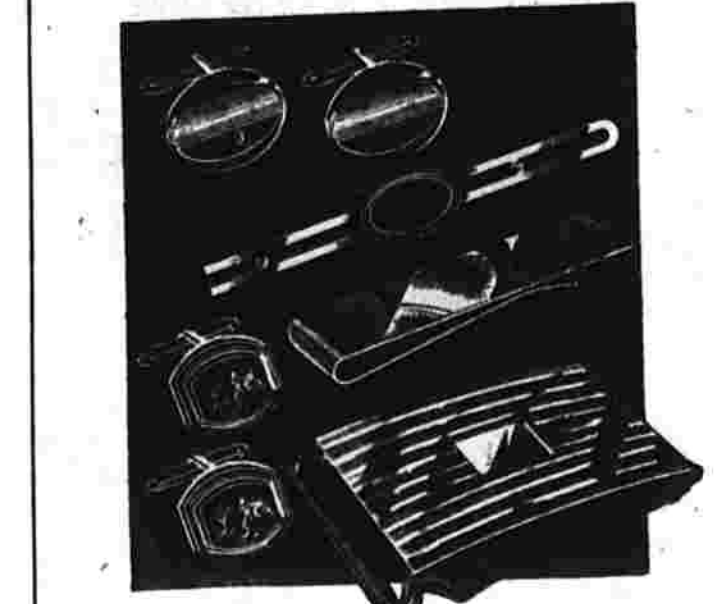

Conn. Power Plans Bolton Sub-Station

A new 3500 KW sub station that will serve all of the power needs for the Bolton area is scheduled to be under construction soon at the top of the hill on Bolton Center road, Parker Boren, manager of the Connecticut Power Company, reported today.

Boren said that the company will build the station on property recently acquired from Mr. and Mrs. William Phillips, which adjoins the Higgins farm.

Officers of the Connecticut Power Company have already cleared with the Bolton Zoning Commission for the construction of the sub station.

The need for the new sub station in Bolton was demonstrated when a sub-station built two years ago on Middle turnpike, east near Manchester Green, to cover eastern Manchester and Bolton, was found to be insufficient for the power needs of Manchester's rapidly growing neighbor.

Stepinae Disputes Terms for Release

(Continued from Page One) though many of the villagers had not yet heard of his return, long after dark last night, to his native village.

After mass, the archbishop talked with correspondents in the vestibule of the church.

"I am personally very satisfied because I am fulfilling my duty," he said. "I can perform my priestly duties here just as I did in prison. The only difference is to maintain a small chapel near his cell."

"I can do my duty here and I will do it until my whole life."

The archbishop said he did not want to discuss political questions, but firmly declared that "everyone unjustly attacked has a right to defend himself."

"However," he added, "now is better to clarify the situation and not inflame passions."

Under terms of his release, the archbishop is forbidden to issue pastoral letters, address his followers on public or personal conduct, or to issue public statements. He may leave Krasic only with the permission of the Croatian Minister of Interior.

But he will be permitted to preach sermons in church and is believed he will be completely free to visit any visitors.

There was no effort to stop correspondents from visiting the village today and no policemen were stationed at the church or parish house.

It was understood the office of the Yugoslav archbishopric was temporarily occupied by the acting archbishop, Dr. Sales Savic, who would pay the living expenses of Magr. Stepinae.

When he arrived in Krasic last night, the regular parish priest, Jonj Vranekovic, hastily prepared a room for him in the five-room parish house, already occupied by five nuns of the only Croatian Catholic order, "Servants of the Little Jesus."

The prelate has four married sisters living in the parish, but they were not on hand to greet him because of the suddenness of his release.

Geta New Auto He was brought from prison in a new American automobile presented to him, through the Vatican, by U. S. admirers.

It was while riding away from Leopoldia prison that the archbishop heard on the automobile radio a broadcast of the official announcement of his release, describing him as the "former archbishop."

The room in which he will live is a simple one, without running water. It contains a bed, a small wardrobe cabinet, a small table and two straight chairs. But additional furniture is being brought from Zagreb to make him more comfortable.

Krasic, to be installed in the parish house will be a typewriter sent to the archbishop in prison by an anonymous American. After the five clergyman told Alex Singleton of the Associated Press, in an interview last spring, that his machine was broken.

Dr. Krasic, a typical Croatian farm village, with pigs and geese in most possession of its streets, and autumnal heaps of pumpkins piled before the peasant houses.

The archbishop was born in a part of the parish called Breznice, about a mile from the church.

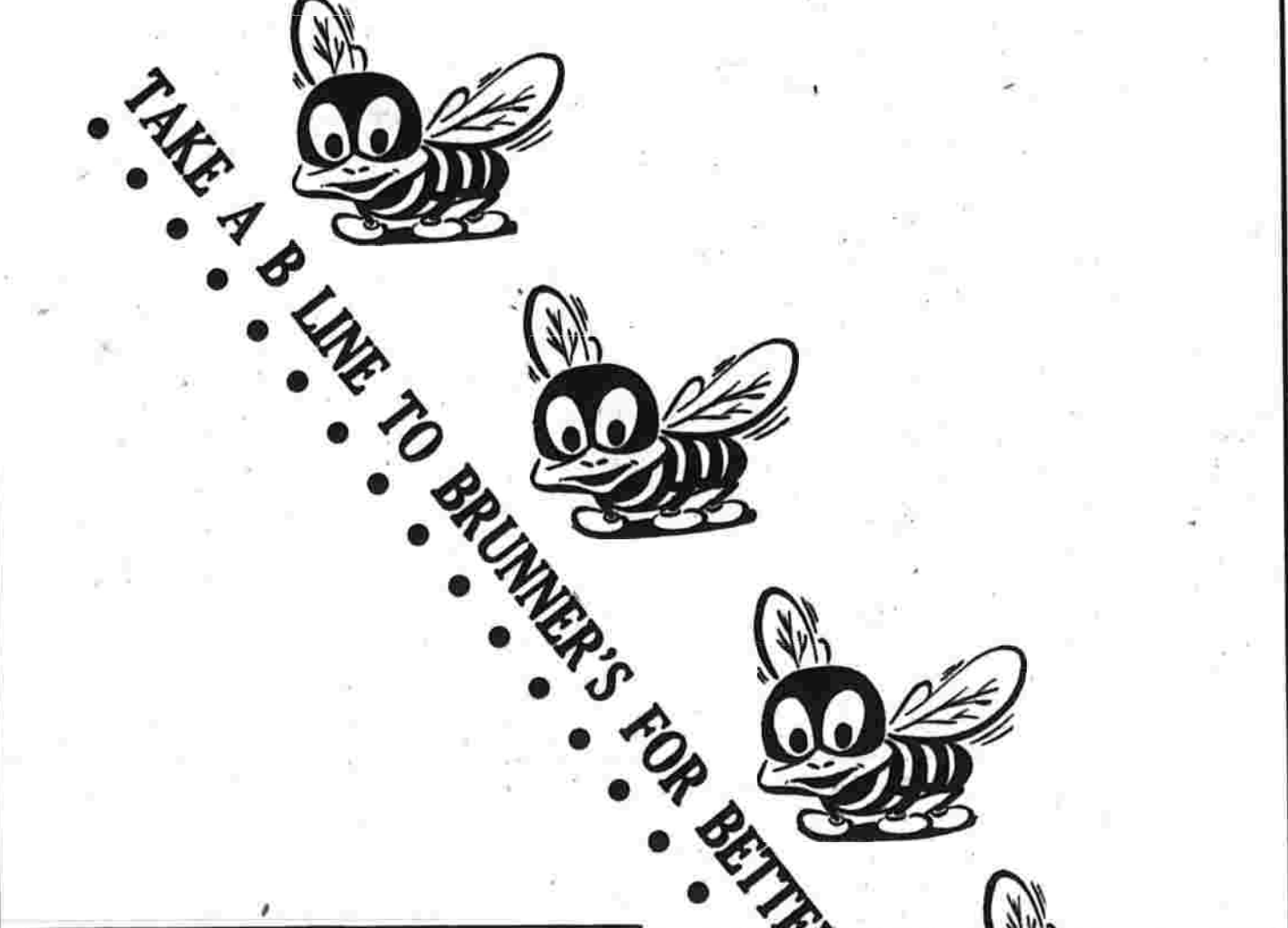
