



Denies Red Influence in China Policy

Allies Hit Red Main Defense

Where Allies Still Move Ahead

Move Slowly In Offensive On 'Triangle'

Tokyo, June 4-(AP)-Allied troops fighting through driving rain toward the main Communist redoubt in North Korea beat off savage Red counterattacks today. 
