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But Churchill also cautioned the House:

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These words 'prompt, resolute and effective' did not represent any new decisions arrived at during our visit. They express frankly and fully the spirit in which we shall face our difficulties together."

**Ask No Confidence Vote**  
Meanwhile, Labor members of Parliament demanded a vote of no confidence in the Conservative government today for proposing a curbing of Britain's costly social services as part of a drastic economy program.

The motion was filed in the House of Commons just before the start of a two-day debate on a plan proposed by R. A. Butler, Chancellor of the Exchequer, to put the country on its feet financially.

The motion was in the form of an amendment to one by Churchill asking House approval of the Butler plan.

If the Laborites should put their motion across, Churchill would have to resign and ask for a new national election. But the Conservative majority of 14 is expected to prevail when the vote comes tomorrow night.

The Labor motion, in the name of opposition leader Clement R. Attlee and three House members, denounced Butler's "statement containing attacks on the social services and other measures, many of which are irrelevant, unnecessary and unfair."

It expressed "no confidence in a government whose present policy is in sharp marked contrast to the optimistic statements which it was returned to power."

**Bevat In Attack**  
Pushing the attack on the Conservative government was Arthur Bevan, the fiery Socialist who quit the Labor regime last spring because of the cost of living charges for false teeth and spectacles.

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Butler's new medical charges violated a Conservative promise in last October's election campaign. Butler announced dental patients would have to pay up to one pound (\$2.00) for treatment, imposed a charge of one shilling (14 cents) for prescriptions, and decided to collect for such things as surgical belts, wigs and hearing aids.

The spending cut will affect all Britain's 50 million people. Newspapers said it will bring the sharp-cut in a century to already low living standards.

Mr. Hoover's Speech As we study the speech which former President Herbert Hoover delivered on Sunday, we find that it offers before us a new and important contribution to the discussion of the European situation.

It is quite true that we have had a hysteria spread out of Washington. It is quite true that Washington seems to have a peculiar disposition to consider war inevitable, and to aim at an unlimited amount of military expenditure.

Just when everything is going along rather miraculously toward an end of the purely nationalistic rivalries which have long been the curse of Europe, a new and more serious danger has appeared.

Mr. Hoover was also told that the Communists "have to start a war in the West because they can see no final military victory." But the Kremlin realizes that it has trouble enough trying to neutralize and subvert the nationalities.

Now some of these conditions are obviously important, and their conclusion—that a Russia which did not attack while the odds seemed most favorable should not be likely to attack now, when the odds grow every day less favorable—should be clear to all.
