Beer Sales Slip, Wine Liquor Up

Hartford, May 11—(AP)—Slightly less beer drinking and heavier strong wine and hard liquor consumption were reflected today in state tax figures for the month of March.

The data, released by Tax Commissioner William F. Connelly, shows a drop of one per cent in beer taxes, a 47 per cent jump in wine over 21 per cent alcoholic content and a six per cent rise in hard liquor use.

Figures compare this past March with the same month in 1950.

Due largely to the heavier hard liquor consumption, total receipts for March of this year ran \$451,936—about \$7,000 over a year ago.

Total alcoholic beverage revenue for the nine months since last July 1 ran \$5,376,903, an increase of about \$50,000 over the same months of a year ago.

Cigarette smoking, reflected in tax receipts, also rose in March of this year as compared to the same month in 1950. Latest receipts showed taxes paid of \$604,667, or about \$85,000 over a year ago.

Total cigarette returns for the nine-month period since last July 1 totaled \$6,490,785, or about \$307,000 over the same months of the previous fiscal year.

Reds Report Death Of Top Scientist

Moscow, May 11—(AP)—The death of M. Moisevich Gubergits, leading medical scientist in the Ukraine, in Kiev was reported today by the Ukrainian Pravda.

Gubergits was one of the closest collaborators and disciples of the noted Russian physiologist, the late Ivan Pavlov.

The newspaper said that Gubergits, created new chapters in the study of internal ailments. He was the head of the Kiev Medical Institute faculty of diagnostics and internal illnesses and author of more than 150 works in the field of medicine.

The Ukrainian Pravda carried on its front page a special decree granting his widow a life pension, life tenure of his apartment and 15,000 rubles (officially \$3,750).

Auto Travel Record Seen

All Time Peak Volume Expected in State This Summer

Hartford, May 11—Connecticut's 1951 automotive travel will reach an all-time peak volume of six and one-half billions of miles according to 1950 experience and current indications states a bulletin of the Highway Safety Commission. Such travel increase will be reflected in increased traffic experience, also.

"Travel on Connecticut highways last year set a new record" states the bulletin, "with an estimated total of 6,523,954,342 miles recorded by automobiles. This mileage does not include movement of thousands of vehicles passing through the state, much of it commercial, which does not replenish fuel needs and so is not included in Connecticut gasoline consumption statistics."

"Last year's Connecticut increase in automotive travel was nearly nine per cent or highest of

any New England state. The Connecticut Petroleum Industries Committee reports that average increase for six New England states was 7.5 per cent. Rhode Island ranked next to Connecticut with an increase of 8.7, Massachusetts 7.7, New Hampshire 7.3, Maine 4.9 and Vermont 4.1 per cent."

"Last year," states the Highway Safety Commission report, "was the first year that Connecticut's automotive travel passed the six billion mark. As early months of 1951 indicate continued gasoline consumption increase, the Safety Commission estimates the current year's travel will pass 6,500,000,000 miles. An important cause," concludes the bulletin, "is heavy volume of traffic using Connecticut as the main gateway to New England points. This angle is emphasized by volume recorded at parkway and bridge toll stations."
