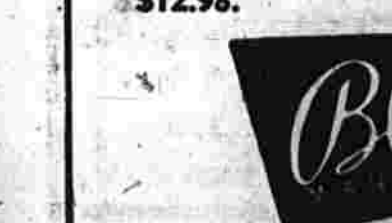

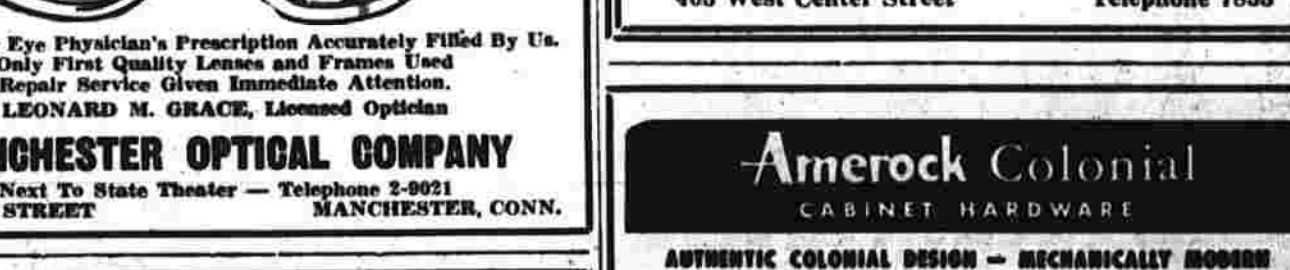

the campaign, that putting an end to the cold war with the Communists was the main purpose of the vote. This effort, and the modification of Socialist structures on business and industry, undoubtedly will engage his attention immediately.

He may then step out of office in favor of his closest associate, Anthony Eden, who is reported to be his former post of foreign Secretary. Rumors to that effect were current in London before the election.

Atlee now becomes the leader of the Labour party. He will be a position held by Churchill for the past six years.

Atlee is expected to offer his resignation soon—perhaps tonight. The cabinet is for the time being suspended on call on the king and rest on behalf of his government as soon as possible after it is certain he has been defeated.

While a new government will be formed, Atlee and his ministers will keep nominal control but will not make policy decisions without consulting Conservative leaders.

Churchill, as leader of the winning political party, will be summoned to the palace and told to form a new government.

All the political party leaders were elected, even though the party as a whole was defeated.

Atlee, Herbert Morrison, Aneurin Bevan, and a large group of earthy cabinet members will be formed. Atlee and his ministers will keep nominal control but will not make policy decisions without consulting Conservative leaders.

UN Rejects Red Plan To Pull Back on Lines: Munsan, Korea, Oct. 27—(AP)—The United Nations today made it "perfectly clear" to the Communists that their proposed Korean armistice buffer zone cannot be considered "any further."
