Bankers Warned On New Tax Law

New Haven, Dec. 12—(AP)—A New York bank analyst told the Connecticut Bankers' association yesterday that they were due for a "rude awakening" when they realize the full impact of the new tax law on bank operations.

Speaking at the association's operations conference at the Lawn club, Morris A. Shapley, head of the New York investment firm which bears his name, said that banks have an obligation to cooperate with the Federal Reserve's current survey of the effects of bank taxation.

A total of 783 persons have failed to pay automobile taxes, according to Paul Cervini, collector of revenue, and their names will be submitted to the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles.

Persons whose names appear on the list will not be permitted to re-register their cars until the tax is paid, Cervini explained. The

total number of registered units, including pleasure cars, trailers, trucks, and other vehicles, was 11, with 472 on the abstract of 1950, the list upon which the delinquency list is made. Delinquencies involve only 6 per cent of the total number registered.

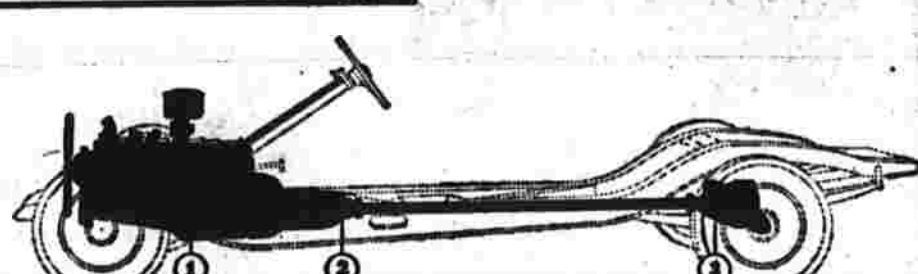

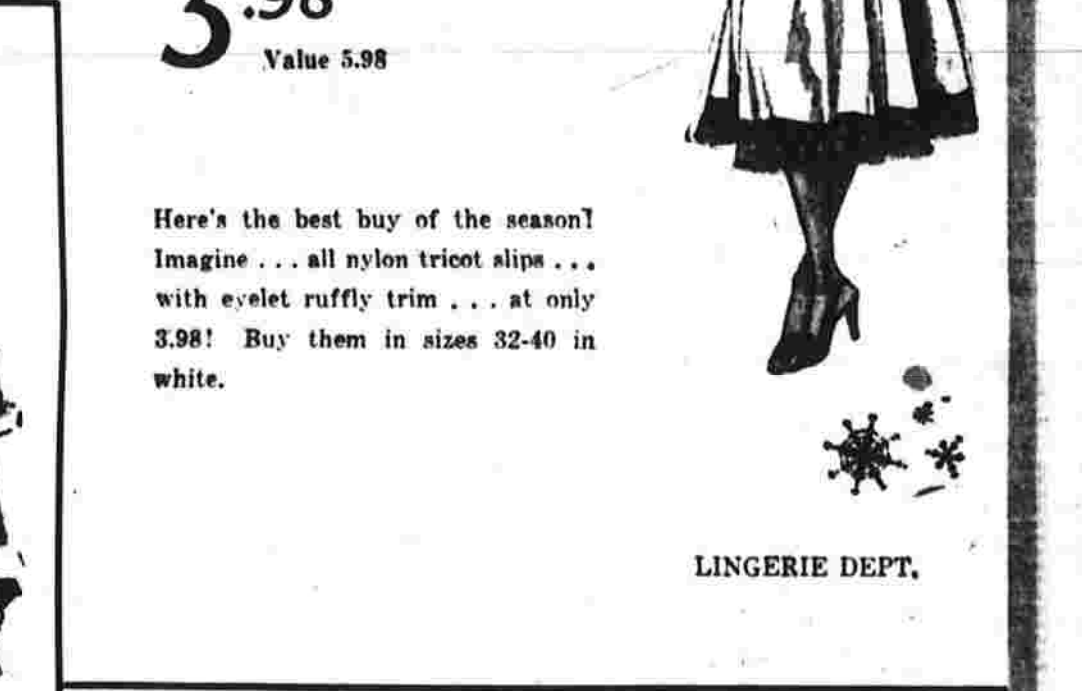

Issues About 1,200 Driving Licenses Here Each Year

Approximately 1,200 motor vehicle driving licenses are issued in Manchester during a 15-month period, according to Inspector Nicholas Ashe of the State Motor Vehicle Department.

Inspector Ashe, a resident of Rockville, has been giving practical examinations in Manchester for the past 16 years. He is stationed at the Manchester Police Station 48 Tuesdays of the year to give driving tests.

The weekly number of successful applicants for drivers' licenses runs about 25 with larger numbers on some Tuesdays and lesser numbers on other examination days.

The mid-manned inspector, always attired in the spruce green uniform of the Motor Vehicle Department, reports that approximately six out of every ten applicants in Manchester are members of the fairer sex.

Each Tuesday, automobiles can be seen lined up outside the police station on Center street from 10 o'clock in the morning until late afternoon.

Inspector Ashe checks in at 8:30 and the first person in line is given the practical examination in the applicant's own vehicle. Most applicants are well schooled in the operation of a motor vehicle and do not encounter any trouble in maneuvering the car along the route designated by Inspector Ashe.

All applicants, after having successfully passed the practical test, must undergo a written examination. Test questions are taken from the drivers' manual. The manuals are available to prospective drivers at the police station and may be secured at any time.

In addition to serving in Manchester, Inspector Ashe also spends one day weekly in Thompsonville, Rockville, Granby, and Stafford Springs. Several times during the year the inspector is assisted by other members of the State Motor Vehicle Department.

Inspector Ashe likes Manchester and, from reports from many applicants, they like the manner in which driving examinations are given.

New Draft Tests For College Men

Washington, Dec. 12.—About 22,000 college students are expected to take the college qualification test tomorrow, to become eligible for a draft deferment if they pass.

The number compares with a total of 328,000 who took the test last spring and summer.

The testing system was set up by Selective Service to give its local draft boards evidence of a student's ability to continue college study.

The score on the test and the student's scholastic rank in his class may be used as guide by the draft board for an educational deferment.

The present yardsticks for deferment are a score of 70 or a ranking in the upper half of the freshman class, the upper two-thirds of the sophomore class, the upper third of the junior class.

Draft boards are not bound to defer a man even though he meets these standards.

More than 60 per cent of those who took the test previously got better than a 70 score.

Belfast on the River Lagan is partly in the County of Antrim and Down. Its inhabitants prefer to throw in their lot with England. It might be said to be divided politically, pro-Britain and pro-Republic. The South is quite an anti-North as the North is an anti-South.

According to the author of the article, the people who really keep the lid on this important modern city of the British Isles are the Presbyterians, who are just as sternly religious as they were in the far-off days in Scotland under Mary Stuart. Many of Belfast's first families have Scottish names.

Donegal Square
The hub of Belfast is a civic rectangle known as Donegal Square. The "Y" is double to differentiate it from a county by the same name. Belfast's city hall stands on this square. In front of the building is a statue of Victoria Regina, with the inscription "From my heart I thank my beloved people; God bless them." In the gardens around city hall are signs "Keep off the verges," "Sprouting from the grass. Spots of color are provided by flower vendors who stack their flowers along the iron railings. A square shellak commemorates the landing of 12,000 American soldiers there in 1942. A grim price of sculpture is donated to the cause of the "Titanic," launched in 1912 from the Harland-Wolff shipyard in Belfast.

Open Air Markets
Almost no other city in the world has such riotous open-air markets. At the Variety Market, near the Courts, the acrid pleasures of haggling over a bargain

are enjoyed. The "Mills" and "Mills" of the Courts wear curled wigs with two pointed plumes. The judges high on their date, wear a stoupy seat of purple and little white dikkies, once the prerogative of John Wesley and his Methodist.

More vital to the leisurely arts of peace are the great linen mills of William Ewart and Son, Ltd., which cover several blocks on the Crumlin road. Ewart's was bombed by the Nazis in 1941, and the whole plant had to be rebuilt. Tea is served to the Ewart workers who are mostly women every morning and every afternoon. Much of the flax from which the linen is manufactured grows in Armagh. There is no smoking here; there are gum, introduced by the American troops in 1942.

Queen's University, Belfast's seat of learning is of Victorian and Tudor architecture. The college and Belfast have made many contributions to American life.

900 Planes Lost
By U. S. in Korea
Washington, Dec. 12.—American forces have lost more than 900 planes in the Korean war. This figure, which includes some non-combat losses, compares with a claimed destruction of about 200 Communist planes in actual air or ground action.

The Air Force said its records show that the U. S. Air Force, which includes Air Force planes and sea-based Marines, had lost 350 aircraft through November to enemy action from the ground or air. Spokesmen said this did not include planes lost in operational accidents. Figures on that were not available here.

Navy records also show that through Oct. 1, 243 carrier-based Navy and Marine planes had been lost to enemy action, including 50 fighters which may have been knocked down by enemy fire. Non-combat losses total 217.

American officials are apprehensive that this attitude may lead to a relaxation of the defense program.

N.Y. Asks Lottery To Pay Hospitals

New York, Dec. 12 (AP)—The city council has asked for state approval of a New York City lottery to raise money for hospital and medical needs.

The move was made over the objection of the Council's new president, Hubert H. Lehman. The former councilman to the Senate Crime committee told the council yesterday.

"Before voting on the resolution I would like every individual on the council to read the Kefauver report on legalized gambling," the committee concluded that gambling should be legalized at this time.

The crime committee, headed by Lehman, found that Nevada, where gambling is legal, has a lot of racketeers.

Lehman urged "the strictest type of economy" instead of a lottery to solve the city's financial problems.

The council adopted the proposal, 18 to 2, after a spirited debate.

The resolution asked Gov. Thomas E. Dewey and the Legislature to help get the State Constitution amended at the next election so that the city could run lotteries.

In the past, update legislators have vigorously opposed any such proposal.

The resolution's sponsor, councilman Edward A. Cunningham, Bronx Democrat, told his colleagues that a lottery would be "a painless way to meet higher costs of government."

He quoted from a report of the Chicago Crime commission to the effect that lotteries can be operated legally and successfully.
