Blimp Takes Mercy Flight

Critically Sailor from Carrier To Naval Hospital Aboard U. S. S. Palau off Caro-

lina Capes, June 26-Delayed-(P) -A Navy blimp made a dramatic race with death this afternoon carrying a critically ill sailor from this escort carrier to the Naval hospital in Norfolk. The seaman, Raymer Exton Stormes, 21, of Norwood, O., was

struck down by a heart attack early in the afternoon. It took just 47 minutes for the silver, eigar-shaped blimp to drop down on this ship, take the sick man aboard and clear the Palau's deck on its mission of mercy.

(At the Naval hospital, doctors said Stormes was suffering from said his condition was fair.)

The blimp, with two others, had been engaged in landing exercises on the carrier. All three blimps elevator used for planes took him Maurice A. Doubleday, son of Mr. Greenwood of Campmeeting road.
