Senator Eisenhower stands to the right of the other candidates in the primary election of Governor of New Hampshire.

Senator Lodge (R., Mass.), the general chief supporter, yesterday addressed the national convention — of the CIO Retail, Wholesale and Department Store Union, prior to the talk, Lodge described Eisenhower as a "progressive-minded" and "progressive" man, and that the campaign was being prepared to fight for the national convention, foreign policy and labor.

In Orlando Senator Taft said the Korean war was "unjust" and "unjustified by mistake." He gave applause from a crowd of 8,000 when he said Gen. Douglas MacArthur "wanted to lead the war and the administration did not want to do it."

Senator Taft, in his foreign policy remarks said:

Cold Slows Spread of Ohio Flood

Portsmouth, O., Jan. 29.—The Ohio River flood crest—a winter-time snow that drove upwards of 10,000 cubic feet of water into the doozer of Gallipolis, O., today, but its Sunday punch was about gone.

Butter cold, the killer of floods, cut the crest to somewhat less damaging depths.

The river rose slowly—if at all—today. It was 25 feet above flood stage at Gallipolis and at Gallipolis 10 feet. The 7 a. m. reading was 53.2 feet at Gallipolis. Flood stage is 55 feet at 11 a. m. (E. A. J.).

The U. S. Weather bureau at Cincinnati indicated previous crest estimates probably would be reached by the middle of the next week.

The subcommittee, which has been digging into tax fraud scandals in the past year, has subpoenaed Grunewald's records, which he refused to furnish. He is now in jail on a \$100,000 bond.

Grunewald's name has repeatedly cropped up in recent tax fraud hearings involving high government officials and influence peddling.

The most sensational involvement, however, was the charge by Abraham Tilden, Chicago attorney, that Grunewald had been made to shake him down for \$500,000 in return for a tax audit of Tilden's "bad books" back in Washington.

Demands Contempt Count for Henry W. Grunewald

Washington, Jan. 30.—(AP)—Admiral Lynde D. McCormick, commander of the U. S. Atlantic Fleet, today was named Supreme Allied Naval Commander of the North Atlantic. As the first boss of a peacetime international fleet, the 56-year-old Navy veteran will direct the sea activities of all nations in the North Atlantic.

McCormick will be on sea when General Dwight D. Eisenhower is on land. The appointment of McCormick was announced simultaneously in Washington and London—by President Truman and NATO.

British Deputy McCormick's operations will extend far but will not include the coastal areas of the British Isles. As his first move after receiving the appointment, McCormick agreed to the Allied rotating armistice and said Chinese would not be sent to the demilitarized zone.
