November Rain Tops Since '27

Total of 7.4 Inches Fell Last Month, Say Records of Water Dept.

If you think November has been a rainy month, the Manchester Water Department is inclined to agree with you. Department statistics show that 7.4 inches of rain have fallen this month, which makes this the wettest November since 1927 when 7.46 inches fell. November of 1937 was a rather humid month too. There was 7.22 inches of rainfall then. Average for November is 3.48, based on figures for the years 1897 to 1946.

As a matter of fact the water department which takes measurements at Porter reservoir, thinks 1951 may break some records.
