

Local Youths Captured After Slug-Fed Chase

Indiana Police Throw Up Road Block to Stop Trio Fleeing in Auto Stolen from Hartford

Three Manchester youths were captured yesterday by State Police in Indiana after they eluded two road blocks and police bullets in an automobile allegedly stolen in Hartford Saturday.

The youths identified themselves as Richard Michael, 19, of 20 Ash street, Gerald A. Carter, 18, and a 15-year-old juvenile. All three were picked up after a chase of more than 50 miles along U. S. Route 6 in Indiana, being stopped finally when a state trooper commandeered a truck and placed it across the road.

Police were on the alert for the car after the boys fled to pay for \$3 worth of gasoline in Edgemoor, Ohio. Forty miles west of Edgemoor, police in Mendonville, Ind., spotted the youths fleeing and fired at the car.

The boys escaped and 16 miles further west, state police finally stopped them by placing the truck across the road.

The three were taken from the car at gunpoint and turned over to the FBI on a charge of transporting a stolen car across state lines.

Stolen in Hartford
Detective Blain B. Schanz said Carter admitted he had stolen the car in Hartford last Saturday from 10-20 and 11 a. m., according to Detective Lieutenant William Sullivan of Hartford.

The car is owned by Richard Scholtysek of Hartford, a realtor.

Manchester police have been searching for Michael and the juvenile since last Friday when the pair showed up in Edgemoor. Police John Baladya stopped to question them. The juvenile was in a car pushing Michael, who was stalled in another, police said.

When Baladya tried to question them the car suddenly started and they sped away. The car was stolen earlier in the day, police said.

Christmas Visit
Manchester police identified Michael as a parolee from the Connecticut State Reformatory, where he was in the custody of Charles Carter, they said, was home on a Christmas visit from the Connecticut School for Boys at Meriden, while the juvenile was home on leave from the Connecticut Junior Republic at Litchfield.

Detective Lieutenant Sullivan said Hartford police today will take up with the prosecutor the question of sending a warrant for the boys.

Michael was sentenced last December to Chelsea Reformatory for taking a motor vehicle without the owner's consent. He was suspended on charges of driving an improperly registered motor vehicle and disobeying a police officer, and Michael was given 30-day probation.

Carter was arrested by Manchester police last May, charged with operating a motor vehicle without the owner's permission, and was subsequently turned over to the probation officer.

Last October Michael was fined \$150 on a conviction of operating a motor vehicle while his license was suspended. In Dec. 1949, he was fined \$100 on a motor vehicle theft conviction and \$25 on a charge of operating a motor vehicle without a license.

Wants Wage Guarantee
Although most industry officials are hopeful the scheduled shutdown will be postponed, they are prepared to start banking funds.

The union has asked an 18 1/2 cent hourly pay boost for workers averaging \$1.85. The UMW also wants a guaranteed annual wage, a union shop, elimination of geographical pay inequities, improved premium and incentive pay, and other benefits. Some authorities have estimated the entire package would run to \$0 or \$0 cents an hour.

The union says the pay raise is necessary because of increased living costs.

The industry has made no wage offer. Its spokesmen have argued that any pay raise would add to the inflationary pressure. As they declare, they cannot raise pay unless they get an increase in steel prices.

There is some indication the government is considering allowing a raise in steel prices—perhaps 10 percent.

Six Weigh One Force For Europe

That a compromise could be worked out making one man a sort of European defense minister

Delegates are expected to work through Saturday setting their plan ready for consideration at the meeting of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) council at Lisbon Feb. 2.

It may make it the entire European army would be turned over to General Eisenhower as part of the Allied defense force.

Americans have tripled their use of troops since 1950, says the National Geographic Society.

France and Italy would provide 12 divisions each, Germany's proposed 14 divisions and the five from the Benelux countries—Belgium, The Netherlands and Luxembourg—would be stripped-down versions of not more than 13,000 men each.

They would be merged into international corps and armies and their supply lines would be strictly international.

Optimism that agreement could be reached was based mainly on reports that the French would be willing to compromise simply to get the European army formed.

The French seem to think organizational differences can be solved after a trial period of one to two years of actual practice.

Study Finances
Two main differences confront the delegates in addition to the comparatively minor problem of whether the European army shall be based by a single high commissioner or by governing bodies of defense ministers of all six nations.

The main points are (1) whether to draft a common budget for the army, (2) whether to finance it by the six countries to finance it and (3) whether to allow any of the six member countries to exercise veto power over plans for army expansion or operation.
