Magazine Article Warns Of Dangers of Fluorosis

Head of School Board Outlines Its Problems

Rapid Expansion of the Town Makes Necessary Many Additional Class Rooms

"Rapid expansion of the town has an increase in the birth rate presents a real problem in Manchester school expansion plans," said Charles S. House, Chairman of the Board of Education, speaking before an open meeting of the League of Women Voters of Manchester held last evening at the Y. M. C. A. An analysis made in 1945 by experts, recommended the Board to build a new high school and a new high school by 1955. In 1948 another survey was made by the League of Women Voters of Manchester which showed the 1945 survey to be correct in its estimate. "At the present time," said Mr. House, "based on the 1948 census figures, we have a total enrollment in the public schools of Manchester of 4,200 pupils. Based on these actual figures, the school census by 1955 will have an enrollment of 6,110 and by 1960 the figures will have climbed to 9,200. This means that in the elementary schools 33 additional class rooms will be required to care for the pupils."

Necessary Additions

As the plans for the development of Manchester schools now stand the following additions will be necessary: an 18 room school at the Green with the necessary facilities; a new school at Kenney street. The South school will add additional rooms; the total to six rooms with a kindergarten and a wing of eight rooms to be added to the Hovey school. It is proposed that these additions to the elementary schools be planned and put into construction at approximately the same time. When this has been accomplished that is when the plans are approved the attention of the Board of Education will be turned to concrete plans for the high school.

Plans Not Completed

"It should not be construed that no thought has been given to the need of a new high school," Mr.

"In our present situation, whatever is attempted on behalf of peace, must fall short, because of a lack of supporting military strength."

"We are trying to enforce a global doctrine of opposition to Communism with a military establishment which is sorely strained by the demands of only one theater."

"Many of the issues and choices raised by the controversy would solve themselves if more of America's strength were mobilized. That is, we have mobilized few if any of the issues which have been raised can really be solved."

"There is strength in unity. But there is also unity in strength. If we can ally as well as with the country, what first grew stronger initially, before we can have a unified foreign policy."

Mother's Day observances were held in almost every department of the South Methodist church, Sunday. Aldrich, which he suggested should be read by every person in America today. It points out how mothers, however humble, could give to their children those qualities of a worth-while faith in God. And their children in turn honor their mothers best when they live up to the courage and dreams and ideals of their mothers; for it is well known that those who would have great mothers must be great children.

"I am glad that we have Mother's Day each year," stated the minister. "I wish we had it more than just once a year. I say this because I know beyond a shadow of a doubt that if we remembered our mothers more and the ideals which made them great, we would be better children, and this would be a better world."

The music for the service was under the direction of Herbert A. Wright, Sherwood Trenchard, president of the Woman's Society of Christian Service, as a token of appreciation and esteem for all the mothers of the church. Herbert J. McKinnis made the presentation to Mrs. Wilson.

In keeping with the occasion, Mrs. Fred R. Edgar delivered a Mother's Day sermon on the theme, "Remember Mother."

Based on a scripture lesson taken from John's Gospel relating the place the mother of Jesus played in sharing his joys and sorrows in his earthly life.

In the message the minister pointed out that the observance of Mother's Day was a very fine thing indeed, for all the times of the year it affords an opportunity to remember those great qualities which made our mothers great. And somehow men today have within them the feeling that in those qualities which made great mothers, there are also found qualities for living at its best which could well be copied by all.

It was suggested that at this special Mother's Day service, the year it is good to remember mother as the symbol of sacrificial love and care. It was pointed out that the word, "mother" in some of the older languages of the world is translated "marry" and this is entirely fitting, for no other work in all the world demands the loving care and sacrifice that motherhood does. Stories from the Bible and from contemporary living were used to illustrate the price mothers pay for the work they do.

The congregation was urged to remember mother, also, as a symbol of purity. "All of us are aware of the tremendous power of the influence of a mother's love to keep boys and girls on the straight and narrow path. All of us know how easy it would have been to have gone the wrong road had it not been that we just could not bring ourselves to the places where we could let our mothers down."

From earliest childhood they have been for us symbols of purity and somehow we can never forget it. The restraining hand of a mother's love can reach out across the years or across the miles to prevent, or to correct, some stupid thing that we might regret the rest of our lives. "Because this is so, it is our prayer that the influence of our mothers' love will follow you to the ends of the earth to help each of you be what your beloved mother was and to live up to what she wanted you to be," stated the minister.

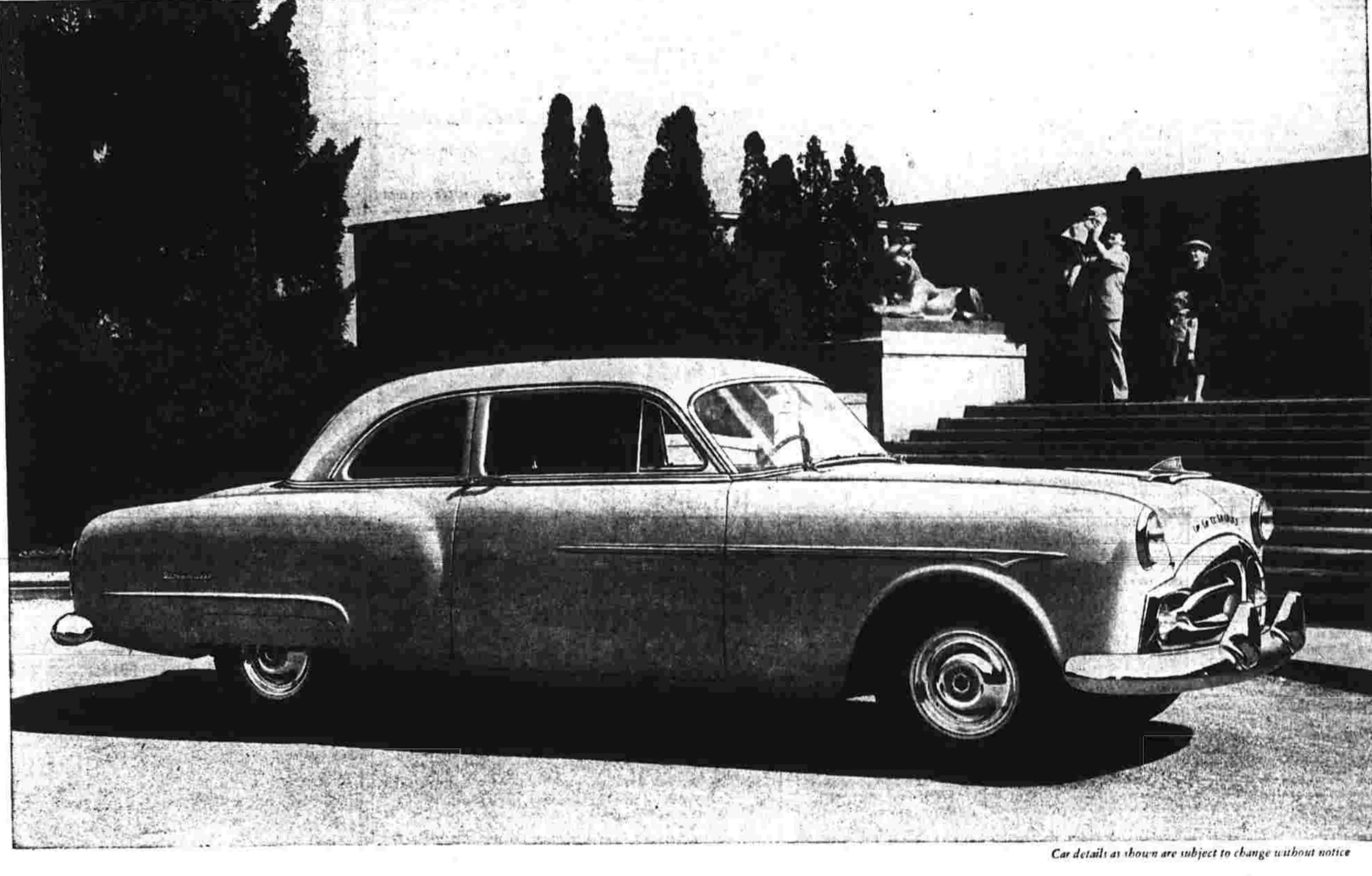

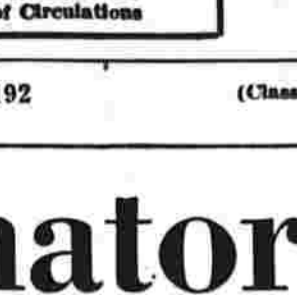

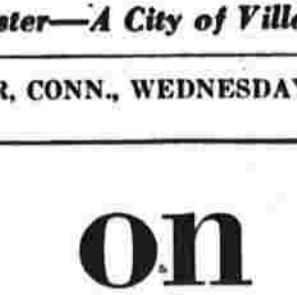
