afternoon its deadline for a walk-out of 35,000 employees of the telegraph monopoly.

The company and union are at odds over a clause in their three-year contract providing for negotiations of wage increases in the event of war or attack by an enemy. The union contends the Korean conflict has thrust the nation at least into a limited war and holds that the contract clause may be invoked.

The company says the language of the clause would preclude rates at the time but volunteered to grant a 10 per cent wage increase across the board if a rate had been stipulated by the Federal Communications Commission.

The Commission, however, said talks would continue between the parties all week and expressed some hope the deadlock would be broken before the 6 a. m. test hour of striking next Monday.

Los Angeles, June 26. Federal regulations passed today for quick settlement of the one-day strike of 35,000 Western Union employees of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Co.

Meanwhile the call of threatened to spread to the South.

Representatives for the Federal Communications Workers of America said that "strike strikes" yesterday in St. Helena and Oakland, they were in protest against delays in getting a new contract. Several agents and agents walked off the job in Berkeley.

PT and T officials said they had no reports of interruptions in service in southern California, where 8,000 of the strikers are represented, the other 1,200 in the accounting department.

Striking employees represent about 35 per cent of the company's 20,000 employees in the area.

The chairman of CWA's negotiating committee, Harold Longacre, said he would not consider the company's communications at once until the strike continues for several weeks. Picketing, he said, is under way at PT and T installations from Virginia to San Diego, a distance of about 2,000 miles.

The workers pay scale ranges from \$26 to \$82 weekly. The company asked a 10 per cent wage increase by the union last month. It also requested a change in job classifications, a new strike clause and retroactive status attempts to settle the strike.

rolling hills. Fire bombing planes swooped in close to the lines and blasted Chinese attackers.

For the 13th consecutive day, N. Koreans bombarded Washington, east coast port and transport center.

Reds mustered a force strong enough for a major attack north of the line on the east-central front.

The Reds also smashed into Alford in the central front. Doughboys' artillery barrage after a bitter seven-hour battle through the early morning hours.

Peking Radio had barely finished a long broadcast saying the Chinese people were behind the cease-fire move advanced by Russia's U. N. delegate Jacob Malik when Communists slammed anew.

And as fighting sharpened in Korea, general headquarters in Washington officials looked with suspicion on Malik's proposal.

"Responsible officials in Washington were fearful that the cease-fire part of Malik's proposal might have a cover for military advantage," the memorandum said.

"There is always the danger of a counter-attack and a breaking of an armistice," the memorandum noted.

The idea of a demilitarized zone is not rejected as such and it is recognized that this part of Malik's proposal has some validity, but not necessarily a withdrawal from paragraph 2.

Simultaneously the South Korean cabinet announced "any so-called peace plan which involves the division of the nation along any artificial boundary is entirely unacceptable to the people of Korea, North and South."

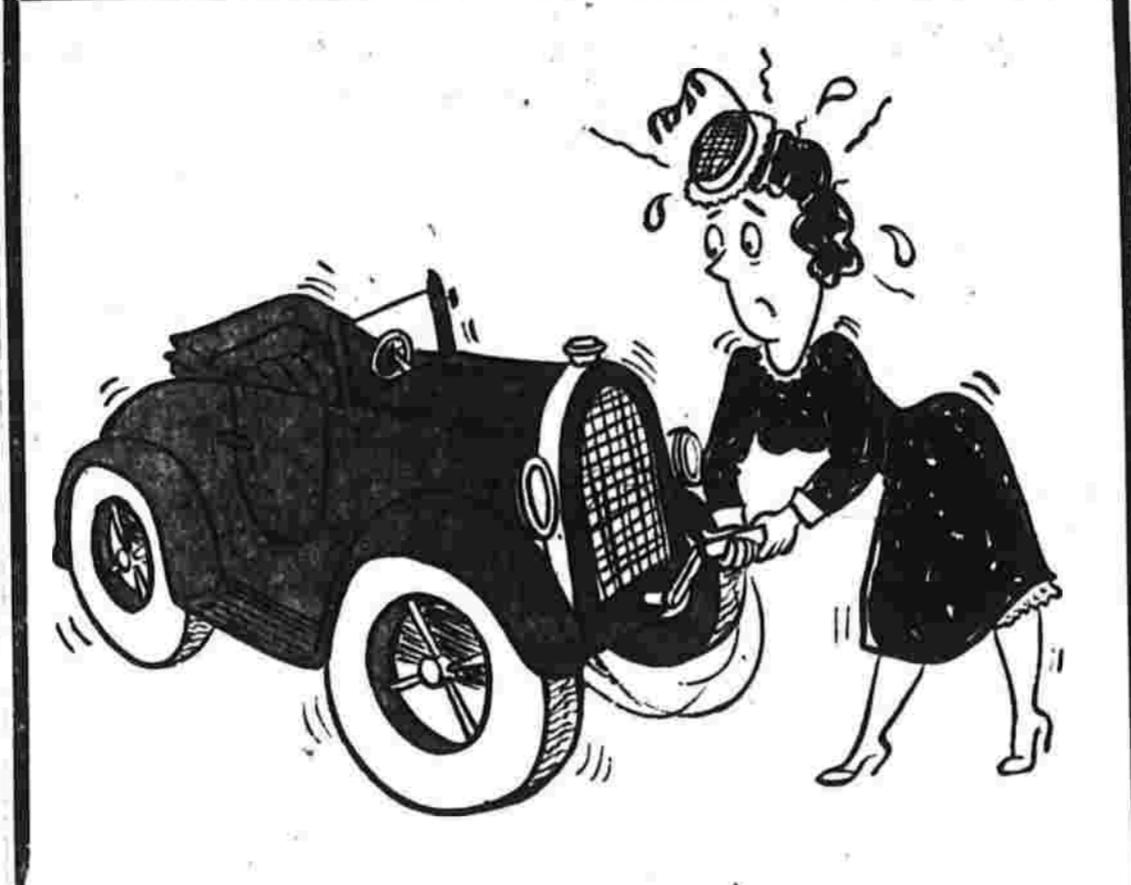

Connecticut Yankee

As a whole, the traditional pressure groups of Connecticut, both the good and the bad, the semi-worthwhile and the undesired, fared poorly in the 1951 General Assembly. Almost from the start of the session there was something in the mood on Capitol Hill which said that this would be no field day for them. They themselves came up to the Hill in a relatively restrained and chastened mood, as if they were laid out by the fact that this would be no easy session for them. The state's traditional pressure groups, both the good and the bad, the semi-worthwhile and the undesired, fared poorly in the 1951 General Assembly. Almost from the start of the session there was something in the mood on Capitol Hill which said that this would be no field day for them.

Other well-labeled pressure groups. One of these was the perennial lobby for the passage of a real estate licensing bill. The proponents of this bill reached the peak of their power and influence two years ago, when they even won a final vote in the House, and lost only in that body's last minute session of independence. This year, the debate was perfunctory. Not even the bill's traditional supporters seemed to fight too hard. An explanation offered was that the lobby's funds were not from the usual sources, which had dried up, and the bill's supporters were not too sure of their own strength. The bill was defeated in the House.

Why Peace Is Urgent
 There are two reasons why peace in Korea is urgent—even more urgent than in any other area of the world. The first is the element of saving the lives of the human beings involved in the campaigning there. The second reason is that the division of Korea was brought to an honorable halt. The other concern is that the consequences would be if the Korean fighting is allowed to drag on. The positive hope from a cease-fire in Korea is something really tremendous. It is the hope that by giving itself to meet and resist aggression in Korea, the United Nations will have established a precedent which will rule the world's future life. The hope is that the stringing action in Korea and the United Nations action in Korea has not only stopped aggression, but discouraged it. It is the hope that the system of collective security, the system of world law enforcement first demonstrated in Korea, will sooner or later have to demonstrate itself again before it became fully accepted as the basis of a new world order. We don't know of any system of law which has been able to escape the problem of violations. But, if the Korean police action can be brought to a successful and eloquent conclusion, there will, we think, be some reason to hope that future tests and violations will not be the work of any great, responsible power. We think the Korean action has been carried out in a way that is deeply understood in capitals all over the world. The first is that it is, instead, the world's first example of collective security tried to with a world law against aggression. And we think that if the United Nations can complete this, its first law enforcement action, objectively, fully, there will never be any question about its course in future instances of aggression. And if the United Nations policy becomes such a certainty, there is a real chance that no responsible power will ever undertake to challenge it.

Dying For Their Politics
 The Communists after the light-tough beginning in China, have progressed into the inevitable stage of any totalitarian regime. They are beginning to resort to the use of force. This, apparently, is not shocking to old China, but it is to the Chinese themselves. Both remember the indiscriminate slaughter which featured the last days of the Chiang Kaishek's control. What they are beginning to realize is that the Communists use force in a procedure which is designed to win the approval of the public. Their trials are huge mass meetings in which they have been accused of crimes. They have given an atmosphere of popular indignation. Their executions are pathetic fests. They boast about them, and they themselves publish the news of them, which is how the outside world knows of them. The Korean action is a precedent which will rule the world's future life. 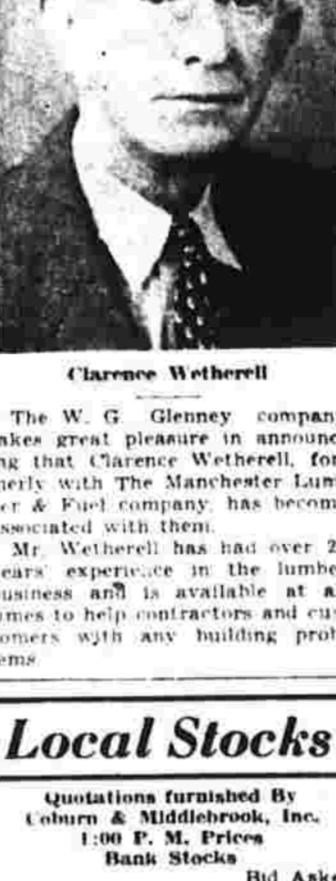

G. I. Education Coming to End

Major Part of Schooling Provision Terminates Next July 25
 On July 25th the Veterans Administration will ring down the curtain on the major portion of the G. I. training and education program. To date, 7,400,000 veterans have received educational benefits under this program; a large number, 7,200,000 have never availed themselves of their rights. The July date applies to veterans discharged before July 25, 1947. Veterans discharged after July 25, 1947 have four years from their discharge date in which to begin training or education. A veteran actually must be in training by July 25, 1951 in order to continue after the cutoff date. The Veterans Administration will consider a veteran in training even though he has temporarily interrupted for reasons beyond his control, such as summer vacation. A veteran who has started training and has not earned a degree, because he has returned to active duty is considered to be interrupted for reasons beyond his control. Veterans need not attend summer school—summer sessions will be considered an interruption. The Manchester Veterans Service Center has application forms for education and on the Job Training. Any veteran who would like to better himself should take advantage of the G. I. Bill.
