### Rockville Election Swept By Democrats

#### Put All But One Candidate Into Office; Revised Charter Killed

Rockville, Dec. 5 (Special)—Mayor Frederick E. Bryant, Democrat, was selected for another term at Tuesday's election in Rockville which saw all but one of the Democratic candidates elected to office. The only Republican to be elected was the alderman from the second ward, Luther Trouton, which means that the council will have two Republican members, as Alderman John Peters has another year to serve.

On the question of accepting the revised city charter, only 725 voters cast their ballots on the question, an automatic rejection since, according to state legislation, 81 per cent of the voters must cast their ballots on such matters. Of the 725 voting, there were 501 in favor and 424 opposed to adopting the revision. Of the total voting list of some 4,500, 3,014 voted on Tuesday.

The recommended appropriations by departments are as follows: administrative salaries \$4,000; administrative general expense, \$17,375; judicial, \$4,832; miscellaneous, \$8,650; public works, \$49,853; police, \$19,000; fire, \$19,800; lighting, \$15,500; health, \$18,525; filtration, \$7,600; recreation, \$5,000. Among the additional items is one for \$2,000 for social security and hospitalization for full time city employees.

### Rule Yule Bonus Part of Wages

Washington, Dec. 5.—The National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) has ruled that where a Christmas bonus has been paid regularly, an employer may not reduce it without taking the matter up with the union.

Board member Abe Murdock, dissenting in the 3-1 decision, contended "a genuine Christmas gift has no place on the bargaining table." But the majority held that "the Christmas spirit... does not stop short of the bargaining table; it is a continuing effort to achieve goodwill between an employer and his employees."

Specifically, the NLRB upheld a complaint by a local of the CIO United Auto Workers against the Dime-Summit-Pond Co. of West Hartford, Conn. In cutting bonuses, the firm said it did so because it had increased pension fund payments. The NLRB majority held

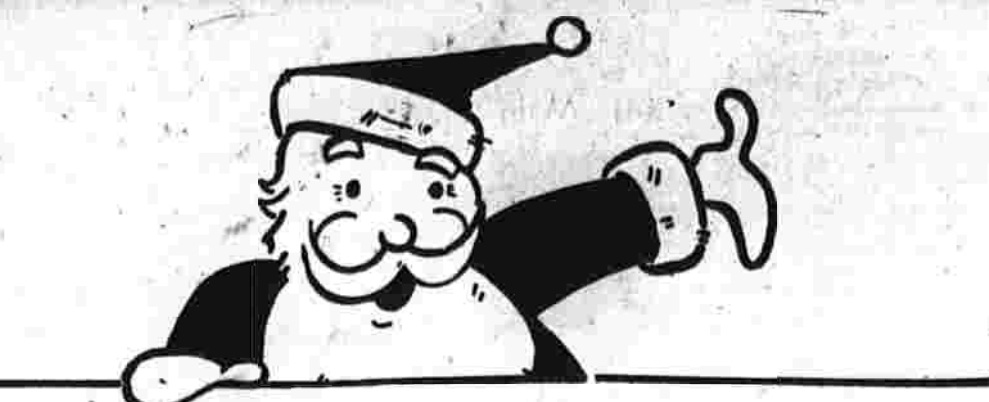
