Coal Miner 'Memorial' Seen Jan. 1

West Frankfort, Ill., Dec. 25. (AP)—Speculation grew today that the nation's miners may stage a work stoppage in memory of the 119 men who died in the West Frankfort coal mine explosion.

United Mine Workers union, wouldn't comment on the work stoppage talk, however. "I have no comment on any way or another," said "I will neither confirm nor deny any rumors."

The UMW contract permits "memorial periods" work stoppage of up to five days a year for mine disaster victims. Speculation growing daily in mining circles that Lewis will call a memorial work stoppage day around New Year's day. This work stoppage with the threatened steel strike, Lewis and other union officials came here shortly after the violent explosion ripped through the Orient No. 2 mine last Friday, bringing death to 119 miners.

Expected to Reopen One miner, Cecil Sanders, was taken alive from the blasted tunnel after cuttings had been abandoned. He had been given a good chance to recover. His physician, Dr. John Summers, described the miner's condition as fair and said "I hope until he has been up and around for about a week."

Sanders suffered a relapse Monday night and developed a fever, but he still was expected to get through. Christmas was a sad day for West Frankfort. Funerals were held for some of the victims and additional funerals were being arranged.

Steel Walkout Dec. 31 Hinges On USW Talks

Pittsburgh, Dec. 25. (AP)—The highest authorities of the United Steelworkers of America met here tomorrow to decide whether they will go through with a nation-wide strike at midnight, Dec. 31.

Philip Murray, president of both the CIO and the USW, has summoned the steelworkers' two most powerful groups into action: the 36-member executive board and the 13-member wage-policy committee.

Apparently there are only two courses open to the steelworkers: (1) They like the steel companies, can accept President Truman's mandate that there must be no interruption of steel production vital to the U. S. defense effort.

They may go through with the strike and face a possible Presidential "Hart-Scott" Act crackdown.

The President asked both companies and unions to dispute over to the Wage Stabilization board. The board, if established, would set a price increase, would get it, and the companies, if it failed to agree to the Presidential (Continued on Page Ten)

Cairo, Dec. 26. (AP)—A clear-cut choice between a state of alert against further outbreaks, the press reported a state of emergency already was in effect.

The leftist and Communist-inspired section of the press stepped up its clamor for firmer government action against the British, using the term "traitor" to describe any Egyptian advocating a settlement. ### Sees 'Grass Roots' Demand for Ike

Violent accidents in the United States took a near record toll over the four-day Christmas holiday.

Deaths in traffic accidents, fires and from miscellaneous causes from 8 p. m. Friday last to midnight (local time) reached the staggering total of 764.

This figure compares with the recorded accidental death toll of 781 recorded in the four-day Christmas holiday of 1950.

Traffic accidents caused more than 500 fatalities, but the 1951 total was below the 600 predicted by the National Safety Council.

Seven-Minute Frosting

Combine 2 unbeaten egg whites, 1 1/2 cups sugar, dash of salt, 1/3 cup water and 2 teaspoons light cream syrup in top of double boiler. Beat with rotary egg beater or electric beater about 1 minute, or until thoroughly mixed.

Cook over rapidly boiling water, beating constantly with rotary egg beater for 7 minutes, or until frosting will stand in stiff peaks. (Stir frosting up from bottom and sides of pan occasionally with rubber scraper to help it cook.)

Remove from boiling water. Add 1 teaspoon vanilla and beat 1 minute, or until thick enough to spread. To tint coconut, place 1/2 teaspoon milk or water in bowl, add a few drops of green coloring and mix well. tional demands. The Egyptians seek full control of the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan, and want evacuation of the British from the Canal Zone. The West, meanwhile, has been rebuffed in its invitation to Egypt to join a Middle East command for defense against possible Communist aggression.

The appointment apparently was a job to the "dominant" Egyptian party, whose leaders have insisted upon no compromise with the British. They want the British to clear out of Egypt.

Plurality With Reds

But, Farouk appeared anxious to steer Egypt's course toward an alliance with the West in the cold war against Communism. The palace apparently has been alarmed by Wafist flirting with Communist powers in efforts to back up their demands that the British leave.

The king's nomination of Afifi to the post which is a liaison job between the palace and the government followed by 24 hours the publication of a photograph here showing Egyptians drinking and merrily toasting in Paris with Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei V. Vishinskiy.

The king was reported to be conferring with Wafist Premier Mustafa el Nahas. Parties which must have been angered by the palace appointment.

Indications are that the Waf party has not yet made up its mind what to do in the face of this challenge to its foreign policy from the palace itself. Western observers agree that Afifi is sure to seek a settlement of some sort with Britain and alignment with the West's defenses. But public opinion has been set afire with nationalist cries for immediate departure of the British and Afifi's course would require much caution.

The Nahas government has shown up to now it can keep the demonstrations from getting out of hand. A month ago it banned demonstrations and ordered police to fire on demonstrators. But to-day scattered demonstrations were reported from a number of points.

Deaf Canal Attacks

Egypt's two largest newspapers reported—and the British denied—that many British and British colonial troops were killed Christmas day in the disputed Canal Zone by guerrilla attacks. The newspaper Al Zaman said 170 were killed and the Independent said 100. A British spokesman in Cairo and one in Istanbul in the Canal Zone said the stories were "absolutely untrue."

But the British, noting reports that Egyptian youths were contemplating "commando-type" attacks on the British forces, warned that any such attacks would be put down by "bombing" forces.

King Farouk's appointment of Afifi and one other pro-western adviser to the royal cabinet was described by a qualified source as a foreboding a royal effort to settle Egypt's bloody quarrel with the British.




