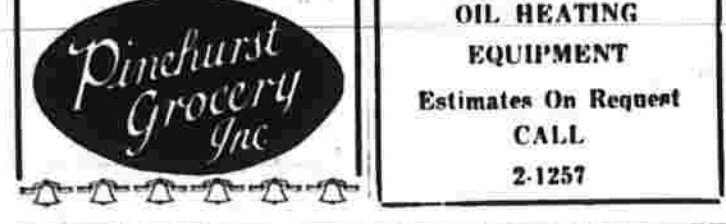

### Nomura, Kurusu Also Surprised

(Continued from Page One)

Not that my opinion means anything but their visits help keep me alive," Kurusu said.

The Kurusuis have two daughters living in the United States: one is the wife of Captain William J. Maddox, who served as a reconnaissance pilot with the U. S. First Cavalry Division in Korea until April. The Maddoxes live at Fort Hood, Tex.

"The other daughter is the wife of Frank Kenneth White, a lieutenant in World War II. While in graduate school at Michigan State College at East Lansing, Kurusu, bushy eyed and white haired, lives on the outskirts of Tokyo. He keeps busy reading and writing articles for Japanese publications.

"No political articles, of course," Nomura adds, smiling. "As a former official, I am one of the unfortunates."

Nomura, whose weather-beaten face has the quality of a searing sun, said he belongs to the same group of public figures in Japan. He plans no return to public service.

He is abreast of political developments and was his friends frequently to discuss Japan's future, the former admiral said. He declared American forces must be kept in the country to protect it against Communist aggression.

"If your forces do not stay, this country is lost," he said.

Nomura advocates rearmament for defense when Japan is economically able. He said "American troops may get in our way while they are here but they must stay for the time being if we are to feel safe."

### Driver Causes Two Accidents

to any agreement. The general expectation was that they would report next Monday that they have been unable to compromise rival disarmament plans.

The assembly already had voted Nov. 13 not to discuss the Chinese representation issue at this Paris session, but acting President Sir Gladwyn Jebb of Britain allowed it to be brought up today because the matter raises deep feelings on both sides.

White Russia's K. V. Kiselev urged the Assembly to seat the Red Chinese as a genuine representative of the Chinese people.

Nationalist China's T. T. T'ang and Ambassador Ernest A. Gross of the United States opposed the motion, saying there was no reason to reconsider an earlier resolution banning further discussion of the question.

Russia's Jacob A. Malik tried to speak in favor of the White Russian resolution, but Jebb pointed out that the UN rules in this case permitted only the sponsor to speak in favor of his proposal and two opponents to answer.

**This We Do Remember**  
 "Remember Pearl Harbor," the calendar says this morning. The calendar makers, we assume, were carrying out, without much question, the dramatic injunction laid down by President Roosevelt when, the following day ten years ago, he reported to Congress on a "day of infamy." And their illustration for the day on the calendar has a rising sun bomber over United States warships.

But, for all this, our "remember" of Pearl Harbor is obviously a changing thing. We do not remember it today, for instance, exactly as we remembered it nine years ago. Our emotional anger has cooled, partly because of the passage of time, partly because we are having the beginning of second thoughts about World War II, partly because our emotions have a new live target in Russia.

In our thoughts about the Japanese, we have come almost full circle. Ten years ago today they were barbarian apes. Today they are a gentle, pleasant people, and we either assume that they were always naturally that way, and were driven to an opposite course only by our own cruelty of racial prejudice and our journalistic labeling of them as "yellow peril" in the years between world wars, or we assume that General MacArthur changed their character during his proconsulship. At any rate, we now regard them as fit allies for ourselves, and are busy rearming the same individual we once vowed to disarm forever.

But if some of the lessons or interpretations of Pearl Harbor seem to be changing with the years and with world circumstances, there is valid indication that the main lesson of that day in American and world history is not being forgotten, but to the contrary, being realized more clearly and unmistakably as time goes on.

This lesson was that America is part of the world, for good or for ill, that if there is evil permitted to flourish in the world, it will flourish eventually to America, that if there is aggression and security in America, there must be freedom and security elsewhere, that if there is aggression in the world, it goes unchecked, its inevitable target must prove to be America, and that America can shirk the troubles and responsibilities and headaches and expenses of trying to build and keep peace in the world only at the cost of fighting the world's wars.

Whatever tragedy may have been involved otherwise, one result of Pearl Harbor was that America came of age in the world. It has known, thereafter, that it could not run or hide from trouble. It has known, since, that, however reluctant some people may be to accept the situation in theory, this is for all practical purposes, one world. It has had to realize this in its thinking, and in its policy, and in its wide involvement illustrates to us. And that world-wide involvement, though it often seems tangled and hopeless, is a more and per cent better and safer than the pretense that there need be no involvement at all.

The fundamental, all-important thing about Pearl Harbor is something we do remember well.

**Normal Diplomacy**  
 Within the past few days, two revolutions have resulted in the disappearance from office of legally constituted governments in two of the world's nations.

In Syria, the parliamentary regime which was in power has been thrown out by a military dictatorship. This development happens to be pleasing to us, because the military dictator leans sentimentally to the West, while the regime he threw out of office seemed disposed toward neutralism, or even toward friendship with Russia.

In Thailand, another revolution has also brought military elements to power. These military elements have revived an old constitution which prohibits the existence of political parties as such. They have abolished freedom of the press, and they seem on the way to the establishment of an authoritarian regime.

In both instances, no outstanding group of nations is quarreling with these events. There is no question of the new regime in Thailand is in haste to obtain formal diplomatic recognition from the United States, for we are engaged in providing military and economic aid in Thailand as a "free world" nation, and we cannot continue supplying such aid to a nation we have not recognized. And there will be no question about our recognition; it will be automatic and routine, and will not be delayed while we pass upon the methods by which the new regime came to power or evaluate its blows at democratic principles.

Our point in describing all this is obvious. This is all that diplomatic recognition means; and involved, when Britain and India and other nations recognized new government in China. They were observing according to normal diplomatic principle and procedure. We, on the other hand, had no such principle. The Chinese revolution was a big one and not a little one, and that it was a Communist revolution rather than that of some military clique.

On that basis, this country refused its recognition, and on that basis, after spurring by Senator McCarthy, this country succeeded in blocking Communist China's occupancy of China's seat in the United Nations, and subsequent world events have given us new reasons for such a stand which we did not have at the time we originally took it, so that, for the time being, there can be no question of our doing what would have been normal two years ago.

But that our refusal to follow a normal course then gave the Chinese Communists the idea that we were actually pursuing a policy of intervention in the Chinese revolution, and thus affected their outlook upon us, and drove them closer to Russia, is one of the possibilities history will have to evaluate one day.

Reynolds, social worker in the Manchester Welfare Department, who handles distribution of the dinners to needy Manchester families, says about 50 families will receive dinners and fruit baskets this year.

Miss Reynolds urges church and fraternal organizations which distribute Christmas dinners to contact her at the welfare department office in the Municipal Building in order to avoid unnecessary duplication.

She said that in the past families have received more than one dinner because of such duplication.

The fund, started by Miss Mary Henry 29 years ago, has been continuous since that time. Gifts used to include clothing and shoes for children but is now restricted to food.
