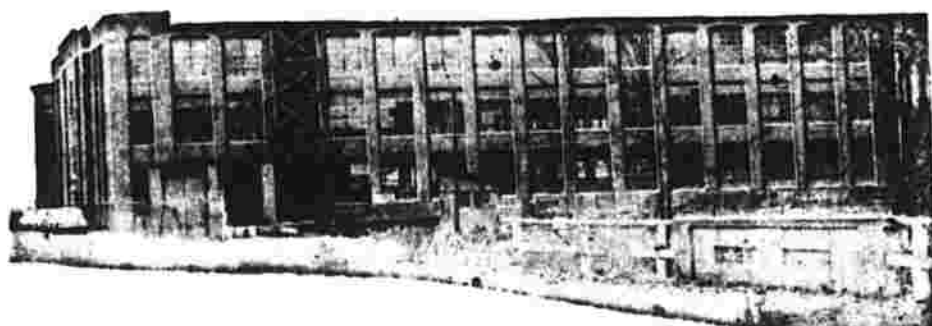

#### Drop of 20.4 Per Cent Is Reported Today at Local Bureau

### May's Police Records Filed

#### Six More Accidents Reported Than In April; Other Statistics

Although there were six more accidents in May than in April, there were seven less arrests for motor vehicle violations, according to the monthly report of Chief of Police Herman O. Schendel.

May accidents totaled 36, an increase of 30 per cent over the 27 accidents reported in April, but motor vehicle violations dropped from 51 to 44. Parking violations topped the list with 10 arrests, while

rules of the road, stop sign and defective equipment violations were next with four arrests each. Parking violations that didn't reach the court stage totaled 571 last month, a drop from the 603 filed for April. One hundred three complaints were received.

Intoxication, as usual, was the most common offense with 19 such arrests recorded out of the total of 34. Other arrests were breach of the peace, 5; assault-battery and unlawful dog, 2 each; and one arrest each for non-support, damage to public property, violation of probation, embezzlement, fraud and resisting arrest.

Police found 102 windows open and 67 street lights burned out. Buildings found open and secured totaled 80, and 18 fires were noted. Three lost children were returned to parents.

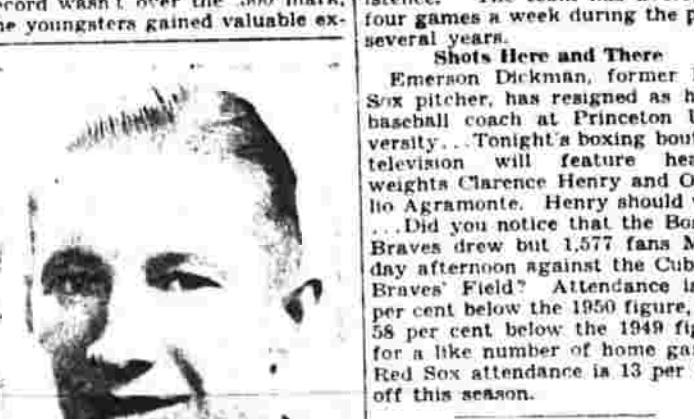

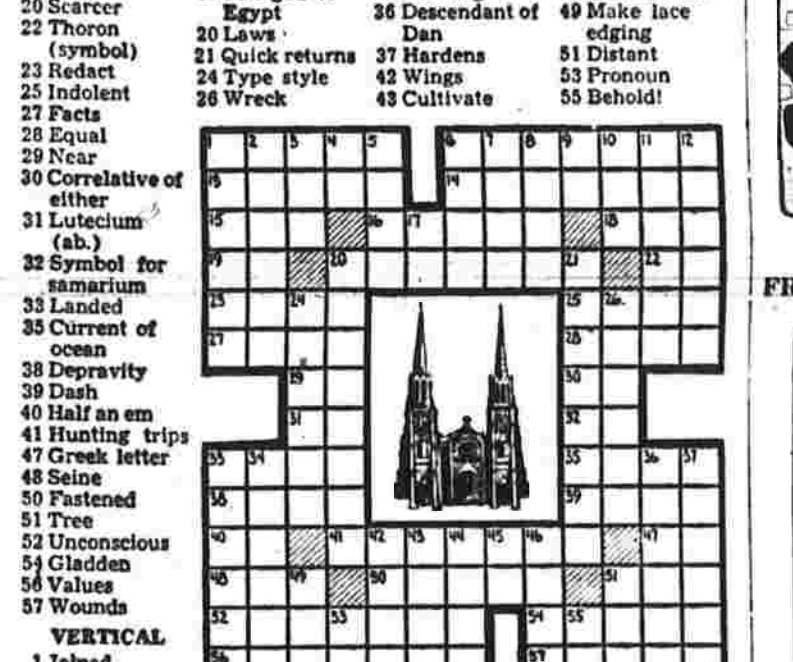
