The Swarthmore Experiment
 How, in the technique of the totalitarian, or even in the totalitarian mass mode of democracy, does black become white? How can the truth be vanquished by the lie? How can people accept as possible truth something they really know is not so? An interesting study of these questions, experiment directed to the problem of explaining how such things can happen has been conducted down at Swarthmore.

Several hundred students, in groups of eight, participated in the experiment, in which a group of eight students in the group gave, by arrangement, the wrong answer to a question. The question was often as simple as that of whether or not two lines were equal in length. Seven of the eight students, coached in advance to give a false answer, would say that the lines were equal in length. The eighth student, uncoached, and the "guilt" of the experiment, would be asked his opinion. One third of the time he would agree with the error of the majority. But, if tested alone, he would always give the right answer.

Some individuals always went with the crowd, against their own better judgment. Only a few, however, constantly maintained their own independence of judgment.

What do these experiments illustrate? They illustrate, first, the unexpected weakness of the human individual—in this country as elsewhere.

They illustrate, second, the fact that the dissenter may often be right, though lonely.

They illustrate, third, the need for respect, and tolerance for dissent when it occurs. This country has attained its greatness through its respect and tolerance for dissent. When this dissent has been wrong, it has fallen to its own error. But when it has been right, it has always had its chance to make itself recognized.

The lesson here is that we should accept those held by Senator Robert A. Taft and General Douglas MacArthur.

Everywhere is an internationalist. The Hearst and McCormick newspapers, which oppose him most vehemently, know the fact about him very well. It is the main reason they oppose him. For them it is evident that they need clarification of his views is hypocritical.

Eisenhower is against which? These same newspapers know that very well, too, because Eisenhower has lent his name and support to individuals named by Senator Joseph McCarthy.

Eisenhower has a middle of the road political philosophy. All those who proclaim that he has no political philosophy are wrong. He is more honest, proclaim directly that they do not like the philosophy they know he has. He is a middle of the road Republican, who offends the die-hard conservatives in his own party because he does not believe in effort to turn the clock back. He is a middle of the road Republican who offends extremists because he believes in achieving a balance between the functioning of the state and the initiative and responsibility of the individual.

Those who complain that he has taken no stand know that too. Their real trouble is that they don't like it.

Eisenhower is for peace and against any wild or accidental excursion into a preventive war. He entertains no dream of exterminating Russia. He does not believe that war is inevitable. And this is no secret, to those who proclaim that Eisenhower is an unknown quantity. Really, they are wrong by what he is, by the fact that he is not a dogmatic loud mouth.

Eisenhower is a positive in his attitude toward problems and a believer in the intelligence, good sense, and basic integrity of his fellow Americans and their democratic process. These qualities are clear enough. The trouble is that they are trying to plunge this country into an atmosphere of desperate defiance and fear and endless mutual suspicion leading to thought control and an increasing abandonment of the Democratic process.

The trouble with all those who are crying in righteous horror, that the American people are being asked to buy a "pig in a poke," which is, for instance, the title of the Chicago Tribune's editorial on the Eisenhower candidacy, is that they know very well what is really being offered the American people. Far from being in doubt about it, they are very sure of it, so very sure that it is in almost all respects opposite to their own views that they are mortally committed against him. Only, rather than make a frontal attack on his views and qualities and principles, they consider it more politically effective to view and qualify and have no views and qualities and principles at all. He is no mystery to them, however. They know precisely why they oppose him so bitterly. He is not an isolationist. He is not a socialist. He is not a reactionary. He is not a bigot. He is not a bigot.

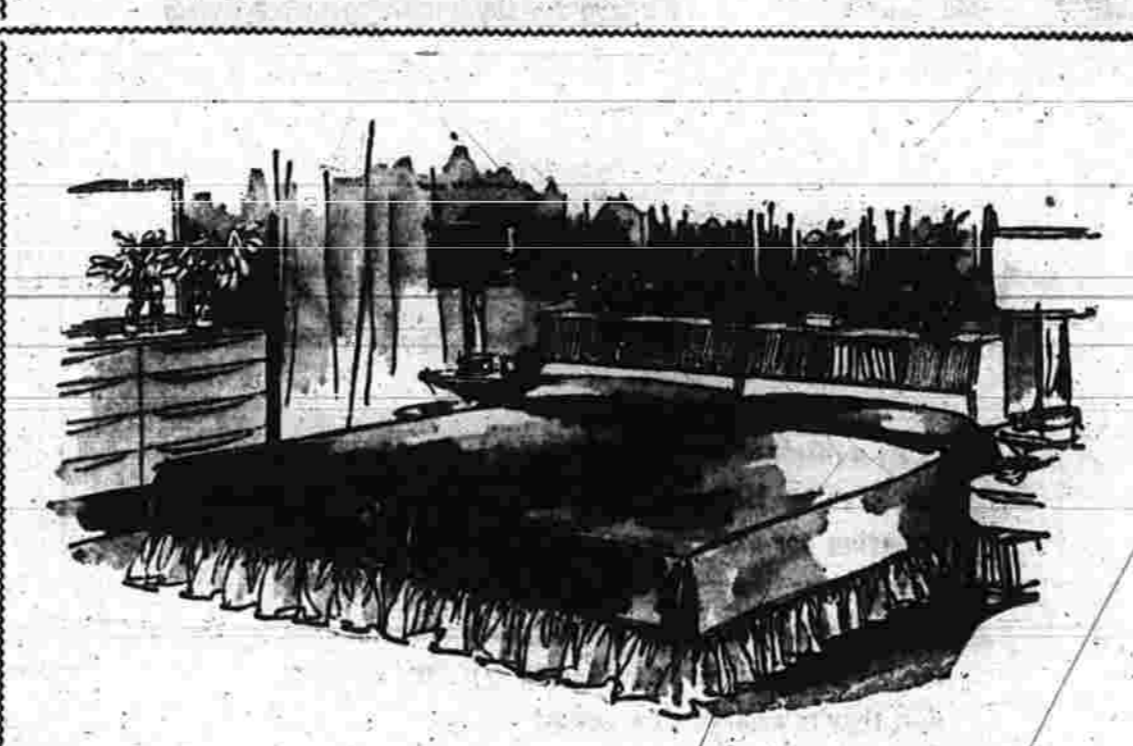
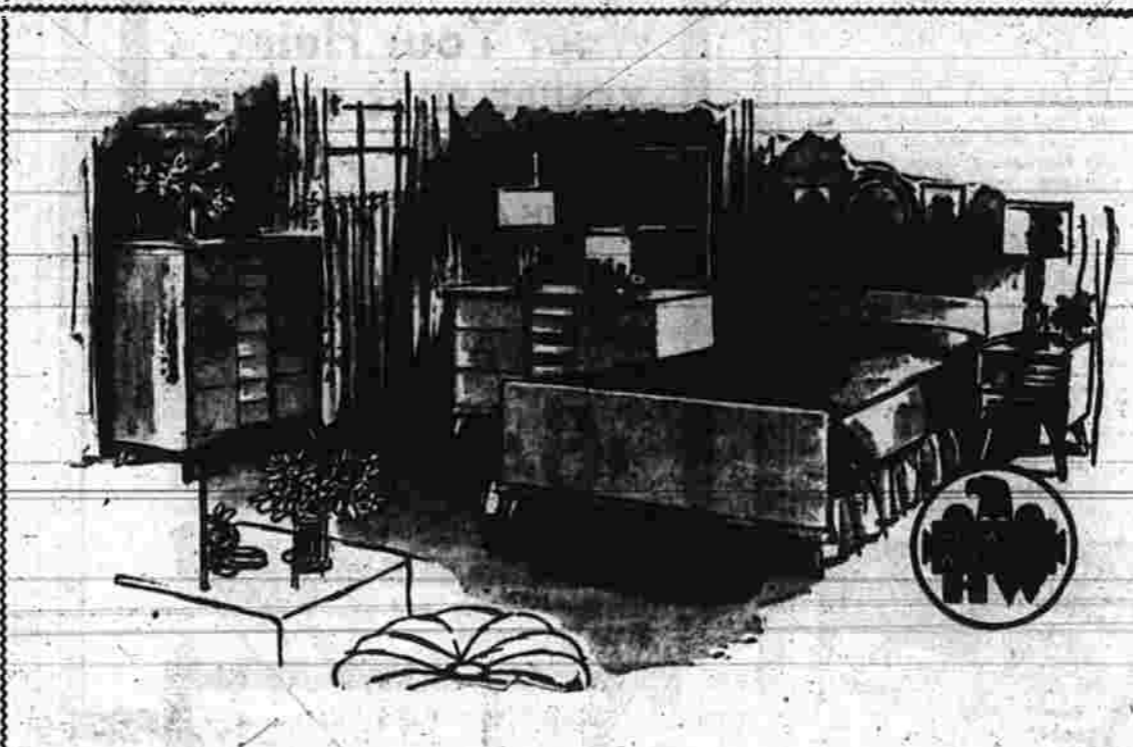
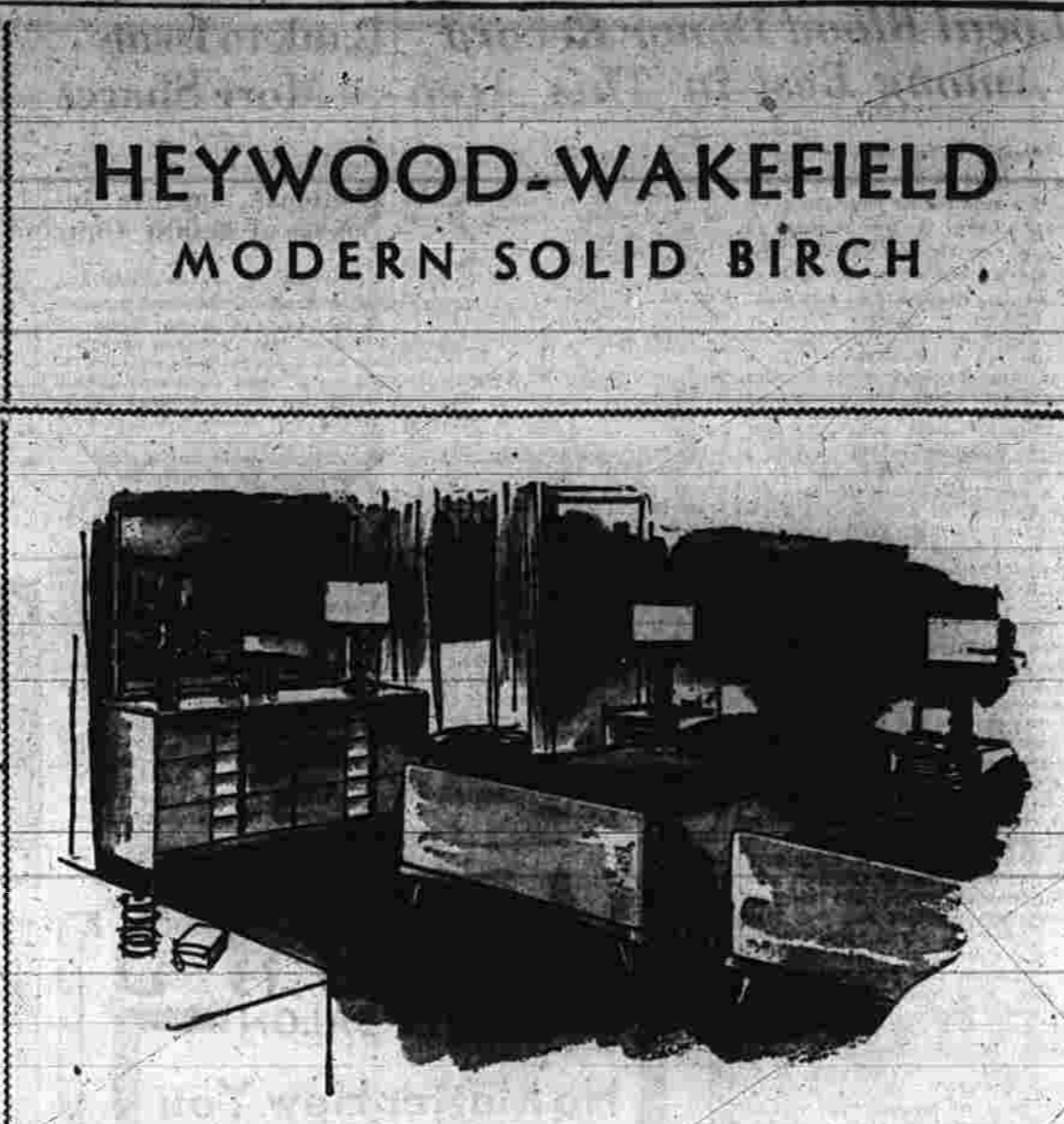

Washington, Jan. 10.—(AP)—President Truman said today if Central Eisenhower wants to run for President—and he is the target for mud and rotten eggs—it's all right with him.

But when he was asked if he would support Eisenhower, Mr. Truman said he doesn't think the country would prosper under any Republican candidate.

Mr. Truman stressed at his news conference what he has said many times before: He has a high opinion of Eisenhower, but he likes him, and he wants him to stay on as the top commander of united military forces in Europe.

"I'm doing a good job, Mr. Truman said, and he has no intention of leaving the office until he is asked to do so."

And, he said, Eisenhower will stay on the job until he himself is asked to resign. He said he would resign if Eisenhower should resign, but he would not resign himself.
