"Yes If All Goes Well"
 After keeping his own political supporters on tenterhooks for most of his visit here, and observing what he obviously felt to be the proprieties of his situation, General Dwight Eisenhower finally relaxed enough to make it clear to those supporters that their activity is not being rebuffed by him.

In his final interview before flying back to his European command, General Eisenhower put in the slight touches which in the world of politics mean "yes if all goes well."

He pledged that he would talk forthrightly and definitely on political "if the time ever comes." That is what his voluntary supporters have been saying he would do.

He discussed the activities of those political supporters of his—the Senator Duff—and said that what they did was their business, thus implying that they were as far as he was concerned, free to continue their activities. He likewise threw in remarks to the effect that some people might, by long association with him, know his own reactions to certain events as well as he. This was even a stage of authorization for some of those who have been carrying the political ball for him.

He also mentioned the fact that he had originally accepted his European post from President Truman for a definite term.

All these touches add up, as we said, to a "yes if all goes well" so far as his supporters are concerned, this amounts to a promise that if their campaign for him goes well enough to create a situation in which a definite demand for his participation in politics has been shaped, then they will have his answer.

The answer, in such an atmosphere, could hardly be no.

That much is clear. It will now obviously be the effort of his supporters to convince him, as they journey to Europe to visit him, that the time in which they can carry the ball alone is necessarily limited, and that the time of which he speaks now—as the future time for a definite statement from him—is perhaps nearer than he thinks.

At day rate, Eisenhower, after having seemed to snub it for the greater portion of his visit, got back on the Eisenhower bandwagon just before he took his plane back to Europe and out of the hot spotlight.

New Truce Snag
 The truce talks in Korea, which had been going so well, have marred themselves up against a hidden log which was always there, but whose presence was apparently not realized until agreement on the cease fire line was almost complete.

What we suddenly realized was something the Communists probably had in mind all along—that once the two sides had agreed upon a cease fire line, they would be more or less obligated to observe that line, as a demonstration of their good faith, while further negotiations were in process.

When we realized this, we quickly made the proposal that the question of the cease fire line be passed, with final agreement on it not reached, while we got on to other questions on the truce talks agenda.

That reserved for us the right, if we did not like the way the talks on these other items were going, to resume activity in the field.

From the Communist point of view, our proposal carried the heaviest that, even during the negotiations, we might undertake to push them back far beyond the

 The business of estimating a winter in sometimes one of counter-balance conditions and it is so this year.

For weeks we have been noticing the caterpillars, and their verdict has been one of no winter at all. Yet some profound distrust of this prediction made us refrain from jumping out into a pool of slush. Our skepticism was so instinctively profound that we wondered whether the caterpillar had not changed his colors on shifting the sign of winter from the black to the brown, so that the prediction which seemed to show all mild really meant, this year, all severe.

At any rate, we put the year pillars in anyway, while we waited for additional signs.

This current November record-breaking chill was not in itself the sign, even though it speaks convincingly of a cold trend. But one of the things the combined rain and snow of the weekend did accomplish was an infallible sign.

It filled the ponds. The infallible sign here involved is that there can be no hard winter, no real freezing weather, until the ponds are full.

Last year, and the year before, the ponds were not really full until late in January, far too late for any real winter to close down its clamp on New England life.

The extent that the ponds are full now, in November, does not mean that the winter will necessarily be hard. But it does mean a hard winter to come if it wants to—where real cold was forbidden in the last two years. It can be a humdinger of an old-fashioned winter. If it wants to—and our hunch is that the caterpillars have gone color blind and that it wants to.

The great Berlioz "Requiem" will be presented by the South Methodist Church Choir under the direction of Herbert A. France, Minister of Music, on Sunday evening, Nov. 18 at 7:30.

For the occasion, the choir will be augmented by some 60 singers from Oratorio-Chorale, whose members have been rehearsing their work under Mr. France's direction for a performance in the Springfield Auditorium with the Springfield Symphony Orchestra.

The "Requiem" is written in 10 parts, each one of which is given special treatment by the conductor, who was an authority on vocal or in music. Great masses of tone are contrasted with finely drawn sections and the over-all effect of the work makes a lasting impression on every listener.

Only one soloist is required, a tenor. Harold Egan, one of the chorists of the South Methodist Choral Choir, will sing this role.

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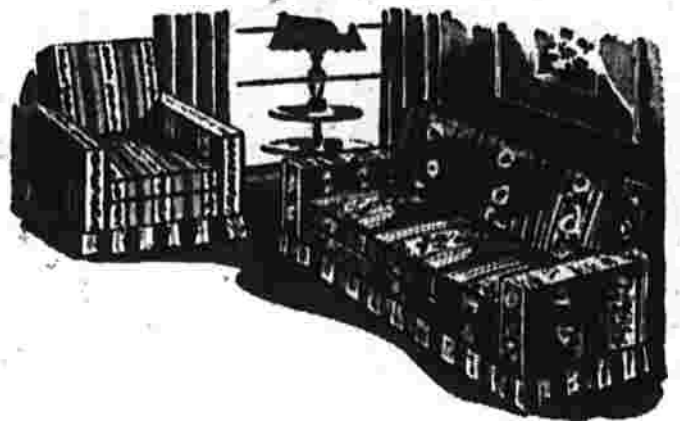
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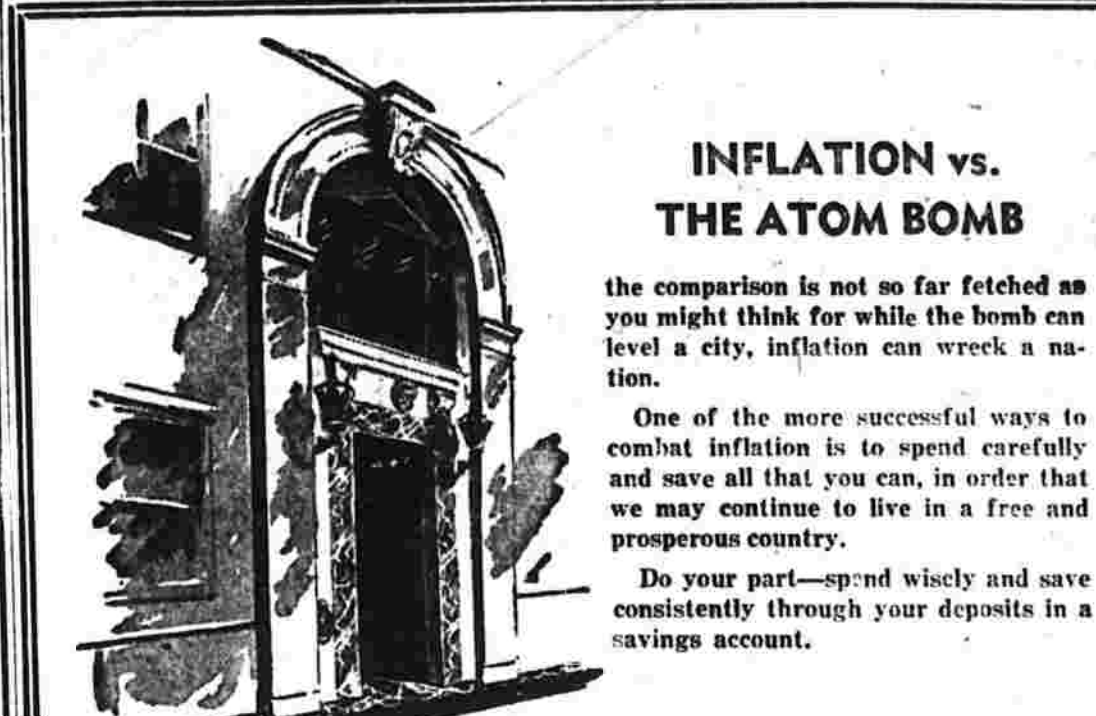

medicines that can be preserved so that victims of sickness or injury can be given any or all of the blood medicines they need. Prevents Clotting The machine takes out calcium to prevent clotting of the fresh blood. It removes and saves the platelets, the blood cells involved in forming blood clots, so that they can be used as a separate

medicines. It takes out red and white cells and packages them separately in plastic bags. Both have medical uses. It takes out other blood clotting substances, prothrombin and fibrinogen. In another step, the machine produces the S.P.P.S., using centrifuge, or whirler device. The machine also can make separate medicines out of outdated blood—whole blood which has been kept beyond the present safety limit of about three weeks. No bottle is used to collect the blood. Instead, it flows right into the machine.
