**Our Role in Egypt**  
 The fact that a bullet in the  
 fighting in Jerusalem, in Egypt,  
 claimed an American-born man as  
 its victim, constitutes no argu-  
 ment one way or another in the  
 Egyptian issue, even if, as the  
 British claim, the bullet came  
 from an Egyptian patriot. The  
 situation in Egypt is getting  
 to be more and more like  
 war, and was in an institution in  
 which the innocent are always  
 victims. Whether the bullet in  
 question was a stray British shot,  
 or an angry Egyptian shot, can  
 never be determined. But in any  
 case, American interest in the  
 Egyptian crisis should be based on  
 the assumption that unless some  
 middle way solution is found, still  
 more innocent blood will be  
 spilled.  
 The basic situation in Egypt is  
 that Egypt has denounced,  
 unilaterally, the treaty under  
 which British troops are main-  
 tained on Egyptian soil for the  
 protection of the Suez Canal.  
 Such unilateral denunciations of  
 treaties are supposed to be im-  
 moral—particularly when done by  
 a small power. The Egyptians re-  
 spond with the argument that  
 their long series of treaties with  
 Britain represented the result of  
 British domination and pressure,  
 not their own free and equal  
 national consent. On this, of  
 course, quite true.  
 The American diplomatic po-  
 sition, in this issue, seems to be that  
 we cannot afford to have the  
 British chased out of Egypt be-  
 cause that would leave chaos and  
 military weakness behind. So we  
 are taking the position that  
 Egypt's action is immoral, and we  
 are backing Britain's decision to  
 fight to stay in Egypt.  
 It is already a fight. It is a  
 fight between a modern army  
 equipped with the latest and most  
 deadly weapons of land and air,  
 and Egyptian guerrillas. The  
 Egyptian army itself is still held  
 to a role of trying to maintain  
 order. But the British, with a re-  
 sidual of the tactics with which  
 they have for decades held Egypt  
 under their sway, are employing  
 their modern equipment in the ef-  
 fort to cow the native population.  
 Only this time, there is the possi-  
 bility that the native population  
 will not be cowed, but will keep  
 fighting.  
 If this trend keeps on, what  
 comes will certainly be as bad as  
 any chaos and weakness which  
 might result from a British with-  
 drawal and probably much worse.  
 For, although it is difficult to see  
 just how and when Russia would  
 stepping her way down to an at-  
 tack on the Suez Canal, it is very  
 easy to see what the results in  
 the world would be from a pro-  
 longed bloodshed between British  
 and Egyptian. The one catastrophe  
 —the advance of Communist  
 imperialism to Suez, is highly  
 theoretical. The other catastrophe  
 —that of having the West en-  
 gaged in the open war against Mos-  
 cow—seems almost certain.  
 We have both Britain and Egypt  
 committed to disaster. Our own  
 responsibility is clear. It is to try  
 to evolve some formula which will  
 rescue both. Perhaps a true inter-  
 nationalization of the canal would  
 be the answer, with both Britain  
 and Egypt yielding their own  
 claims to the United Nations in-  
 self.

**Yoshida Complicates**  
 Mr. John Foster Dulles, having  
 negotiated the peace treaty with  
 Japan, is now anxious to have it  
 ratified by the United States  
 Senate. In order to accomplish  
 that aim, he has been campaign-  
 ing in Washington, but in  
 Tokyo, there has been trying to  
 obtain from the Japanese a  
 pledge that they will not do what  
 the treaty itself permits them to  
 do—make their own choice as to  
 whether they want Nationalist

**China or Communist China to**  
 sign the treaty for China.  
 To this extent, on the part of  
 Mr. Dulles, Premier Yoshida has  
 now responded with a statement  
 that Japan will conclude a peace  
 treaty with Nationalist China,  
 which it will recognize, and not  
 with Communist China.  
 This is supposed to be the as-  
 surance which will persuade  
 American senators to vote to ratify  
 the treaty. They have been  
 reluctant to do so because of the  
 give treaty recognition to Com-  
 munist China.  
 But Premier Yoshida's com-  
 promise has its catch. His state-  
 ment recognized Chiang Kai-shek  
 only as the acknowledged ruler of  
 "certain" territory which, quite  
 obviously, consists of the island of  
 Formosa. But Chiang himself and  
 those American senators who are  
 his champions like to claim that  
 he is still the only legitimate ruler  
 of all China.  
 Furthermore, Premier Yoshida  
 observed that Japan would  
 naturally, in time, like to resume  
 normal commercial relations with  
 the Asiatic mainland which  
 means, of course, Communist  
 China. The present inference of  
 course, is that Japan would have  
 nothing at all to do with such a  
 wicked regime as now exists in  
 Communist China. But how long  
 that inference will last beyond the  
 Senate's ratification of the treaty  
 is another question again. We  
 won't really begin to know until  
 we hear what Mr. Dulles has to  
 say on Thursday, Jan. 24, at 6:30  
 p. m. in the Senate Chamber.  
 Now will such education be to  
 any avail or treacherous intent  
 on the part of the Japanese. They  
 have to trade with China, or they  
 have to trade with areas where they  
 complete more directly with the  
 main and ourselves, which is one  
 reason Britain is anxious to see  
 them recognize the facts of life  
 about who is China today. They  
 have to play to the current of  
 American policy in order to win  
 ratification of their peace treaty.  
 Mr. Dulles himself is the one who  
 has been persuading them to state  
 things they really don't mean, to  
 pretend to ignore some of the  
 facts of life in order to meet the  
 face of political life in the Senate.  
 They will do what they have to  
 do today, and they will do what  
 they have to do tomorrow also.

**Not A Pink Tea**  
 David R. Ingalls, Senator Rob-  
 ert A. Taft, announced today that  
 he will not attend the so-called  
 "pink tea" given in honor of the  
 meeting of the Republican Na-  
 tional Committee at San Fran-  
 cisco with a special attack on  
 General Dwight D. Eisenhower.  
 "Hero worship" and "glamor" and  
 "a new approach" were Ingalls' ex-  
 planations of the apparent popu-  
 larity of General Eisenhower.  
 If the Republican party were to  
 risk its political future "on such  
 slender attributes," he added,  
 "then I say the party is dead and  
 we are met here today merely to  
 assist a good-looking politician to  
 preside over the final rites."  
 The violence of this attack, the  
 abrupt denials by the lowest ar-  
 m-in-name-calling by Taft's man-  
 ager in his first public forum op-  
 portunity since the announcement  
 of Eisenhower's availability drew  
 various reactions. The Eisenhower  
 supporters, although angered by  
 its nature, considered it a demon-  
 stration of the better desperation  
 existing in the Taft camp. Neutral  
 party figures were shocked by it,  
 and said that it would do Taft  
 more damage than good as it  
 spread around the country. But  
 another Taft manager, Thomas  
 Coleman of Wisconsin, said the  
 following:  
 "This is a political cam-  
 paign, not a pink tea."  
 It was interesting to see, how-  
 ever, that the Eisenhower sup-  
 porters, in the main, reacted the  
 hot invitation to climb down into  
 the name-calling areas them-  
 selves.  
 The best statement they pro-  
 duced came from former Senator  
 Henry Daby of Kansas, who  
 spoke as follows:  
 "Some, but fortunately only a  
 few, have assumed the attitude  
 that if you do not support one  
 particular Republican candidate  
 you are not a Republican. Such an  
 attitude is fatal. Our attitude in  
 the Eisenhower cause should be  
 stated simply: We are not against  
 any other Republican candidate—  
 we are for the Eisenhower. This  
 is no time for any Republican to  
 prime the guns of vilification and  
 destruction against any of the  
 party's candidates."  
 Senator Henry Cabot Lodge,  
 campaign chairman for the Eisen-  
 hower cause, likewise held him-  
 self, mainly, to the positive ap-  
 proach. The exception came when  
 he asserted that great victories  
 in state elections (Taft in Ohio  
 1946) often failed to prove great  
 vote-getters on the national  
 level.  
 It is to be regretted that, what-  
 ever the obvious provocation, Sen-  
 ator Lodge went even this far.  
 For he in campaign manager for  
 a movement which hopes to bring  
 about the nomination of a man  
 who is certainly not interested in  
 talking down any of his own  
 rivals, who is certainly not the

**DEFENSE PRODUCTION PUSHES STATE BUSINESS TO RECORD**  
 Hartford, Jan. 21.—The Department of Labor stated, "Defense Development Commission reported today that despite losses in a few industries, and some weakness toward the end of the year, defense production pushed Connecticut business to new high levels in 1951."

 Construction held its own in 1951. The January-November stretch showed building permits up 1.8 per cent in number and 8.4 per cent in value. The much higher advance in value was due to the shift from homes to more costly industrial and commercial construction and employment.  
 The gains of the first six months of 1951 were attributed by the development commission to what it termed the first "big push" of the defense program.  
 "Scare buying, it said, 'sparked' retail sales and produced construction and employment boom."  
 Commented the commission: "By June 30, Connecticut industry had received \$17 billion in military prime contracts, or 8.8 per cent of the nation's total. In the second quarter alone, \$97.8 million worth of contracts came to the state."  
 The bottom suddenly dropped out. For the entire third quarter, with construction dropping a part, Connecticut got defense orders of only \$125 million, or 0.2 per cent of the \$71 billion awarded in that period.  
 With large military orders piled up in the earlier months, it is difficult to see how the state could have greatly affected business in the third quarter. Nevertheless, some important trade indicators turned downward as the end of the year approached.  
 "Although high for the year, factory orderings were down 10 per cent, bank debts (checks drawn) 5.6 per cent and the average price of Connecticut industrial stocks 5 per cent in November as compared with October. The number of business failures increased in September and October, and for the first 10 months their liabilities were 22.8 per cent greater than in 1950.  
 On the other hand, unemployment kept rising right through December. "Never before," the State
