Faith's Nature Sermon Topic

In "Very Keystone That Holds Life Together," Says Reverend Edgar

Rev. Fred R. Edgar preached a sermon yesterday at the South Methodist Church on the theme, "According to Your Faith," based on the concluding verses of Matthew 9:18-21. The sermon was in keeping with the reception of a large group of new members into the church.

Mr. Edgar began his sermon by pointing out that all those present had just witnessed a great transaction which had taken place between mortal man and Almighty God when such a group of men and women stood up to confess their faith in Jesus Christ, and to be counted for the cause of righteousness. He said there was no way of estimating all the good taken place in such a transaction which means men's forgiveness, confessions of faith in Christ, and made and promises to serve God and to keep His commandments for the rest of their lives had been made.

"If we believe the Bible, if we believe that Jesus Christ was the son of God who came to earth to seek and to save that which was lost, if we believe that the mission of the church is to bring men to God, and to help them walk in that way, then we must believe that the transaction we have just witnessed was a divine significance," declared the minister.

The Scripture lesson, which described the healing of a blind man by Jesus, was used to explain what takes place when men enter into such a divine partnership with God. The minister pointed out that men, who are healed and made whole when they recognize their need, realize that help is of God and not upon the faith that they have.

The man who buys his way into the Kingdom of God, nor earn it, nor steal it, nor inherit it, but it is given to him. It is all a matter of faith which is the very keynote that holds life together in a meaningful way. Faith is the eyes by which men see God, and the hand by which they cling to Him. Faith is the receiving power by which men appropriate the gift which is the all-inclusive word of our relationship with God. It is the secret of the Christian's life. Without a vital, believing, active, redemptive faith, men cannot know the power to become the sons of God, which is the minister's message.

Sherwood Truesdell assisted the minister in the service. The choir, under the direction of Herbert A. France, minister of music, presented "The Lord's Prayer" by Ignatius Loyola and "The Lord's Prayer" by Martin Luther. Plevin Party Wins In French Election

of-center independent Republican-Deputies emerged as the most potent party, capturing 469 seats on departmental (county) councils. This represented a gain of 142 for the Rightists, at the expense of the Socialists and Communist.

The Communists, who campaigned on an anti-American anti-Atlantic pact platform, won only 78 seats, far fewer than they held previously. The right-wing DeGaullists, who also attacked the U. S., won 150 seats for a gain of 80.

The elections, held on two successive Sundays, were more than half the numbers of the departmental (county) councils. In America, they frame local budgets and levy local taxes. Local issues and personalities generally are at stake, but the Communist and DeGaullist injected international affairs this year.

Premier Plevin interpreted initial victories last week as a grassroots endorsement of his policies. Yesterday's run-offs gave the seats to those with the highest number of votes; the previous tally required a clear majority.

The local councils have a total of 2,945 members. The remainder fall vacant in 1954.

Returns are not yet in from Algonquin, where the Independent-Republican group is now in a position to "capture" the courthouse in many departments. With holdovers in districts where there was no voting, they now have 202 councilmen.

The only party coming close to the Radical-Socialists—another Rightist alliance. They held 701 seats.

general corruption of the Truman administration.

"We're going to go after them," he said. "No holds will be barred."

In turn, delegates told Gabrielson that the national platform should show interest in problems of the West and its growing number of voters.

On the sidelines, peace-loving scout Robert A. Taft openly bid for support in the 11 western states. California's privately sounded out their neighbors on the Golden State's Governor Earl Warren.

Gabrielson was optimistic about Republican chances. Asked at a news conference whether the party would carry the West—something it didn't do in 1948—he replied, "We're going to win everywhere."

Rep. Hugh Scott (R-Pa.), a former Republican national committee chairman, huddled with delegates in the interests of his drive to send Eisenhower to the White House.

He announced that a Washington State Eisenhower for President committee has been formed. Deaf Ingalls, a national Text leader, flew here in time for the regional party meeting, passed a "Taft for President" sticker on his hotel door and went to work. He has toured 40 states to take readings of Taft's chances as a candidate.

Ingalls told newsmen that things look good for Taft in the West but he declined to specify the states. He did say, however, that the reaction was unfavorable in Wyoming.
