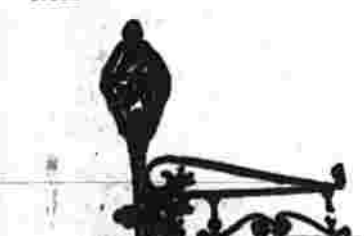

The traditional Christmas Carol Service of the South Methodist Church was performed Sunday evening to a full and appreciative audience. From the very first number, it was apparent that excellent preparation had been made for this program. The choir displayed fine technique, precision in diction and good tone. The choice of numbers was well balanced.

Mr. France
Herbert France deserves credit for program arrangement, sympathetic accompaniment, and comprehensive directing. In the process of producing some of the capella numbers, it was necessary to conduct from the chancel. The reason for this was that the evergreen decorations around the Bredon screen interfered with the possibility of conducting from the organ bench. Mr. France, who appears to be equally at home whether conducting from the side or the front, made no issue of this, but reduced his efforts to a modest minimum to produce the desired effect.

One of the contributing factors towards the enjoyment of last night's performance was the use of the beautiful indirect lighting in the sanctuary.

Equally effective in its turn was the "outside" singing before and after the chancel service, namely, Bach's "Break Forth O Beauteous Heavenly Light" before the candle light procession, and the Echo Carol of "Silent Night" after the recessional.

Choir's Pitch
The choir's pitch deserves mention. Whether planned or accidental, the lovely crescendo in the former was utterly delightful. The capella numbers, of which there were several, also proved that the sense of pitch was developed and controlled, and no accident.

Mrs. June Gaal and Harold Baglin in their respective solo work gave dramatic touches to the program that enhanced still further the quality work of the entire body of singers.

Delicate pastoral numbers vied with lilting folk tunes, rhythmic and naive, alternating with nostalgic, harmonic, and canonical works.

"Hallelujah Chorus"
It must be truthfully said that the finale, the "Hallelujah Chorus"

which because of a great familiarity is likely to be a let-down if not expertly performed, was lifted totally out of the realm of banality that evening. Mr. France's playing of the Handel number left nothing to be desired, and each choir member gave all he had to lift the choral number to its highest peak. The tempo was ideal and the rhythm so contagious the congregation might well have taken up the refrain from mere instinct.

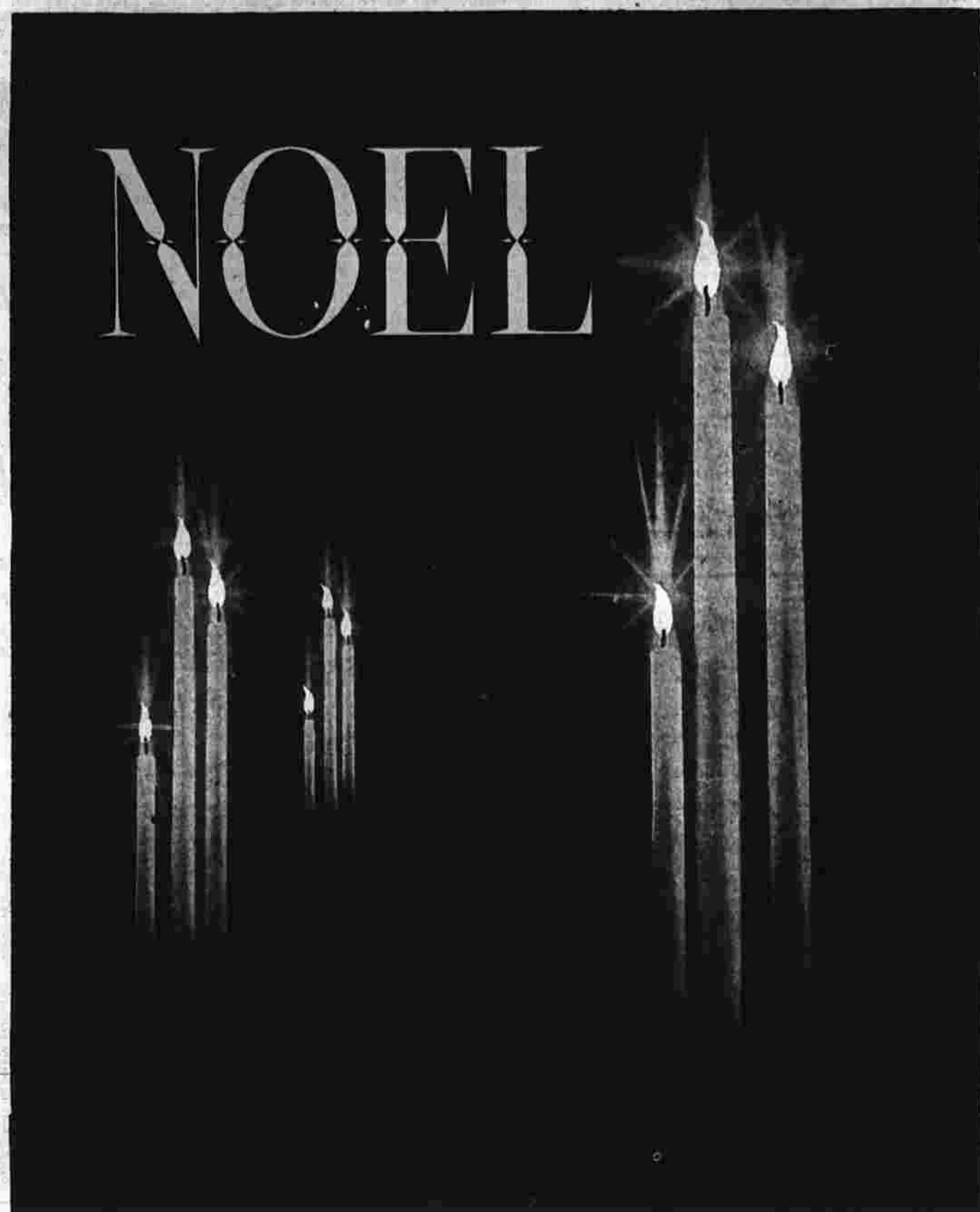

Dean Saved Last Bullet For Himself

Dean, a Congressional Medal of Honor winner, was listed as missing for 17 months before his name appeared on the Communist war prisoner list. Burchett gave this account of his interview with Dean: Dean was fighting alongside his men at Taejon, July 30, 1950, when Russian-equipped North Korean tank columns were sweeping into South Korea. The misty general, then 31, halted his way out of a road block in a tank, after ordering his men not to surrender. He helped carry wounded men to safety. Then, Burchett said, Dean was wounded for a month in the hills—without food for 25 days. Injured and sick, he lost 60 pounds. Dean was surrounded six times, but each time eluded the Reds, stopping only to eat and rest. During those agonizing days, he saved and carefully polished his last 12 bullets. Burchett quoted him: "I was absolutely determined never to become a prisoner of war. I was determined to kill 11 North Koreans. The 12th bullet was for me."

But near Chinan, some 30 miles from Taejon, Dean was ambushed and led by two Koreans. They betrayed him when North Korean soldiers closed in. Dean drew his gun, but one of his "friends" grabbed his arm before he could shoot. Dean's left shoulder had been broken in a fall while he was trying to elude the Reds. He suffered from dysentery on an acute stomach ailment and finally malaria. Burchett said Dean regained his health last September and now weighed about 180 pounds. The correspondent said he and Dean talked for three hours in a two-

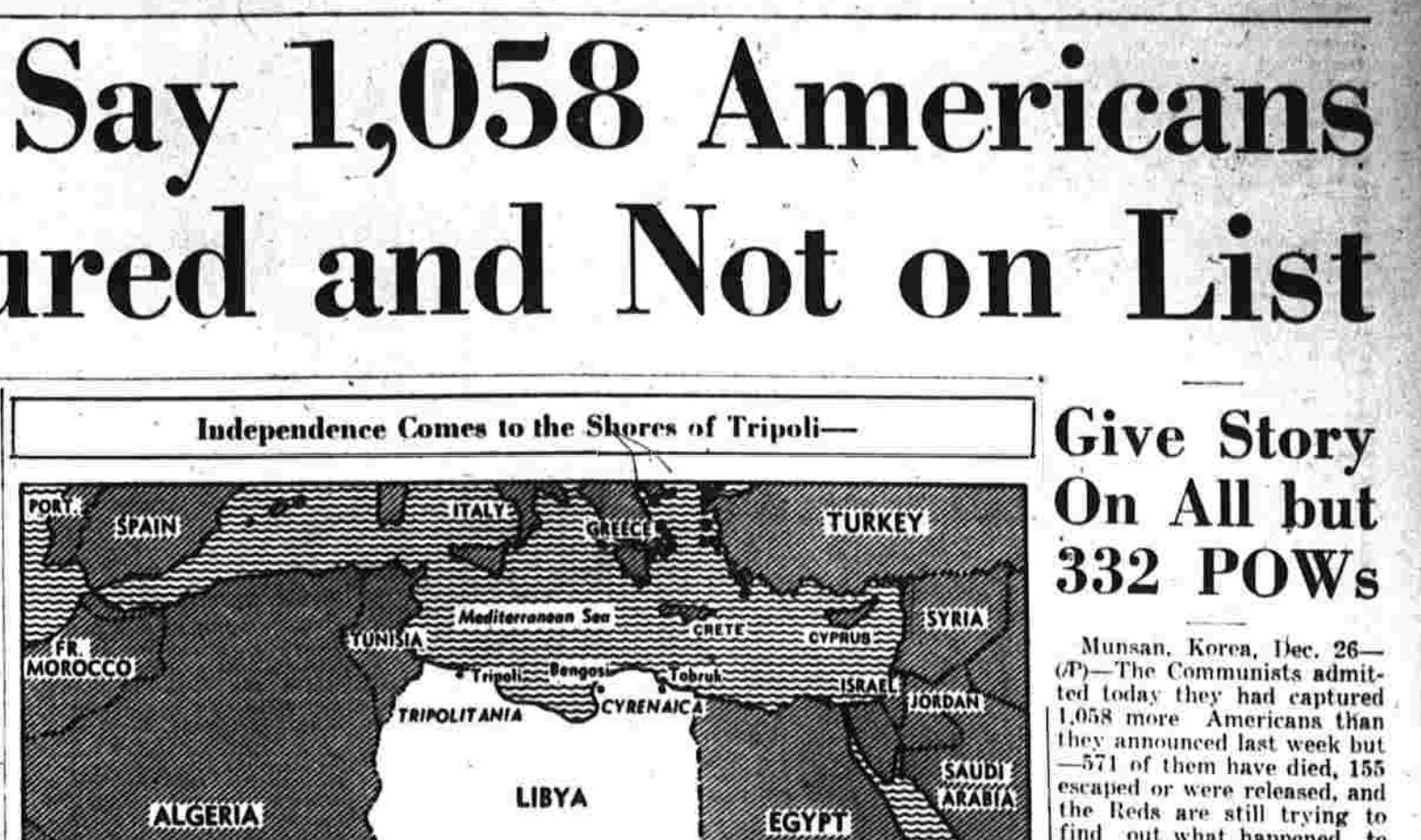
