Final Blast in Nevada Produces Low Flash, Maybe Under Ground

Las Vegas, Nev. 30.—(AP)—America's atom masters, satisfied that they have found the facts of nuclear knowledge, closed the book today on the 1951 fast test series.

The Atomic Energy Commission and the Army wound up their joint show with an afternoon blast yesterday. It was the seventh and one of the last series of tests in a series that started Oct. 22.

Unofficially it was the 27th atomic explosion in history, but set off by the U. S. But Russia's identified three.

Test manager Carroll L. Tyler said the series produced an important milestone in the nation's military security.

Each nuclear detonation resulted in increased atomic weapons knowledge, Dr. Martin C. Graves, AEC scientific director, reported.

Earlier tests The final burst, a low flash of red-tinted light, was unlike any of the previous explosions and caused speculation that the detonation might have been the underground nuclear detonation.

The AEC would not confirm this, and the slight concussion indicated a burst at ground level was more likely.

The blast was witnessed by a multi-starred military command by Gen. J. Lawton Collins, Army Chief of Staff and a group of Congressional observers.

For the third time, troops from Camp Desert took part in a tactical maneuver. The series bit a high spot Nov. 1 with the first atomic maneuver in history. The 27th also were used to outline positions and locate material and field equipment for the last two tests, designed especially to determine effects of these tests and various structures, such as houses and bridges.

Washington, Nov. 30.—(AP)—House tax investigators unexpectedly received their hearings today until Monday to allow more time to examine Justice Department files—including any that may have been obtained from an attempted "fix" in a New York tax fraud case.
