





The arrival of natural gas in our communities will give us a direct connection with one of the largest fuel supplies in the country. All the jobs that gas is doing in your home of cooking, refrigeration, water heating, house heating, clothes drying and incineration, as wll as in our commercial and industrial establishments, will be done as well or better with this new fuel ... and at less cost too. This new gas will offer you all the comfort, convenience and cleanliness of the most modern fuel.

#### Le When Will Natural Gas Arrive in Greater Hartford?

The Hartford Gas Company is anxious to get natural gas here just as quickly as possible. We are contracting with the pipe line company approved by the Federal Power Commission to serve this area and our engineers are working closely with the pipe line company's engineering firm in planning the lateral pipe lines which will bring natural gas into our plant,

Our construction crews have been working for months to prepare our system for the new fuel and the necessary pipe and equipment are ordered and will be installed as rapidly as delivery to us permits. The use of natural gas by our company will require an additional investment in plant and equipment of about \$1,000,000.

We are hoping that natural gas will reach our plant by mid 1952.

#### Le Who Will Supply Natural Gas to Our Area?


The Hartford Gas Company will be supplied natural gas by the Algonquin Gas Transmission Company whose gas supply comes from the Texas Eastern Transmission Company, owners of the Big and Little Inch pipe lines and operators of one of the world's largest underground gas storage fields. The completed Algonquin main pipe line of 26 inch and 24 inch diameter steel pipe will be about 250 miles long and with additional lateral lines totaling 260 miles will cost about thirty million dollare

#### Jo How is Natural Gas Being Brought Here?

The Algonquin natural gas pipe line will start at Lambertville, New Jersey (near Trenton) and will proceed across New Jersey, through part of New York state, entering Connecticut near Danbury (as indicated on the map). It will cut diagonally across the state below Rocky Hill with a branch pipe line extended northward to our plant. The main pipe line will continue on through Rhode Island into Massachusetts to serve Providence, Boston and many cities and towns enroute.

#### 42. How Does Greater Hartford Propose to Use Natural Gas?

The Hartford Gas Company plans to supply a mixed manufactured and natural gas of 800 heat units per cubic foot-about 50% greater than at present. This mixture is the same as is being used in other large cities. Distributing a mixed gas allows us to utilize our extensive gas manufacturing facilities as insurance of continuous service to our customers.

#### How Will Conversion of Customers' Appliances Jo Be Accomplished and Who Will Pay For It?

Changing customers' appliances to use the new gas will require two or three visits to our customers' homes during the changeover. The cost, about \$1,250,000, will be financed by the company. The changeover is being planned with a minimum of discomfort to our customers. We'll do our very best to avoid any undue inconvenience.

#### **O**e Who Will Do the Actual Conversion Work?

We have engaged the John B. Shriver Company, nationally known conversion organization, to do the appliance conversion work. A force of about 225 trained experienced men will make the changeover. At present our engineers and the utilization engineers of the Shriver Company are studying plans for the best conversion methods which will least inconvenience our customers.

#### . Will the "New Gas" Be Cheaper?

We anticipate lower costs, although the exact amount of reduction will not be definitely known until costs effective at the time of changeover are determined.

As you know, your Gas Company, like all other business, is faced with steadily rising costs and our use of natural gas will help to offset these increases.

We hope to make an initial rate reduction when natural gas arrives and plan to make further rate reductions as conditions permit.

#### O. Will Our Customers Be Kept Informed?

Every effort will be made to let our coustomers and the general public know how the conversion to the new gas will be handled and when it will take place. Advance notices in the newspapers, booklets with the bills and special announcements will keep our customers fully informed.
