Heard Along Main Street

And on Some of Manchester's Side Streets, Too

Not all the youthful reckless drivers in Manchester have been arrested and found guilty of speeding, reckless driving or violations of the rules of the road.

This reporter happened to see a near-accident shortly after noon yesterday at the corner of Center and Linden streets. A young fellow, with a young girl sitting on his right, came speeding up Center street and suddenly decided to turn into Linden street. He did, and how! On two wheels! The young irresponsible driver was traveling at such a fast rate of speed that he was unable to control his car and it was necessary to brush the curbing on the east side of Linden street, in the wrong lane.

Fortunately, a woman driver, coming north on Linden street at a slow rate of speed, happened to stop her car. If she didn't stop, there is no telling how serious the mishap might have been. The young daredevil at the wheel just missed hitting the woman's car by a whisker.

Manchester police cannot get too stiff in cracking down on speeders and "hot-rod" specialists within the town limits.

A pocket size directory of streets and information of Manchester has been circulated in town. It is so poorly edited that you might call it an "abridged edition." What information you might want to know about the town that ISN'T in the booklet would fill another edition twice its size. Thirty-two pages, plus the cover, comprise this tiny pamphlet.

Once again it seems local merchants and advertisers have been roped for a bundle of dough. Advertising rates went up as high as \$75. How about the guaranteed circulation? The publishers guaranteed 6,000, but here's how that works, according to a couple of the advertisers we asked. Each advertiser was given a stack of booklets to distribute himself. One advertiser bought a \$14.50 ad and was given no less than 20 booklets to distribute. They are piled neatly on a back shelf.

Did you ever hear of the Audit Bureau of Circulation? Take a look in the upper left hand corner of today's Herald and you will see the ABC listing in the average daily net circulation figure. This is a national association of advertising agencies, radio, magazine and newspaper publishers, whose one interest is to get accurate figures on circulation. It costs The Herald in the neighborhood of \$500 a year to belong to this association that makes periodical checks every six months to obtain these accurate figures. That will explain a little about how much a guarantee on circulation this publication can guarantee. Just pick through the booklet

at random and notice the omissions and mistakes. It lists Raymond W. Goslee as chairman of the Zoning Board of Appeals. He is a member of that town board but William Stuek is chairman.

According to the booklet, we have only one Fire Department in town whose headquarters is at Spruce street. There is a list of fire alarm box numbers with a heading of "Manchester Fire Alarm System." All box alarm locations are for the South Manchester Fire District. Apparently they didn't know about the Manchester Fire Department that covers the area north of Middle Turnpike.

Churches. We have 11, says the booklet. Glancing through the list you will find the biggest parish in town is missing, St. James's church. Also numbered among the missing are the Salvation Army, North Methodist church, Gospel hall and Covenant Congregational church.

The list of town officials is concise to say the least. There are numerous offices of importance, such as Probate Judge, Controller, Building Inspector and Town Planning commission not even mentioned.

We have a Silver Lane school in our School Department and that, too, isn't mentioned.

An error of omission is noted in the fire alarm box system as listed. And, don't forget, you won't even find the north end box alarm numbers listed.

Baseball fans will find one thing in the booklet they might like. It is the home game schedule of both Boston teams.

The booklet is inaccurate in many instances. Local merchants paid "on delivery" for them and meet the guaranteed circulation by their own distribution to customers.
