New UN Proposal Claims Tank Waits Red Answer

Munson, Korea, Nov. 5.—(P)—The United Nations today proposed by-passing the cease-fire buffer zone issue while negotiators go ahead with talks on other points that must be settled before the fighting can end.

Cairo, Nov. 5.—(P)—The leftist weekly Al-Ghazal said today a British tank with four men aboard "disappeared" yesterday in the troubled Suez Canal Zone.

San Francisco, Nov. 5.—(P)—The wonder drugs are losing their punch in aging pipe smokers, speculate on where their next step will be taken.

The proposal called for a four-point formal statement read by Maj. Gen. Henry H. Hodges in Manila today.

That both sides accept the principle that any cessation of hostilities will be based on the cessation of the military situation.

That a committee of three officers from each side determine the terms of a truce and advise the full delegations at any time.

That the subcommittee now meeting report their agreement to the full delegations from both sides "with the recommendation that the latter proceed with the discussion of other items on the agenda."

That the Allied proposal came as U.N. and tank-led Chinese forces clashed northwest of Seoul on Korea's southern coast.

A heavy Chinese assault there, U.S. Eighth Army said, heavy fighting continued in the area.

Allied warplanes knocked out a tank in the Red attack Monday and were out in force Monday in a mass search for some 13 other tanks.

The proposal suggested the full delegations meet in the afternoon today.

By The Associated Press Connecticut counted a shocking toll of 12 violent deaths today—eight on the highways and four as the result of the fire that snuffed out the lives of the infant children of a Somers family.

The tragic fire and six of the highway deaths, including two last Friday night, occurred during the violent storm which, in many parts of the state, turned from rain into sleet and snow.

The victims were: Frank, Verlin, Roger and Gerald Miller, ranging in age from two to four years, burned to death in a fire which broke out in their home at 8:31 p.m. when fire destroyed the one room home of their parents, Mr. and Mrs. M. J. Miller.

Peter R. McGinn, 33, of West Haven, killed in the same Friday night fire when he was riding in a taxicab on the highway near the intersection of Madison and Hill streets.

U. S. to Propose Arms Census to Paris Meet

Paris, Nov. 5.—(P)—The United States was reliably reported today to have decided to propose a world-wide arms census including a complete accounting of all atomic weapons.

The U.S. plan, which would be placed before the United Nations Assembly here this week, would require a strict system of verification for the atomic accounting.

This may prove to be the stumbling block which could hold up indefinitely any disclosure of the number of atomic bombs in the U.S. and Russia.

Informal quarters said the arms proposal was the heart of the proposed peace plan which President Truman will announce Wednesday night and which Secretary of State Dean Acheson will lay before the United Nations Assembly, perhaps on Thursday.

Inclusion of atomic weapons in the proposed arms census represents a drastic change in U.S. policy. The census question has not been discussed in the past, but was blocked by the Russians when the U.S. refused to include atomic weapons.

The new U.S. proposal would be valuable primarily for propaganda purposes, since it would force the Russians to disclose their own atomic stockpile and nullify any benefits they might expect to get from their own peace offensive.

Washington, Nov. 5.—(P)—The fifth atomic blast in the U.S. atomic energy program was exploded at 9:31 a. m. (p.s.t.) today.

The atomic blast was the first in a series of tests planned by the Atomic Energy Commission to demonstrate the peaceful uses of atomic energy.

Seven minutes after the detonation there was a portable rumble in Las Vegas, along with a dull thud of sound.

The cloud rose to the height of 300 feet and was visible for miles around. The cloud was bright, at least, as the bright one last Thursday, the first detonation in which troops participated in atomic maneuvers.

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Plan to Study Atomic Plant Labor Racket

Augusta, Ga., Nov. 5.—(P)—A Georgia Congressman's charges of labor racketeering at the billion dollar atomic energy project near here will be taken up today by a five-man House labor subcommittee.

The charges were issued by Rep. Wheeler (D., Ga.) after a one day investigation in which he said he learned overall and went job hunting in the area.

Wheeler said subsequently in a House speech that he heard "stories of hundreds of men were allowed to loaf" and that labor racketeers were fleecing the workers.
