At once after tabling the matter, however, the Directors began to discuss it and several of those who had voted to table, asked that Councilman John D. LaBelle, who was in the audience, for his

Painful Pleurisy May Yield To New Germ Killer. By Edwin P. Jordan, M. D. Written for NEA Service. No one who has had an attack of acute pleurisy ever forgets it. Although it is not as painful as the chronic form, it is a most unpleasant experience and often lasts for quite a long time. This disorder gets its name from the delicate membrane which surrounds the lungs called the pleura. If the pleura becomes inflamed, which may be the result of infection or for no apparent cause, there is pain felt in the chest. Also, there is usually a sharp dry cough which the victim breathes because it makes the pain worse. Even ordinary breathing or any other motion of the chest is likely to bring on sharp pain. An attack of pleurisy is apt to begin after exposure to excessive cold though it may come on at any time. It is sometimes only one sign of some other disease of the lungs such as pneumonia. Even if the pain is more or less bearable it isn't smart to pretend to be big and strong and ignore the whole thing. Rest in bed as soon as possible is not only a lot more comfortable but a lot safer. And it is wise, too, to get an X-ray and other diagnostic tests before too long.
