UN Votes China Arms Ban

47 Assembly Nations for Proposition

New York, May 18.—(AP)—The United Nations assembly today voted an arms embargo against Communist China in an effort to cut off strategic materials reaching the Reds from the free world.

The vote was 47 to 0. The Soviet bloc abstained. Nations abstaining were Afghanistan, Burma, Egypt, India, Indonesia, Pakistan, Sweden and Syria.

Fears New Hurdle

India's Sir Bheengar N. Rau expressed fear the embargo would create another "psychological hurdle" in the path of a peaceful settlement of the Korean question. He urged the assembly to make a new peace gesture toward the Peking regime by issuing a formal statement that U. S. troops would not again advance north of the 38th parallel.

Most countries outside the Communist sphere already have halted shipments to the Peking regime, but sponsors of the embargo measure hoped it would plug loopholes and shut off shipments entirely. It was also intended as another moral judgment against the Chinese Reds.

Russia's Jacob A. Malik and representatives here of the four satellite countries contested the legality of the Assembly's action. This clearly indicated they would refuse to comply. This had been expected.

Significant Vote

The decision is significant for two reasons. It represents the first time the U. N. has attempted to apply economic sanctions as a step to stop aggression; it may force more severe measures such as naval blockade.

The heart of the resolution is a paragraph calling upon U. N. members and non-members to embargo goods from the Hartford area.
