**Pay Increase At Aircraft**

**Third Cost-of-Living Adjustment for United Aircraft's Employees**

A recent one hour cost-of-living increase adjustment for all hourly employees and for salaried employees classified under an equivalent system will be paid by United Aircraft Corporation, 11 Main Street, Hartford, president of the company, said today.

The cost-of-living adjustment, based on quarterly changes in the Consumers Price Index, is the third increase to be paid to United Aircraft employees since the plan went into effect. The average increase now totals 11 cents an hour above each employee's base pay.

Previous quarterly increases were 2 cents and 5 cents an hour.

The latest cost pay adjustment will be paid from June 1 to the salary of employees and from June 4 for hourly-rated employees. Employees at Pratt and Whitney Aircraft plants at East Hartford and Southington, Connecticut; at Hamilton Standard at East Hartford; Sikorsky Aircraft at Bridgeport, Connecticut; Chase Vought Aircraft at East Hartford; and United Aircraft headquarters at East Hartford will receive the increase.

The cost-of-living adjustments are added to employees' straight time hourly earnings and are also included in computing overtime pay, vacation pay allowances and holiday pay.

The Consumers Price Index, on which the adjustment is based, are published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the U. S. Department of Labor.

The approved adjustments will continue in effect, but approval for further quarterly adjustments does not extend beyond June 30, because the Wage Stabilization Board authority at present does not extend beyond that date.

**Boy Is Killed By Truck Here**

**Two Others Seriously Injured in Series of Other Accidents**
