Dr. Higgins Dies at 84
Former Secretary of State Was Also Active in Coventry Affairs

Coventry, Nov. 18.—(Special)—Dr. William L. Higgins, 84, of Coventry, who was called the "father of the dirt roads improvement program" in Connecticut because he did so much to end the so-called "dirt roads" died at a Norwich hospital today following a long illness.

A native of Chesterfield, Mass., Dr. Higgins was born March 18, 1867, the son of the late Martin Luther and Elizabeth Susan Hayes Higgins. He received his early education at Chesterfield and Northampton, Mass., and at Deerfield, Mass., Academy. Most of his adult life he spent in Coventry, where he came to live in 1892, two years after his graduation from the Medical College of the University of the City of New York.

A lifelong Republican, he served Connecticut as secretary of state for two terms before being elected in 1923 to Congress, representing the second district, where he also served two terms. Always active in civic affairs, Dr. Higgins served Coventry as First Selectman for 16 years and was its medical examiner for 40 years retiring in 1948. He was also Tolland County Commissioner for 12 years and served six terms in the General Assembly.

Route 81, from Route 44 in North Coventry, is the home of Dr. Higgins. He was a member of the greater part of his practice as a physician at his home. Last year he observed the 60th anniversary of his becoming a doctor. He was coroner for Coventry and Andover for more than 50 years.

Dr. Higgins was a member and former trustee of the First Congregational Church, of the First World War, he was a member of the American Legion, former president of the Connecticut State Medical Society, the youngest man to ever hold that office, a member of the Sons of the American Revolution, a 32nd Degree Mason, a member of Merit Lodge, A.F. and A.M. of Merit, a member of the Knights Templars, Sphinx Temple, Elks Lodge, F. Williams and the Manchester Road and Gun Club. He served as chairman of the board for the Coventry 20th anniversary celebration in 1912. In 1948 he noted his 50th anniversary as a member of the national Glee. He also was stockholder, director, and officer of numerous corporations before his retirement.

He leaves his wife, Mrs. Lillian M. Higgins, two daughters, Mrs. William A. T. Casaday of Fulton, Mass., N. Y., and Mrs. LeRoy C. Brown of Maple Hill, Newington; five grandsons, one great-grandson; one great-granddaughter; two sisters, Mrs. George Blanchard of Montpelier, Vt., and Mrs. Milo Sylvester of East Longmeadow, Mass., and several nieces and nephews.

The funeral will be held Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the First Congregational Church in South Coventry, with the Rev. Russell Potter, pastor of the church, officiating. Burial will be in the cemetery of the church. Friends are invited to attend.

Fails to Hide Accident Guilt
Hartford Man Reports Car Stolen to Cover Hacknack Crash

Even C. Lamont of 48 Hopkins street, Hartford, tried unsuccessfully to cover up an accident in which he was involved Friday night and was fined \$100 in addition to a 30 days suspended jail sentence for evading responsibility.

Judge John S. G. Rollins imposed the penalty in Town Court this morning. Lamont was the operator of a car in a hit-and-run accident on Hacknack street Friday night. His 1948 coupe was found parked on Olcott street Sunday morning by Patrolman Alvin Boldt. The car was reported stolen by Hartford police on Saturday.

Lamont pleaded guilty to the charge in court and had nothing to say following the prosecutor's statements. Police said Lamont came to police headquarters yesterday to recover his car. An investigation revealed that his was the car involved in the accident on Friday night. Lamont was under questioning for nearly three hours before admitting he had tried to cover up the accident by leaving the car on Olcott street and reporting it stolen.

Pulitzer Winner Quits Over Taft
Boston, Nov. 18.—(Special)—John H. Crider, Pulitzer prize editor, resigned as editor of the Boston Herald last night in a dispute over the race course for ending to the lives and fortunes of people to be disturbed with "Foreign Policy for Americans."

It was against this background that State Department press officer Lincoln Steffens said yesterday American officials are convinced Russia's new charges about western military development of Trieste was an effort to revive an old issue as a diversion. Crider had said he had resigned resignation to Chote's home.

Crider, conceding he favors Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower for President, said he wrote "what I thought was a fair review of Taft's book with a comment or two of my own thoughts about the man."

Crider completed five years as editor of the Herald last Friday. Before that he was with the Boston Herald for the last 10 of those years in Washington. In 1949 Crider shared the Pulitzer prize for editorial writing with Herbert Elliston of the Washington (D.C.) Post.

The death of John Griffin, 27, of 14 Drive B, Silver Lane homes, Saturday afternoon at 4:15 from injuries received in a fight at the Haytort in South Coventry late Friday night has resulted in a manslaughter charge being placed against a Coventry man, State Police have reported.

Lt. O. H. Avery of the State Police Stafford Springs Barracks said that Kenneth Wright, 25, of 20 Daly road, Coventry, who was originally arrested on a charge of breach of the peace and assault following the fight, was charged on a manslaughter charge when charged with the death of Griffin.

Patrolman Walter Biegel, who re-arrested Wright, and William Stephenson were later also assigned to the case. Coroner Bernard J. Ackerman of Rockville will begin an inquest into the death of Griffin when the State Police have completed their investigation.

According to Dr. John Prippano, assistant medical examiner for Manchester, Griffin, who apparently struck the back of his head after being knocked down by Wright, suffered a fractured skull and brain lacerations and hemorrhages.

According to witnesses, Griffin was attending a party at the Coventry night club with fellow workers from Pioneer Parachute, when Wright, who was not a member of the group, approached Griffin, argued with him briefly and then struck him, knocking the local man unconscious. Griffin was taken to Manchester Memorial Hospital by a friend but never regained consciousness.

ment's foreign information program was that Russia, last year, gave us a terrible licking on the important cultural propaganda front. In order to have their Russian athletes, scientists, writers, artists, musicians and ballet dancers outside their own borders in order to have their spread the idea that Russian culture is a wonderful thing, "superior to the American," they have been represented but were not, whereupon the Russians told the Italians we were too busy preparing for war to have any time for cultural things. Some of the Russian artists were some of the best in Italy that various committees invited them to prolong their stay. There was some question whether Russia would allow them to stay outside the "Curtain" for so long a period. But Russia did give permission, and then the Italian government solved the problem by refusing to extend their visas, so they had to go back to Russia after all.

Descriptions of events in Italy at that time indicated that Russia was very careful its cultural ambassadors didn't really see too much of the outside world. They were, for the most part, kept carefully segregated from the world in which they were performing. The western world was supposed to admire their talent, which was often first rank, but they were not supposed to see much of the western world.

It can be assumed, as well, that those Russian artists who are allowed to travel outside Russia are selected with the greatest care for their ability to represent the Soviet Union to the outside world. They are, in fact, the most carefully selected and trained of the Russian system.

Still, we were a little surprised to read that 30,000 figure, it means that, however narrow the purpose of the Russian state, Russia is beginning to play a part in the life of the outside world. It shows how foolish, too, are the protests of those pinch-penny Americans who have recently been having a few American cultural representatives go abroad at government expense with no more than a few dollars to their name, representing and talking about and exemplifying American culture and beliefs.

The fact that, when he comes to Washington in January, Prime Minister Churchill will be bringing British atomic secrets with him speaks eloquently of the fact that leaves the future still mysterious.

There came a time, as he has also not forgotten, when the United States, having produced the atomic bomb in American plants with Canadian materials in process perfected by the genius of American, British, Italian and Danish scientists, declared the bomb and its secrets an American monopoly, throwing Britain out of the project in which she had originally been an equal partner.

Some of Mr. Churchill's most savage political criticism of his political opposition in Britain was that in which he took the Labor Government to task for submitting to such inglorious treatment. It may be a limited partner in our atomic program. It may be a rival for some of the product of the new industry British genius is producing. It may be, as we are simply a request that we make available for whatever atomic things Britain is producing or is about to produce, as a result of the program it started for itself after we decreed an end of the partnership agreement we had negotiated with Churchill.

But whatever he seeks for the future, Mr. Churchill remembers, that once he and we sat down as equals at the table where the turkey was novel and atomic and that, as the real progressed, his country got the tip of a wing, and this country all the rest. He may be expected to be reasonable, in the atomic phase of his Washington visit, but also pungently forceful.
